General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. FAL-D / DISCOVER ST MICHAEL'S MOUNT

DIFFICULTY

Explore the history and beauty of a spectacular medieval castle during this memorable excursion to St. Michael's Mount.

Marazion and St. Michael's Mount

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive to the coastal village of Marazion. En route, travel alongside the banks of the River Fal, through the beautiful green countryside of Cornwall and past quaint villages, granite farmhouses and rolling downs. From Marazion, proceed to St. Michael's Mount, which may be accessible on-foot or by boat depending on the tide. The British National Trust property of St. Michael's Mount is a dramatic 12th-century castle and 14th-century priory perched on a tidal island. This dramatic, rocky island once boasted a Benedictine priory that was a daughter house to Mont St. Michel in Normandy. Portions of the Mount are also a private house, a home for over three centuries to the St. Aubyn family.

Free-flow Tour of St. Michael's Mount

Upon arrival, ascend the steep pathway to the castle entrance and take in dramatic views of Land's End and the Lizard Lighthouse. Enter the 12th-century castle through the West Door, and take in the Great Hall, St. John's Room and the Armoury. In the oldest areas of the castle are the Library and Chevy Chase Room, originally the monk's refectory. At the island's summit stands the Priory Church, still used for public worship. Following your free flow tour, some free time is made available to take photos of your picturesque surroundings or relax with a traditional Cornish cream tea in a local teashop. Afterward, walk back to the village of Marazion and enjoy some free time here before, re-boarding your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking, at times over rough, uneven, steep and slippery surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, and numerous steps inside the castle and to access the top of St. Michael's Mount. Walking at St. Michael's Mount is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Comfortable, layered clothing, a waterproof jacket or coat, sturdy, closed-toe hiking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Due to the local climate, most of the coaches are air-cooled. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

Explore the famous art movement that began a century ago, and continues to this day, during this scenic, half-day excursion to St. Ives.

St. Ives Walking Tour

Depart the pier in Falmouth for the scenic, approximate 90-minute drive to St. Ives, home of a famous art movement that began a century ago and continues to this day. Particularly celebrated in St. Ives is the work of a young group of painters, potters and sculptors such as Bernard Leach, Shoji Hamada, Alfred Wallis, Ben Nicholson, Christopher Walker and Barbara Hepworth. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of the village, learn about its history and local luminaries, and see renowned landmarks. Following your guided walking tour of St. Ives, your guide points out places of interest for independent exploration before you set off on your own.

St. Ives at Your Leisure

During the self-guided portion of your visit, explore St. Ives at your leisure. Sites worthy of consideration include the Tate Gallery, part of the Tate Gallery of London. This stunning building, which stands high above the magnificent surfing beach of Porthmeor, houses a varying exhibition of local and national works, including Barbara Hepworth's *Museum & Sculpture Garden*. Other galleries include The Leach Pottery, housing a small collection showcasing work by Leach, the world-famous ceramist who established St. Ives as a centre for ceramics. Porthminster Gallery, one of St. Ives fine art galleries, exhibits leading and emerging St. Ives painters, ceramicists and sculptors. Your vantage point from the museum affords stunning panoramic vistas over the picturesque bay and harbour.

Shopping and Dining

Alternatively, you may opt to stroll about the charming streets at your leisure, browse for local handicrafts, or simply enjoy a leisurely respite at a local café or ancient tavern. At the conclusion of your visit, meet up with your guided, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 75-

minute drive back to the pier. En route, travel over the dramatic landscape of the Cornish Moors, strewn with granite outcrops and mining villages.

Falmouth, Fal Estuary, Cornish Countryside, Truro, Cathedral

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive up the pretty Fal Estuary and through the rugged Cornish countryside en route to the Georgian city of Truro, Cornwall's county administration centre. Upon arrival, see Truro's impressive Cathedral and enjoy panoramic views of your surrounds before continuing on towards Redruth and Camborne.

Redruth, Camborne, Countryside Drive, Poldark, Carn Brea

From Redruth and Camborne, traverse a countryside filled with charming lanes, granite cottages and Methodist chapels, then take a step back in time to the age of Poldark and tin-mining. Looming high above Redruth and Camborne is the spectacular granite tor of Carn Brea, crowned by its stark memorial to mine owner Francis Bassett.

South Coast of Cornwall, Marazion, Local Hotel, Cream Tea, Penzance, St. Michael's Mount

Your last stop along the south coast of Cornwall is at Marazion, where a photo stop offers spectacular panoramic views of St Michael's Mount. Your visit to Marazion includes a stop for a cup of traditional Cream Tea at a local hotel, which offers splendid views of Penzance and across to St Michael's Mount. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair, provided they have a collapsible wheelchair, are able to get on/off the coach on their own, and accompanied by an able-bodied companion to assist them. Comfortable, layered clothing, a waterproof jacket or coat, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Due to the local climate, most of the coaches are air-cooled. Indulge your senses with the sub-tropical paradise of the Trebah Gardens and a traditional Cornish Cream Tea during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Trebah Gardens, Rare and Exotic Plants, Trees and Shrubs, Private Beach, Helford River

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to Trebah Gardens. This spectacular, approximately 26-acre (about 10.5 hectare) Cornish ravine garden is rated among the 80 finest gardens in the world, and listed as one of Cornwall's five great gardens. This sub-tropical paradise is home to a unique collection of rare and exotic plants, trees and shrubs winding down to a private, secluded beach on the Helford River.

Gardens Tour, Water Gardens, Waterfalls, Koi Carp, Rock Pools, Rare Trees and Shrubs

Upon arrival, take an exclusive guided tour of the gardens. Along the way, marvel at the water gardens with waterfalls and koi carp, glades of 100-year-old ferns and 18-foot-high (about 5.5-metre-high) giant gunnery (rhubarb). The gardens at Trebah have a long history dating back over 150 years, and are adorned with waterfalls, rock pools, rare trees and shrubs that provide an undulating carpet of colour.

Cornish Cream Tea, Cornish Coast, Pendennis Castle, Falmouth, St. Mawes, Fal Estuary

Following your tour of the gardens, proceed for a delicious traditional Cornish cream tea. Afterward, some free time is made available to explore the gardens at your leisure, or perhaps browse for souvenirs at the garden's gift shop. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for a panoramic drive along the stunning Cornish coast, then head to Pendennis Castle for magnificent views of Falmouth, St. Mawes and the Fal Estuary. After your photo stop here, re-board you coach for the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 0.93 miles (about 1.5 kilometres), at times over steep slopes, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair, provided they have a collapsible wheelchair, are able to get on/off the coach on their own, and are accompanied by an able-bodied companion to assist them.

COB-A / BLARNEY CASTLE AND IRISH COFFEE

Begin your tour with a drive around Cork, Ireland's second largest city, affectionately known as the 'City of Steeples and Bridges. The main streets are flanked with spacious sidewalks and illuminated by unique lighting that evokes Cork's former glory as one of Europe's main sea-ports.

Blarney Castle

After this charming drive through the lush countryside, depart city and continue to the Blarney Castle. This massive, 15th-century castle is famous for its legendary Blarney Stone, embedded in the castle wall. The stone's power is said to bestow the gift of eloquence on anyone who kisses it. To do so, you must climb the 109 steps to the battlements, lie on your back, with someone holding you, and bend down to kiss the overhanging stone. The less agile may simply enjoy the magnificent views from the castle grounds. These were laid out in the 18th-century and contain a grove of trees and pretty dells with a circle of large stones known as Rock Close.

Blarney Woollen Mills

After enjoying the stunning view and the rich history of this castle, partake in some Irish coffee and some shopping time in the Blarney Woollen Mills, offering a large selection of Irish goods.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking with 1.5 miles (2.5 kilometres) however it is all at the guests' discretion. This tour is not suggested for guests with limited mobility or those guests who utilize a wheelchair as there are 120 steps to reach the Blarney Stone however guests in wheelchairs and/or with limited mobility can enjoy the grounds of the Castle. The line to kiss the Blarney Stone can be long, we appreciate your patience. There may not be sufficient time to reach the Stone. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, a light sweater or jacket, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests must be at least 21 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. The tour sequence may vary.

COB-D / CORK CITY & WHISKEY TOUR

Pass the French Gothic styled St. Fin Barre's Cathedral whose imposing steeple is a landmark in the city. From Cork take a short 30 minute drive to the Old Midleton Distillery.

Old Midleton Distillery

Enjoy a guided tour of this unique industrial complex. The sense of heritage is everywhere at the Jameson Experience. Some of the original buildings date back to 1795, built as a mill before being converted for use as a distillery. The water wheel, which once operated all the machinery at the distillery, still turns and operates the cogs and wheels in the Mill Building, where visitors can also admire one of the original steam engines installed in the latter half of the 19th century. The Still House is always a tour highlight, the three original pot stills still gleaming like burnished gold. One of these pot stills, installed in 1949, can hold 31,000 gallons (141,000 litres), making it the largest pot still in the world. Sample a glass of whisky before enjoying some free time to walk around and take photos of the distillery's exterior.

Afterwards re-board your coach and depart for Cork and your ship.

Tipperary

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 1.5-hour drive to the town of Cashel. En route before entering picturesque Tipperary. 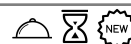
