ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

PORT TALKS

Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. YQB-A / HISTORIC AND MODERN QUÉBEC & MONTMORENCY FALLS

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$79; Duration: 3.00 hrs



Discover the picturesque beauty, charm and landmarks of Québec during this memorable sightseeing excursion through the historic Old Town, and a visit to the spectacular Montmorency Falls.

Place Royale

Depart the pier for a scenic drive by Place Royale, a beautifully restored market square of 17th- and 18th-century stone architecture located in the heart of the Lower Town. Place Royale was the site of Champlain's first settlement and the oldest standing Catholic Church in Canada, Notre-Dame-des-Victoires. From here, proceed to the Dufferin Terrace and *Le Château Frontenac* area.

Dufferin Terrace

Located 200 feet above the waterway, this viewpoint offers spectacular vistas of the St. Lawrence River, Île d'Orléans and the Laurentian Mountains. During your brief visit, learn about the history of the area.

Cap Diamant & Montmorency Falls

Next, a photo stop is made at Cap Diamant for exquisite views of the St. Lawrence River, Lower Town and surrounding countryside. Afterward, drive through the scenic National Battlefields Park, or 'Plains of Abraham', along the Grande-Allée and past the Hôtel du Parlement en route to Montmorency Falls. A brief photo stop is made here to marvel at the Montmorency River roaring over the cliff and down to the St. Lawrence River.

Your tour concludes with a brief drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking over paved and cobblestone surfaces; walking at Dufferin Terrace and Montmorency Falls is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair. A sweater or light jacket is recommended. The tour sequence may vary.

YQB-C / GRAND EXPLORATION OF QUÉBEC

DIFFICULTY

Indulge your senses with the scenic highlights of historic Québec and its environs during this memorable, full-day sightseeing excursion. Place Royale, Île d'Orléans & Lunch

Depart the pier for a scenic drive by Place Royale, a beautifully restored market square of 17th- and 18th-century stone architecture located in the heart of the Lower Town. Leaving Place Royale, continue on across the bridge to Île d'Orléans. Upon arrival, drive through picturesque villages of traditional rural Québec and Pointe de Sainte Pétronille, then proceed for a French lunch at a typical Québecois restaurant.

National Battlefield Park & Cap-Diamant

Continue for the brief drive to the National Battlefield Park, also known as the 'Plains of Abraham'. This historic battleground has been transformed into a beautiful 250-acre (101-hectare) park with hills, gardens, monuments and artillery artefacts. A photo stop is made at Cap Diamant for exquisite views of the St. Lawrence River, Lower Town and surrounding countryside. From here, proceed to the Dufferin Terrace and Le Château Frontenac area.

Dufferin Terrace & Le Château Frontenac

Located 200 feet (180 metres) above the waterway, this viewpoint offers spectacular vistas of the St. Lawrence River, Île d'Orléans and the Laurentian Mountains. During your brief visit, learn about the history of the area and take an optional stroll to Québec's most celebrated landmark, Le Château Frontenac. This magnificent, green-turreted castle was built in 1893 by the Canadian Pacific Railroad.

Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré

After lunch, re-board your coach for the drive to Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré and listen to a narrative by your guide en route. Upon arrival, commence your self-guided exploration of the lovely grounds and major sites of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, including the Basilica, Scala Santa and Memorial Chapel. Following your visit, re-board your coach and drive to Montmorency Falls via Avenue Royale.

Montmorency Falls

This imposing natural phenomenon is 1.5 times higher than Niagara Falls. During your visit, take in breath-taking views and see the powerful forces of nature at work as the Montmorency River cascades over a 272-foot-high (about 83-metre-high) cliff and down to the St. Lawrence River. Some free time is also made available to take a stroll along the paths near the falls.

Your tour concludes with a brief return drive to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking for approximately 750 yards (about 686 metres) over paved and cobblestone surfaces, with approximately 20 steps to negotiate at the Basilica (a wheelchair ramp is available), 85 steps at the Scala Santa and 20 steps at the Memorial Chapel if guests wish to see all the sights. As walking at Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, Montmorency Falls and Dufferin Terrace is at the discretion of each guest, this tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair. A sweater or light jacket is recommended. The tour sequence may vary.

YQB-D / BICYCLING ADVENTURE TO MONTMORENCY FALLS

DIFFICULTY

Peddle through one of the more picturesque parts of Québec during this half-day adventure to Montmorency Falls.

At the pier, meet your professional cycling guide for the short walk to the cycle shop, where you are fitted with a bicycle, helmet, and bottle of water. Following a brief safety demonstration, head out with your guide and begin the 15.5 mile (25-kilometre), bike ride to Montmorency Falls.

The Journey

Pedal past the Québec Yacht Harbour and the Industrial Grain Elevators before crossing the St. Charles River to Domaine Maizerets, a historic site and vast landscape garden located on one of New France's first concessions. After a brief stop for photos and water, the cycle path continues on a parallel course along the St. Lawrence River, offering spectacular views of the skyline of Québec and the Île d'Orléans.

Montmorency Falls

Upon arrival at Montmorency Falls, board an aerial tram for the ride to the summit of the mountain. Here, breath-taking views await as you admire the powerful forces of nature, the water of the Montmorency River roaring down the 272-foot (82-metre) cliff to eventually meet with the St. Lawrence River.

Return to the cycle path and ride for back towards the ship, re-tracing your route.

Please note: This tour involves a bicycle ride of approximately 15.5 miles (25 kilometres) over flat even roads and bicycle paths. This tour is recommended only for guests in good physical condition. It is not suitable for guest with limited mobility, heart or breathing problems, or those who cannot pedal a bicycle for long periods of time. Guest must sign a waiver to participate. Bring water from the ship. As this tour operates in most weather conditions, we suggest you dress in layers and bring rain gear

YQB-I / OLD QUÉBEC ON FOOT & TEA AT CHÂTEAU FRONTENAC

DIFFICULTY

Watch the history of Québec come alive during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion through the city on-foot.

Québec City, Lower Town, Place-Royale, Notre-Dame-des-Victoires, Petit-Champlain Street

Depart the pier for your guided and narrated stroll through the Lower Town. Your first stop is Place-Royale, an historic square with stone buildings that were once the homes of wealthy merchants. Built and rebuilt several times, the square remains the heart of the Lower Town and home of North America's oldest standing Catholic Church, the Notre-Dame-des-Victoires. Located just around the corner from Place-Royale is the charming, pedestrian-only area of Petit-Champlain. As you walk along its narrow cobblestone streets, pass by an array of quaint boutiques, specialty shops and outdoor cafés, as well as strolling musicians, jugglers and street performers.

Funicular-Ride, Upper Town, Old Town, Place d'Armes, Dufferin Terrace, Old English Walls

Next, take a short, panoramic funicular-ride from the Lower Town to the Upper Town. Upon arrival, take a short, guided walk through the Old Town, the only walled city in North America and an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Along the way, pass by Place d'Armes, Dufferin Terrace, Place de l'Hôtel de Ville, Ursuline Convent, Québec Seminary, Artists' Alley, the Old English Walls and Dufferin Terrace, located approximately 200 feet (about 61 metres) above the waterway. It was at the Dufferin Terrace that Samuel de Champlain built his fort in 1620. From here, take in spectacular views over the Saint Lawrence River, town of Lévis on the opposite shore, Île d'Orléans and the Laurentian Mountains.

Château Frontenac, Refreshments

Whilst in the Upper Town, a stop is made at the Château Frontenac. Perched on a hill overlooking the St. Lawrence River, the castle-like Château Frontenac is the best-known landmark in Québec. It was here that Franklin D. Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and William Mackenzie King met to discuss the Allied strategy during World War II. During your visit, relax with tea or coffee and a pastry. Following your visit, you may opt to return to the pier on-foot, or remain in town for further shopping and exploration, and return to the ship on your own.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for 0.93 miles (about 1.5 kilometres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces and inclines. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear

warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a weatherproof coat from the ship. The tour sequence may vary. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

YQB-J / FLAVOURS OF QUÉBEC WALKING TOUR

Discover the splendid flavours and charm of Québec City on-foot during this scenic, half-day walking tour and tasting excursion to the Old Town. Québec City, Old Town

Depart the pier for your guided and narrated stroll through the Old Town. As you walk along the cobblestone streets, take in the Old World beauty of centuries-old buildings, shops and Victorian homes that embellish Québec's history and charm. Along the way, stops are made at several different venues where tastings and presentations take place. Discover the culinary culture of Québec, along with flavours that blend the city's French heritage with a North American influence.

Tastings of Local Specialities and Spirits, Cider House

The restaurants visited on this excursion are centrally located, and offer local specialities paired with locally-made spirits. In all, enjoy up to ten uniquely different tastings. Included is a stop at the Cider House for a tasting of their renowned ciders. At the conclusion of your walking and tasting tour of Québec City, commence the short walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for 0.6 miles (about one kilometre), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces and inclines. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear warm, layered clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a weatherproof coat from the ship. Guests must be at least 21 years old to participate in tastings of alcoholic beverages. The tour sequence may vary.

YQB-K / SAINTE-ANNE CANYON & WINERY VISIT

DIFFICULTY

Experience the spectacular natural splendour and flavours of French Canada's Beaupré Coast during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Saint Lawrence River, Montmorency Falls, Shrine of Sainte-Anne, Quebec Skyline

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to the Sainte-Anne Canyon. En route, drive along the Saint Lawrence River and past lovely pastoral landscapes, the impressive, approximately 272-foot (about 83-metre) Montmorency Falls, magnificent Shrine of Sainte-Anne, and skyline of Quebec before reaching the Beaupré Coast, nestled in the foothills of the Laurentian Mountains.

Sainte-Anne Canyon, Sainte-Anne-du-Nord River, Waterfall

Located along the Beaupré Coast, the Sainte-Anne Canyon is a spectacular, steep-sided gorge carved into the 900-million-year-old rock of the Canadian Shield by the Sainte-Anne-du-Nord River. Upon arrival, visit the three bridges and various lookout platforms with interpretive displays offering breath-taking vistas of your surrounds and a 243-foot (about 74-metre) waterfall. A specially-designed vehicle provides disabled guests with access to the length of the north walkway, as well as two suspension bridges. After returning to the entrance via vehicle or on-foot, some free time is made available for a comfort stop, and a visit to the gift shop or small café.

Winery Tour and Tasting

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to a local vineyard. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour. Along the way, discover a typically Quebecois variety of grape adapted especially for this Nordic climate and developed in Québec. Built in 1937, this was the first church in the Baie-Comeau area. Built in Tudor style, it has imposing oak trim and stained glass windows. The main window depicts local forest animals

Mance

Continue walking along Champlain Street where the former Premier of Canada, Brian Mulroney, spent his childhood. Have the chance to visit the town's famous hotel, Manoir Baie-Comeau, where cake and tea will be served.

Manoir Baie-Comeau

Robert Rutherford McCormick, president of the Chicago Tribune, founded Baie-Comeau in 1937 when he established a paper plant to control costs for his newspaper business. He built a sumptuous manor that later burned to the ground in 1965. The manor was re-built in 1965 using stone instead of wood. It was completely renovated in 2004 and is now a hotel with all the charm of an old French colonial manoir, with most of the rooms, dining room, terrace and gardens open on to spectacular views of the St. Lawrence River. Enjoy cake and tea during your stop at the Manoir.

Return to Place La Salle on foot where you have the option of either remaining in town and taking the shuttle back to the ship, or returning immediately to the ship.

Havre St. Pancrace Lookout

From the pier, depart on the short drive to the magnificent Havre St. Pancrace lookout, 600 metres high for a brief photo stop. During Prohibition in the 1930s, this isolated spot was a popular delivery point for contraband liquor!

Village Forestier d'Antan

Continue on to a forest interpretation center known as Village Forestier d'Antan. The forest industry was crucial to the development of the North Shore. Activities such as cutting, hauling, driving, and other aspects of life in the forest are presented at this interpretation center. Typical buildings, period objects, and old photographs illustrate lumberjack's living conditions and way of life of this period.

Place La Salle

Finally there will be a short tour of Baie-Comeau's heritage area, including Place La Salle (this quaint commercial artery, home of the Biosphere square, full of sites of historical interest, bustles with specialty food shops, souvenir stores, art galleries, fine restaurants, and nightclubs), where visitors can admire the magnificent scenery and Champlain Street where the former Premier of Canada, Brian Mulroney, spent his childhood.

Upon arrival, listen to a brief presentation about the park. Afterward, some free time is made available to explore the park at your leisure, and embrace the beauty of the Manicouagan Peninsula and its ecosystems.

Free Time, Rivière aux Outardes, Boreal Forest, Beaches, Bogs, Sand Dunes, Salt Marsh

Baie-Comeau Sightseeing, Place La Salle

The Fortress is Canada's largest historical reconstruction, where you step back in time to the 18th century when Louisbourg was a thriving seaport - one of the busiest harbours in North America. The site has been meticulously rebuilt to one quarter of the 18th century town on the foundations of the original by following detailed blueprints from Paris archives.

Upon arrival at the Fortress, and following a brief guided tour with your guide, you are then free to explore this fascinating historic site on your own, taking in the beauty of the exterior architecture of the buildings and visiting some of the exhibit buildings that will be open for your viewing pleasure.

Stimulate your senses with a trio of rotating workshops offering many opportunities to explore a place that time has forgotten. Rub shoulders with local characters, the De Gannes and the Chief Engineer's servants, as they provide a rare glimpse into the exciting challenges faced by the resilient residents of the 18th-century town. Revel in the magnificence of the King's Bastion while listening to stirring tales of soldiers testing their mettle in an unfamiliar new environment. And for pure indulgence, treat yourself to the elegant bliss of our chocolate demonstrations, delighting in a first-hand experience making hot chocolate the old fashioned" way.

The Fortress of Louisbourg offers an opportunity to imagine life in the toughest of conditions almost 300 years ago with beautiful visuals in static displays, surrounded by the beauty of the architecture of the buildings.

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for the approximate 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking over flat, gravel or beaten pathways. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or for guests who utilise a wheelchair. Comfortable layered clothing, weather-appropriate outerwear, and a camera are recommended.

YQY-C / SCENIC BADDECK & ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL MUSEUM

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate one-hour drive to Baddeck. En route, pass over the Seal Island Bridge and make a photo stop at Kelly's Mountain (weather permitting). Upon arrival in Baddeck, proceed for a visit to the Alexander Graham Bell Museum, which is located across the bay from Bell's estate.

Alexander Graham Bell Museum

The museum's three exhibition halls contain the largest collection of Bell's artefacts and inventions, including replicas of the first telephones and a full-scale model of the HD-4 hydrofoil craft. In addition to the invention of the telephone, Bell also made remarkable contributions in the fields of medicine, genetics, electricity, sound and speech, aeronautics, and marine engineering. Displays to be seen during your visit include original artefacts, photographs, and exhibits highlighting his extensive research and inventions.

Baddeck

Afterward, re-board your coach for the brief drive to the centre of Baddeck. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to discover the heart of this quaint village. Located on an inlet of the Bras d'Or Lakes, Baddeck is the region's most highly developed tourist centre and is world-renowned as a fine resort community. It was in this attractive setting that Alexander Graham Bell built his home, Beinn Bhreagh, or 'Beautiful Mountain' in Gaelic.

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the approximate one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking. Walking at the Bell Museum and in Baddeck is at the discretion of each guest. YQY-D / LIFE OF A COAL MINER

Experience the arduous life of a Cape Breton Island coal miner during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Cape Breton Island and Miners Museum

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive up the east side of Cape Breton Island to the Cape Breton Miners Museum. En route, pass through small mining towns and coastal routes featuring rugged shorelines and rolling hills abounding with lush, verdant foliage. Upon arrival at the Cape Breton Miners Museum, take a guided tour of the museum. Along the way, learn about the various types of coal mining and mining techniques, and see the large display of equipment on hand. Afterward, some free time is made available to explore the museum at your leisure, and browse for souvenirs.

Miners' Village and Ocean Deeps Colliery Coal Mine

Located next to the museum, the Miners' Village allows you to step back in time and visit a company store and mid-late-19th-century home. The highlight of your visit is a tour of the Ocean Deeps Colliery, an actual 1932 coal mine located directly beneath the museum. After a brief orientation, don your helmets and raincoats before descending into the mine on-foot. Accompanied by retired coal miners, experience what it was like to extract coal and learn all about trapper boys, lads as young as eight or nine who had to control the air current by opening and closing the underground doors when the coal boxes passed.

Glace Bay Heritage Museum

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the nearby Glace Bay Heritage Museum, which is surrounded by wild roses and tall grass. Originally the Town Hall, this historic, 112-year-old, three-story red brick building once housed the fire and police departments, courtrooms, civic offices, and town jail. The aging building was restored in 2003, and began a new life as the Glace Bay Heritage Museum, which features exhibits chronicling the area's history and contributions. Following refreshments, some free time is made available to browse the gift shop for unique jewellery, games, handcrafted items, pottery, painting, Old Town Hall memorabilia, and books written by authors from Cape Breton. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, at times over uneven, steep, and grassy surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the sites visited. The program includes a fiddler, a singer and a Celtic dancer. Refreshments including traditional Cape Breton oatcakes will be available. After the performance guests are free to return to the ship or browse the many shops in the Terminal.

Enjoy approximately two hours on this sweeping, scenic site to partake in a special storytelling tour conducted by costumed staff. You will also participate in a "milling frolic," a hands-on textile-working experience that sees you singing Gaelic songs, drinking tea and nibbling on traditional Scottish oatcakes.

At the conclusion of the tour, re-board the vehicle for the approximate one-hour return drive to the pier.

Taste traditional Mi'kmaq food, learn the craft of basket-making, observe their traditional dances and play a 5,000-year-old traditional game of chance. Afterward, bake bread on an open fire, discover how the Mi'kmaq hunted and fished, healed their illnesses, and experience a smudging ceremony. Following your tour, you can browse the gift shop for native crafts, jewellery, art and books. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Halifax City Tour

Your tour concludes with a narrated sightseeing drive through Halifax, which is home to acclaimed museums, gracious parks, astounding monuments and endless historic buildings. Pass by the Metro Centre, Halifax's convention centre, before seeing the Historic Properties Complex. Here, old seaport buildings have been skilfully converted into attractive shops and restaurants.

Your tour concludes with a brief drive back to the pier.

This tiny rustic fishing village of just 40 year-round residents is highlighted by the impressive rock formations left by eroding glaciers and granite millions of years ago. Upon arrival, explore Peggy's Cove at your leisure.

Stroll along the walking trail to the stately lighthouse, or take an optional guided walking tour through this tiny cove with its bustling fishing harbour. Along the way, learn about the history of the cove, lighthouse and the lobster fishery that is the backbone of the local economy. See the different types of traps used, and have an opportunity to touch a live lobster. For a taste of the region, you may wish to independently stop by the *Sou Wester* restaurant to sample the locally-renowned chowder and gingerbread.

Next, view a tribute to the people of Peggy's Cove at the massive deGarthe Monument before visiting the shops and galleries, or exploring the rocks on your own.

Following your visit, re-board your coach and return to the pier via the Lighthouse Route that winds its way through the seaside villages lining historic St. Margaret's Bay.

Halifax, Mahone Bay, Main Street, Art Galleries, Shops, Wooden Churches, Bay Views

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive to Mahone Bay, one of the most beautiful towns in eastern Canada. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to explore Mahone Bay at your leisure. You can browse the art galleries and shops lining the charming main street, and view the town's many wooden churches, three of which stand side-by-side on the picturesque bay.

Lunenburg, Fisheries Museum, Bluenose II Replica, Banks Fishery, Aquarium, Lobster Presentation

Marble House

Completed in 1892 at a cost of \$11 million and built of white marble with four Corinthian entrance columns, this Neo-classical masterpiece is the most impressive of the 'summer cottages' on famed Bellevue Avenue. There is marble throughout the mansion, and its furnishings are predominantly Louis XIV- and XV-style pieces that are original to the house. On the east lawn stands the replica of a classic, 12th-century Chinese temple.

Your tour concludes with the drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking and extended periods of standing (for approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes), with six steps to negotiate to enter The Breakers, six steps from the foyer to the Main Hall and a flight of stairs to access the second floor. Along the way you will see famous Broadway, pass Trinity Church, and Wall Street with the New York Stock Exchange. Take note of the iconic "Charging Bull" statue, which has become the unofficial symbol of Wall Street.

9/11 Memorial

Then, arriving at the World Trade Center you will be provided with an entry pass to the newly completed 9/11 Memorial. Set within an 8-acre Memorial Plaza landscaped with a small forest of oak trees, the Memorial features two massive pools built over the footprints of the original Twin Towers, with 30-foot waterfalls cascading down into the pools. The names of the 2,982 men, women and children killed in the attacks of September 11, 2001 and February 26, 1993 are inscribed in parapets surrounding the reflecting pools. You will have time to view and contemplate the Memorial, its visitor's center and the on-going construction of the site which, when finished, will be home to New York's tallest building. Your guide will answer any questions and explain aspects of the construction. Please be reminded that the 9/11 Memorial is a place of remembrance and quiet reflection.

Following your visit, walk back to the coach and continue with the transfer to the John F. Kennedy and La guardia airports.

Please Note: The tour is available to guests with domestic flights departing after 3:30 p.m. and international flights departing after 4:30 p.m. Guests must claim and clear their bags through Customs at the pier. Luggage will then accompany guests on the coach. This tour involves an extensive amount of slow walking and standing (for approximately 2 hours) and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or guests utilizing a wheelchair. Please be reminded that it is mainly an outside walking tour and will operate in all weather conditions. Guests are recommended to dress in layers; wear comfortable shoes and bring a rain jacket. Tour sequence and timings will depend on clearance at the pier and traffic conditions.
