General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore-side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours.

When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

PWM-F / BEYOND THE OLD PORT WALKING TOUR

Explore the history and landmarks of Portland on-foot during this scenic sightseeing excursion beyond the Old Port.

Portland City Walking Tour, Mansions, Old Port, Commercial Street, City Hall, First Parish Church

Depart the pier for your scenic and guided, approximately two-hour walking tour through Portland City. Along the way, learn about the history of the city and its vibrant food and beer scene, and stop for photos whilst passing by a host of renowned landmarks and picturesque viewpoints. Highlights of your guided stroll include the Wadsworth-Longfellow Mansion, Victoria Mansion, Old Port, Commercial Street, City Hall and First Parish Church.

Eastern Promenade, Portland Observatory, Waterfront, Arts District, Theatres, Galleries, Museums

Next, continue on to the Portland Observatory, which offers lovely panoramic views of your surrounds. From here, walk along Portland's waterfront area, the Eastern Promenade, with its spectacular views of Casco Bay and the Calendar Islands. Here, thriving harbour activities exist side-by-side with retail venues established in shops and restaurants. Your last stop is the Arts District. Upon arrival, take a stroll past theatres, art schools, galleries and museums that include the Portland Museum of Art, designed by I.M. Pei. At the conclusion of your tour, commence the short walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately two miles-four miles (about 3.2 kilometres-6.4 kilometres) at times over hills, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 30 steps at the Eastern Promenade. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a sweater or light jacket from the ship. The tour sequence may vary. Space on this tour is extremely limited; we suggest you book well in advance to avoid disappointment.

Portland, Horse-Drawn Wagon-Ride, Photo Stops

Depart the pier aboard a 19th-century, horse-drawn wagon for a scenic, approximately two-hour sightseeing ride through the city of Portland. Your guide points out historic sites as your matched team of horses trots through the narrow streets and past some of the city's most renowned landmarks, with photo stops along the way.

Portland Observatory, Monument Square, Portland Museum of Art, Civic Centre, Victorian Homes

Your route passes by the Portland Observatory, which offers lovely panoramic views of your surrounds and Monument Square. In addition, see the Civic Centre, Wadsworth-Longfellow Mansion and beautiful Victorian homes.

Eastern Promenade, Casco Bay, Calendar Islands, Art District, Theatres, Portland Museum of Art

Next, ride along Portland's waterfront area, the Eastern Promenade, with its spectacular views of Casco Bay and the Calendar Islands. Here, thriving harbour activities exist side-by-side with retail venues established in shops and restaurants. Your last stop is the Arts District. Upon arrival, take a stroll past theatres, art schools, galleries and museums that include the Portland Museum of Art, designed by I.M. Pei. At the conclusion of your tour, commence the short ride back to the pier.

Embrace the seaside beauty and charm of Maine's famous rocky coastline and coastal village of Kennebunkport during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour orientation drive to the historic and charismatic coastal village of Kennebunkport via Portland City. Kennebunkport gained worldwide exposure as the summer home of President George H.W. Bush. Upon arrival in Kennebunkport, drive past stunning, Federal- and Victorian-style mansions that were built by wealthy sea captains and merchants in the 1700s and 1800s.

Dock Square, Free Time, Shops, Boutiques, Antique Stores, Restaurants, Pubs

Following your sightseeing drive through Kennebunkport, a stop is made in the town centre at Dock Square for approximately 1.5 hours of free time at your leisure. You can stroll the quaint streets lined with shops, galleries, unique boutiques, antique stores, restaurants, and pubs; purchases are at the expense of each guest.

Walker's Point, Bush Estate, Summer White House

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board the coach and head for a photo stop at Walker's Point. Afterward, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier. En route, pass by the Bush Estate and former Summer White House, where world leaders often gathered.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, at times over uneven and gravel surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. Walking in Kennebunkport is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a sweater or light jacket from the ship. The tour sequence may vary.

Portland, Old Port Foodie Walk, Coffee Houses, Bakeries, Award-Winning Restaurants

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 1.5-hour foodie walk through the streets of the charming Old Port. A hundred years ago, this area was home to fish houses, canneries, industrial factories and textile mills, and the air was heavy with industrial smoke. Today, the air is fragrant with the fresh ocean breeze and aromas emanating from coffee houses, bakeries and award-winning restaurants, all tempting passers-by as they wind their way through the scenic, narrow streets of the Old Port.

Old Port, Tastings of Local Specialities at Five Food Venues

During the foodie walk, your friendly, engaging guide takes you to several Old Port venues for tastings of Maine-inspired, locally-made foods, and a behind-the-scenes look at those who craft these epicurean delights. As you sample the fare at the various stops, your guide and proprietor reveal the history behind their industry, the uniquely Maine products that are used, and a hint or two as to why they are simply award-winning year-after-year.

Local Landmarks and History

Along the way, see local landmarks and learn about the unique and colourful local history of this port city, which *Bon Appétit* magazine crowned 'America's Foodiest Small Town for 2009'. At the conclusion of your foodie walk, tastings and sightseeing, commence the short walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1.5 hours, at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, sidewalks and curbs. This tour is not suitable for guests with food allergies, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a sweater or light jacket from the ship. The tour sequence may vary.

PWM-J / LIGHTHOUSES OF MAINE

Discover a trio of prominent lighthouses along the beautiful, rocky coast of Portland during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Portland, Bug Light, Liberty Ship Memorial Sculpture

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive through historic Portland en route to the Bug Light, a lighthouse built of brick-lined cast iron. Nicknamed for its small size, this elegant Portland Breakwater Light was first lit in 1875. Upon arrival, view the impressive lighthouse and sculptural tribute, *Liberty Ship Memorial*, dedicated to 266 ships built here during World War II.

Spring Point Ledge Lighthouse, Fort Williams Park, Portland Head Light, Museum, Free Time

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to the Spring Point Ledge Lighthouse. Upon arrival, view this typical, sparkplug-style lighthouse, which was constructed of brick on a cylindrical cast-iron caisson and dates from 1891. After a photo stop here, head to Fort Williams Park for a visit to Maine's oldest lighthouse, the Portland Head Light. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to explore Fort Williams. Take in spectacular coastal and ocean vistas, and view interesting navigational aids at the Museum, located in the former lighthouse keeper's quarters. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 35-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 325 yards (about 297 metres), at times over uneven and gravel surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. Walking at the Portland Head Light is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a sweater or light jacket from the ship. The tour sequence may vary.

BRB-A / ACADIA NATIONAL PARK WITH A RANGER

DIFFICULTY

Embrace the pristine natural beauty of Acadia National Park during this memorable, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park

Depart the pier for the brief drive to the 35,000-acre (14,164-hectare) Acadia National Park, one of the most visited parks in the United States. En route, pass through the quaint town of Bar Harbor to view some of the charming Victorian mansions built by America's rich and famous at the turn of the 20th century. Upon arrival at Acadia National Park, a stop is made at the Hulls Cover Visitors' Centre.

Scenic Tour and Thunder Hole

Next, drive along the 27-mile (43-kilometre) Park Loop Road, where wonderful coastal, mountain and forest scenery abounds. Proceed along the ocean's edge and pass by Sand Beach, Schooner Head Overlook and the High Seas Estate. At Thunder Hole, a brief photo stop is made to see the ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar. You may watch this phenomenon from the top of the road, or take the stairs down to the water's edge.

Cadillac Mountain

Your drive continues past Otter Cliffs and the Gulf of Maine, which offers spectacular vistas of offshore islands. From here, pass by pine wood forests and the Jordan Pond House for splendid views of the Penobscot Mountains and Bubbles Hill, home to old stone-cut bridges, carriage trails and over 50 animal species.

Your tour concludes with a panoramic photo stop on Cadillac Mountain (weather permitting) before commencing the brief drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking over surfaces that are paved, uneven and slippery when wet, with approximately 20 steps to negotiate to view the cave at Thunder Hole and some areas that are not wheelchair-accessible. Experience the Maine Lobster industry from trap to plate on this half-day outing aboard a lobster vessel, followed by a 'Downeast lobster bake'. Meet your guide on the pier and enjoy a walking tour of Bar Harbor. Explore the colorful and illustrious history of Bar Harbor, Maine before arriving to your awaiting lobster boat. Once aboard, the captain offers insight into the lobster fishing history and industry as you ply Frenchman's Bay en route to his traps. See first-hand how lobster traps are hauled, set and baited. During the voyage learn how these succulent creatures get from the bottom of the ocean to the dinner plate.

Listen as the crew discuss these crustaceans' habits, the conservation efforts of the lobster industry, and understand the difference between hard shells, shedders, shorts, culls, and keepers. Along the way, you may have a chance to see the antics of the seal colonies as you quietly cruise past the rock ledges where they rest and catch a glimpse of the picturesque Egg Rock Lighthouse, while the Captain points out the sites and shares local history and folklore.

Somes Sound, Seawall, Bass Harbour Headlight, Northeast Harbour, Free Time, Thunder Hole

Halifax City Tour

Pass by the Metro Centre, Halifax's convention centre, before seeing the Historic Properties Complex. Here, old seaport buildings have been skilfully converted into attractive shops and restaurants.

The Fortress of Louisbourg offers an opportunity to imagine life in the toughest of conditions almost 300 years ago with beautiful visuals in static displays, surrounded by the beauty of the architecture of the buildings.

In addition to the invention of the telephone, Bell also made remarkable contributions in the fields of medicine, genetics, electricity, sound and speech, aeronautics, and marine engineering. Displays to be seen during your visit include original artefacts, photographs, and exhibits highlighting his extensive research and inventions.

Baddeck

Afterward, re-board your coach for the brief drive to the centre of Baddeck. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to discover the heart of this quaint village. Located on an inlet of the Bras d'Or Lakes, Baddeck is the region's most highly developed tourist centre and is world-renowned as a fine resort community. Cape Breton Island and Miners Museum

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive up the east side of Cape Breton Island to the Cape Breton Miners Museum. En route, pass through small mining towns and coastal routes featuring rugged shorelines and rolling hills abounding with lush, verdant foliage. Upon arrival at the Cape Breton Miners Museum, take a guided tour of the museum. Glace Bay Heritage Museum

City Tour

The tour begins in the city center as you pass the Ursuline Monastery. The Ursulines were the first community to become established at Trois Rivières in 1697. Continuing past Saint-James Church, Monument to the Frères des Écoles Chrésiennes and the Sacré Cœur Monument, and the Assomption de Marie Cathedral. The Gothic-styled cathedral opened for worship in 1858 and features stained glass windows created by master glass artist Guido Nincheri as well as one of the largest organs in Quebec with 5,751 pipes. Additional highlights include the Précieux-Sang and Carmélites Monasteries, Séminaire Saint-Joseph, Crypt of Father Frédéric, Convent of the Sœurs de la Charité of Ottawa, and the Manoir des Jésuits.

Notre-dame-du-cap Sanctuary

Next arrive into Cap-de-la-Madeleine on the shores of the St Lawrence River for a visit of Notre-dame-du-cap Sanctuary. With its modern basilica, old sanctuary, impressive stained-glass windows and magnificent gardens, the shrine to the Virgin Mary is both a spiritual and cultural attraction. Opened in 1720, it is the oldest church in the country to have been completely preserved. Pilgrimages to the shrine began in the early 19th century. In 1984, even Pope Jean-Paul II arrived for a visit of the shrine.

Board the coach for the short ride back to the ship.

This tower framework consists of a humongous pylon that was recovered when a provisional high-voltage transmission line spanning the majestic St. Lawrence River between Grondines and Lotbinière was dismantled.

The Exhibition Hall

Returning to ground level you will pass through the exhibition hall, The Ages of Energy. For millennia, mankind's only sources of energy were fire, wind, water and physical strength. The invention of the steam engine changed things once and for all. More recently, oil and electricity have created a world more dependent on energy than ever. What will tomorrow's energy source be? This dynamic exhibition takes a fresh look at the energy issues that already dominate global headlines!

The Northern Aluminum Station

Following this free time, a short bus transfer will take you to visit the Northern Aluminum Station. Take a stroll through an old penstock, once filled with rushing water and marvel at the industrial technologies that gave birth to modern industrial Québec. During your guided visit of this defunct powerhouse fully refurbished and restored into a spacious exhibition hall, you will be sure to witness the era of bygone power stations!

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking. It is suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Dressing according to the weather; sturdy shoes no sandals, a windbreaker and appropriate clothing are recommended. Please note that visitors aged 18 and over must present identification (driver's license or passport) to enter the Northern Aluminum Company Station.

TRR-D / HERITAGE WALKING TOUR & VISIT TO LA VIEILLE PRISON OF TROIS-RIVIÈRES

Experience the beauty, history and storied past of Trois-Rivières during this scenic, half-day walking tour of the city's Historical District.

Historical District Walking Tour

Depart the pier for a guided, approximately 90-minute walking tour through the Historical District of Trois-Rivières. Along the way, explore the city's rich and evocative history, culture and 18th-century architecture. Highlights of your walking tour include the Manoir de Tonnancour. Built in 1723 and once a military officer's barracks, the Manoir is now occupied by the Galerie d'art du Parc, a contemporary art exhibition centre.

Place d'Armes and Gothic Cathedral

Next, pass through Place d'Armes, where much of the early fur trading took place, and historic monuments and buildings before arriving at the Gothic Cathedral. Opened in 1858, the Cathedral is adorned with beautiful stained glass windows representing the Litanies of the Virgin.

Old Prison of Trois-Rivières

Your last stop is at the Old Prison of Trois-Rivières. Built in 1822, the prison was designated a historic monument in 1978. Before closing in 1986, Trois-Rivières' Old Prison was the oldest functional corrections establishment in Canada. During your tour, learn about the storied history of the prison, and pass by the original dank, cramped cells and terrifying confinement areas endured by the convicts. Following your visit, you may opt to commence the short walk back to the pier, or visit the Musée Québécois de Culture Populaire on your own before returning to the ship on-foot.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for 1.5 miles (2.4 kilometres), at times on uneven surfaces. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a light jacket or sweater from the ship. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

TRR-E / BIRTH OF THE INDUSTRIAL AGE IN CANADA

Discover how the Industrial Age evolved in Canada during this scenic and informative, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Boréal Centre, Multimedia Presentations and Exhibits, Underground Vaults

Depart the pier for the short drive to the former water filtration plant of the old C.I.P. paper mill, now known as the Boréal Centre. An investment of more than seven million dollars has transformed the plant into a venue of exceptional architectural value, and preserved many of the original internal mechanisms. Through multimedia presentations and exhibits, learn how the paper machine works, and how the water-pumping and filtration systems have shaped the industry. Afterward, visit the underground vaults, see the former water tower with fantastic views of the Saint-Maurice River, and enjoy the huge multimedia fresco to learn all about the forest. Your senses come alive as you feel the heat radiating from the machines, breathe in the smell of paper and hear the noise of the papermaking process.

Forges du Saint-Maurice

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to the Forges du Saint-Maurice, a National Historic Site commemorating the birth of the iron-making industry in Canada. Founded in 1730, the Forges were in use for over 150 years and endured through the various forms of government in that period of Canadian history, from the French Regime to the Confederation.

Iron and Cast-Iron Items, Blast Furnace, Video, Saint-Maurice River

During your guided visit, admire the iron and cast-iron items manufactured at the Forges du Saint-Maurice, see the blast furnace and learn more about the craftsmen who, for 150 years, provided the objects needed for the development and defence of the colony. A video presentation is included, and you can take an optional stroll down to the Saint-Maurice River, which requires 125 steps to return. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for the short drive back to the pier.

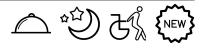
