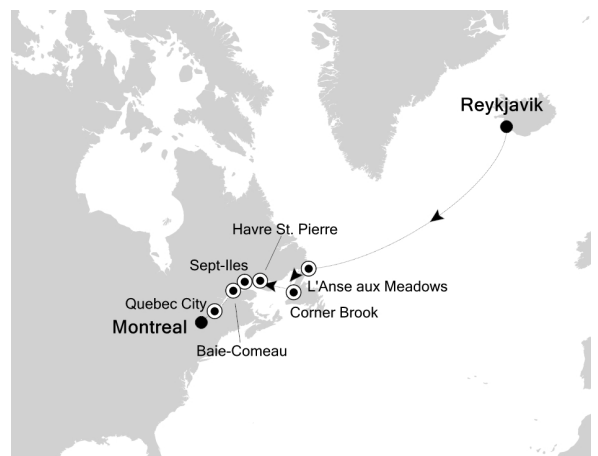

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore-side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours.

When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

SMOKING

For reasons of safety and comfort, smoking is not permitted on any tour vehicles used by Silversea. Your understanding in this matter is appreciated.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

At some museums, sites and monuments, photography and/or the use of video cameras may not be allowed or may incur a charge. These charges are not included in the tour price and are at guests' own expense.

REK-Q / FLY ME TO THE MOON

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$399; Duration:1.50 hrs



Experience the spectacular natural splendour of the lunar-like Reykjanes Peninsula during this picturesque flight-seeing excursion.

Reykjavik, Reykjanes Peninsula

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to the Reykjavik Domestic Airport. Upon arrival, receive your safety and flight instructions, then board your awaiting airplane and begin your panoramic flight-seeing tour. Fly over the colourful city of Reykjavik before heading towards the mossy lava field of the Reykjanes Peninsula, a lunar-like area that has been affected by volcanic eruptions and lava flows for millions of years.

Lake Kleifarvatn, Krýsuvík and Gunnhver Geothermal Fields, Mt. Keilir

Next, fly over the mysterious Lake Kleifarvatn, which has been linked to many Soviet spy stories, and the unique and colourful geothermal fields of Krýsuvík and Gunnhver. In addition, pass over the beautiful, cone-shaped Mt. Keilir. Here, you can see the ridge where the American and Euro-Asian tectonic plates drift apart. At the conclusion of your flight-seeing tour, return to the airport, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and board-de-board the airplane. This tour is not suitable for guests with a fear of heights, guests prone to airsickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable clothing in layers with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a weatherproof jacket from the ship. REK-A / RELAX IN THE BLUE LAGOON

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$159; Duration:4.00 hrs



Spend a half day experiencing one of Iceland's most famed sites during this relaxing immersion in to the Blue Lagoon.

Depart the ship and drive alongside the city lake with a view of the City Hall. Travel past Perlan 'The Pearl,' a glass dome on the top of the hot-water tanks in Reykjavik. Continue through Reykjavik's suburbs, towards Hafnarfjordur.

The Blue Lagoon

Drive through the rugged lava fields of the Reykjanes peninsula towards the Blue Lagoon and stop for approximately two and a half hours to indulge in these waters. The Blue Lagoon owes its existence to the nearby geothermal power plant. The facilities on site offer changing-room facilities as well as a tax-free shop and a café. The water of the Lagoon is a steamy 98-102°F (36-39°C), mineral-rich and reputed for its healing properties. The blue colour of the water, the steam and the thirteen foot (four metre) high lava wall surrounding the Lagoon succeed in creating a unique atmosphere. This natural and very popular health spa is now a major attraction in the region and considered to be one of the most visited places on the island.

Return to Reykjavik, over the barren Reykjanes peninsula dominated by old lava-flows. From the Blue Lagoon, head back to Hafnarfjordur via a different route. While driving the Reykjanesbraut, see the Heidmork outdoor recreation area and the residential areas of Reykjavik. Continue along the coastline returning to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves little walking along a paved pathway and is suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilize a wheelchair. Guests must be able to embark and disembark the coach, and to get in to and out of the Blue Lagoon. Pregnant women are advised to check with their doctor/health care worker before taking this tour. Even though the Blue Lagoon is not particularly deep guests do need to be able to swim in order to participate on this tour. Children must be at least 2 years of age to participate and children under the age of 12 must wear an inflatable vest provided by the lagoon and should not be left unaccompanied at any time in the Lagoon. We recommend that guests drink plenty of water before and during the bathe. For hygienic purposes, it is expected (in line with local customs) to take a

shower without swimwear before entering the Blue Lagoon. Separate dressing rooms and showers are provided for men and women. Guests are advised to bring a swimsuit and a towel from the ship. Minimum participation is required to operate.

REK-I / PANORAMIC REYKJAVIK

DIFFICULTY



 Price: \$89; Duration: 3.50 hrs


Reykjavik, with about 120,000 inhabitants, is certainly among the smallest capital cities in the world. This sightseeing tour takes you on a journey to some of Reykjavik's most noteworthy sites.

The journey begins with a drive through Laugardalur Valley, the city's main sports and recreational area. We pass the Olympic sized, open-air swimming pool that is filled with geothermal water. The pool is one of the most popular swimming pools in the city and is filled with locals socialising year-round.

Árbær open-air museum

The tour continues to Árbær open-air museum where we'll enjoy a pleasant walk among the historical buildings located there. The museum was founded due to growing concern that "old Reykjavik" was disappearing forever. The city council created a public park and regional museum to preserve historical buildings from around the country.

Perlan

From the Árbær museum we'll continue to one of the city's landmark buildings, Perlan ("The Pearl"). The building itself is architecturally interesting - its dome consists of reflecting glass panels on a hollow steel frame. Perlan has a viewing platform on top of the hot-water tanks which extends full circle, offering splendid views over the city.

National Museum

From Perlan we'll head to The National Museum. The museum is dedicated to communicating knowledge of Iceland's cultural heritage from the time of its pioneering settlement to the present day. From The National Museum, the tour ends with a drive through the old quarter of Reykjavik with its charming colourful houses.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking is suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair; however, guests must be able to embark and disembark the coach via the bus steps. The order of sites seen or visited may vary. Operation of this tour is subject to minimum participation.

REK-J / 4X4 SUPER-TRUCK ADVENTURE

DIFFICULTY



 Price: \$289; Duration: 4.00 hrs

Get ready for an action-packed Super truck adventure during this amazing journey through some of Iceland's most stunning terrain. Nowhere but in Iceland will one find vehicles like the ones we use on this tour. Crafted for uniquely tough conditions and rugged terrain even a term for them had to be invented; "Super Trucks". The vehicles are the result of decades of technical innovation and development.

Hengill Volcano, Lake Thingvallavatn and Nesjavellir Power Plant

Shortly after heading out of Reykjavik we'll drive up the mountain Úlfarsfell, where we'll have a spectacular view over Reykjavik and the bay. From there we'll continue to the Mountain Hengill area. Hengill is an active volcano, evidenced by its numerous hot springs and fumaroles, but the last eruption occurred approximately 2000 years ago. The volcano is an important source of energy for the south of the country, which is captured at the Nesjavellir power station. Near Nesjavellir we'll stop at a vantage point with a panoramic view over the large Lake Þingvallavatn and the beautiful region called Bláskógar ("Blue forests").

Hveragerði Village and Thousand Waters Trail

Continuing on we'll drive a gravel road along the lake and from there through lush woodlands to Hveragerði Village. There we will make a short comfort stop before continuing on our adventure.

After re-boarding the Super Trucks we head off the beaten track, by way of a trail known as "The Thousand Waters". Our convoy winds its way through numerous rivers, mud banks and streams. Enjoy the ride and savour the unique opportunity of experiencing Iceland's untamed nature. After all this excitement the trucks continue on an effortless drive back to Reykjavik harbour.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of off-road driving and a minimal amount of walking for approximately 200 yards (about 200 metres), at times over uneven, natural and icy surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the off-road vehicle. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with back and/or neck problems, guests with heart or respiratory problems, guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable clothing in layers and a waterproof/windproof coat with flat, closed-toe, non-slip walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a warm hat and gloves from the ship. Guests must be at least eight years old to participate on this tour; guests under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

REK-S / ICE & FIRE: GLACIERS AND VOLCANOES

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$699; Duration: 2.50 hrs



Experience the breath-taking natural beauty of Iceland from a unique perspective during this panoramic flight-seeing excursion.

Reykjavik, Tindfjallajökull Volcano, Eyjafjallajökull Glacier, Hekla Volcano

Depart the pier for the short drive to the airport. Upon arrival, receive your safety and flight instructions, then board your awaiting airplane and begin your unforgettable flight-seeing tour. Your route begins with a flight over the magnificent Tindfjallajökull Volcano. Its highest peak is named after the Norse mythological giant, Ymir, whose body was used by the gods to create earth. From here, continue over the Eyjafjallajökull Glacier, the unpronounceable volcano that brought the world to a stop with its eruption in 2010. Between the ice and snow fields see Hekla, the most famous of Iceland's volcanoes, which last erupted in 2000 and is closely monitored by geologists for the next eruption.

Golden Circle, Þingvellir Rift Valley, Gullfoss Waterfall, Geysir Geothermal Area

Next, fly over the Golden Circle, which covers approximately 186 miles (about 300 kilometres) looping from Reykjavik into the southern uplands of Iceland and back. Along the way, your flight passes over the rift valley, Þingvellir, where the Icelandic parliament convened for centuries. Seeing the valley from the air offers an informative glimpse into tectonic plate movements, and bears witness to what happens to landscapes that rest on divergent plate boundaries. Afterward, fly over Gullfoss, the 'Golden Waterfall'. If you're lucky, you may see a geyser spouting whilst passing over the Geysir geothermal area.

Þórsmörk Valley, Landmannalaugar Highland Oasis, Jökulgilsá River

Your flight continues over Þórsmörk, a valley sheltered by three glaciers and sculpted by natural forces. Due to numerous foreboding glacial rivers, this magnificent valley is only accessible by Jeeps and specialised vehicles. From here, fly over the highland oasis of Landmannalaugar, one of the pearls of Icelandic nature and renowned for its multiplicity of colours. Red, brown and yellow are seen at the sides of the volcano next to it, where an obsidian lava field reaches from the sulphur hot springs down to a small, naturally warm river by a grassy oasis. The milk-coloured Jökulgilsá River flows peacefully towards the ocean. At the conclusion of your flight-seeing tour, return to the airport, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Learn the story of Dr. Wilfred Grenfell, doctor and pioneer, and explore the scenic fishing communities of northern Newfoundland. The story of Dr. Wilfred Grenfell is one of the most compelling stories of the north. He was renowned for bringing medicine and education to the Inuit and poor European settlers along the harsh Labrador Coast. His adventures were required reading in Eastern Canada, and taught school children how to survive while adrift on an ice pan.

Depart the pier for the approximate 45-minute drive to the Grenfell Interpretation Centre in St. Anthony. Look for moose and icebergs as you travel along the scenic coastal highway through small fishing communities.

Grenfell Interpretation Centre

The centre interprets the life and times of Dr. Grenfell through a gallery of interpretive paneling and displays. They tell the story of the truly inspirational Dr. Grenfell, the young English doctor who in 1892 visited Newfoundland and founded the Grenfell Mission. Among the displays you will see the old instruments used for surgery a century ago and artefacts gathered from a life of arctic adventure and global philanthropy.

Grenfell House Museum

Visit the home of Dr. Grenfell, his wife Anne and their three children and gain insight into the day-to-day life of an early 20th-century, small town Doctor and pioneer. The Woodland trail behind the house is for active passengers only.

Re-board the coach for the shore 15-minute drive to Fishing Point Lookout with a hiking trail and a small wildlife exhibit.

Your tour concludes back at the pier.

This tour combines the experience of a scenic trip into Corner Brook's surroundings with a brief city orientation. Travelling along the Humber Valley to the Bay of Islands, witness a part of the vast wilderness that characterizes Newfoundland's west coast. Bay of Islands

Corner Brook and Captain Cook Monument

During a break from touring, a wholesome lunch will be served at one of the area's rustic restaurants.

Lobster Cove Head

This unique and avant-garde landmark, which draws its inspiration from the longhouse and Innu lifestyle, also highlights the sense of belonging to the Mingan Islands, a small paradise located nearby.

Shaputan Tent, Traditional Innu Food Tasting, Meet Innu People, Innu Church

Next, continue on to the Shaputan Tent for a tasting of traditional Innu food, including Innu bread and wild berries. In addition, meet some of the locals, hear stories about their heritage and current realities. Afterward, a short walk brings you to the Innu Church. During your self-guided visit, admire the space decorated entirely with Innu art, thus providing a magical glimpse into the mysteries of the Innu culture and people. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 35-minute drive back to the pier.

Marvel at the myriad seabirds (murre, eiders, ducks, razorbills, Atlantic puffins, auks, black guillemots, long-tailed ducks and more) that occupy the Île du Corossol bird sanctuary. This sanctuary is one of the most important protected marine bird sanctuaries in Eastern Canada because of the diversity of species present.

Corossol Island also has one of the many lighthouses built in the area to help navigate the mighty St. Lawrence, one of the last vestiges of the golden era of maritime trade.

Enjoy a close-up look at marine mammals whose fleeting yet extraordinary appearances linger fondly in the memory.

Petite Basque and Grande Basque Islands were named in honor of the Basque people, who for more than one hundred years came to the region to fish, hunt whales and trade furs.

Return to the marina and walk back to the pier.

Before the Europeans' arrival on the continent, the Innu were nomadic people living in tents made of animal skins. They followed species such as the caribou in order to survive, and rivers were their main pathways.

The Innu way of life has always been a seasonal cycle of activities based on harvesting resources as they become available: wild berries in the fall, caribou in the winter, salmon and geese in the spring. Caribou were used in many different ways. Their meat, skin, bones, antlers and teeth were used for food, clothes, shelter, tools, weapons, ornaments and toys. Summer was a time for gathering and heading to the banks of the St. Lawrence to trade fur with Europeans and buy food.

This tour is the perfect opportunity to learn about their way to immerse yourself in the many aspects of history, beliefs and traditions as well as their traditional and contemporary culture and lives.

Visit their traditional Shaputuan (housing), hear stories, learn about their spiritual rituals, their natural medicine, the hunting and trapping and different crafts work made from animal skin or bark. Also, sample some freshly cooked salmon and wild goose prepared in a traditional manner. End your tour with traditional Innu music and chants.

The know-how of the Innu community goes back a thousand years, and they are proud to share their knowledge with you.

After enjoying the culture of the Innu board the school bus for the short journey back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking approximately 425 yards (388 metres) on uneven and slightly inclined. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Old Trading Post

Depart the pier by school bus and drive to Old Trading Post via the Innu community. Ever dreamed of traveling back in time? Relive the past by visiting a unique site: the Vieux-Poste (Old Trading Post). Immerse yourself in 1842, at the time of the Hudson's Bay Company, in the replica of

the old trading post occupied successively by the French and English from 1673 to 1842. This fur trading post was the first European establishment in Sept-Îles. It was initially used for trading fur with Innu hunters. Later, during its heyday, fur was exported to European markets as well as salmon from the Moisie River and oil from seals hunted in the Sept-Îles archipelago. In this place of meeting and trade, you will discover the daily life of the postmaster, woodsmen and Innu hunters.

Regional Museum

Next visit the Regional Museum. The rich and fabulous history of the North Shore of the St. Lawrence River is told at the Musée régional de la Côte-Nord. The museum's permanent exhibition, Land of Discovery: The Great Journey, invites you to explore 8,000 years of history. Whether your interests tend toward nature, industry or culture, the exhibition will help you discover the true character of the region, providing a glimpse into the courage, tenacity and pride of the local inhabitants.

Enjoy brief photo stops at the magnificent sandy beaches-one reason the city of Sept-Îles is renowned for its beauty. Only minutes from downtown, with the sea on one side and the forest on the other, Sept-Îles's enchanting beaches stretch endlessly along the shore.

Return to the pier where the ship is awaiting.

He built a sumptuous manor that later burned to the ground in 1965. The manor was re-built in 1965 using stone instead of wood. It was completely renovated in 2004 and is now a hotel with all the charm of an old French colonial manoir, with most of the rooms, dining room, terrace and gardens open on to spectacular views of the St. Lawrence River. Enjoy cake and tea during your stop at the Manoir.

Return to Place La Salle on foot where you have the option of either remaining in town and taking the shuttle back to the ship, or returning immediately to the ship.

Québec City, Lower Town, Place-Royale, Notre-Dame-des-Victoires, Petit-Champlain Street

Depart the pier for your guided and narrated stroll through the Lower Town. Your first stop is Place-Royale, an historic square with stone buildings that were once the homes of wealthy merchants. Built and rebuilt several times, the square remains the heart of the Lower Town and home of North America's oldest standing Catholic Church, the Notre-Dame-des-Victoires. Located just around the corner from Place-Royale is the charming, pedestrian-only area of Petit-Champlain. As you walk along its narrow cobblestone streets, pass by an array of quaint boutiques, specialty shops and outdoor cafés, as well as strolling musicians, jugglers and street performers.

Funicular-Ride, Upper Town, Old Town, Place d'Armes, Dufferin Terrace, Old English Walls

Upon arrival, take a short, guided walk through the Old Town, the only walled city in North America and an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Along the way, pass by Place d'Armes, Dufferin Terrace, Place de l'Hôtel de Ville, Ursuline Convent, Québec Seminary, Artists' Alley, the Old English Walls and Dufferin Terrace, located approximately 200 feet (about 61 metres) above the waterway. It was at the Dufferin Terrace that Samuel de Champlain built his fort in 1620. From here, take in spectacular views over the Saint Lawrence River, town of Lévis on the opposite shore, Île d'Orléans and the Laurentian Mountains.

Château Frontenac, Refreshments

Whilst in the Upper Town, a stop is made at the Château Frontenac. Perched on a hill overlooking the St. Lawrence River, the castle-like Château Frontenac is the best-known landmark in Québec. It was here that Franklin D. Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and William Mackenzie King met to discuss the Allied strategy during World War II. During your visit, relax with tea or coffee and a pastry. Following your visit, you may opt to return to the pier on-foot, or remain in town for further shopping and exploration, and return to the ship on your own.
