

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain you're selecting excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the tour description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information and attend the port talks onboard. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore- side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours. When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

SMOKING

For reasons of safety and comfort, smoking is not permitted on any tour vehicles used by Silversea. Your understanding in this matter is appreciated.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

Scarborough - Trinidad and Tobago

SCA-A / TOBAGO HIGHLIGHTS, TROPICAL GARDEN & NATURE RESERVE

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$69; Duration:3.00 hrs

Enjoy a half-day tour of the southern highlights of this lovely island and a walk in the forest to observe the indigenous birdlife.

Depart the port and begin the tour along the Claude Noel Highway. After a short drive along this road, turn off onto Shirvon Road, passing several residential areas en route to the first stop at Fort James.

Mysterious Tombstone and Fort James

The fort was destroyed several times and the present one was erected in 1800. Another much quoted attraction is the enigmatic tombstone of Betty Stevens. Its puzzling inscription reads, "She was a mother without knowing it, and a wife, without letting her husband know, except by her kind indulgences to him." This epitaph has baffling people for over 230 years. After making your own guesses as to its' meaning continue on to the main event of your trip, The Tropical Garden and Nature Reserve.

Tropical Garden and Nature Reserve

This piece of paradise centers around a bird feeding house. Watch in wonder as mobs of neon humming-birds flit and flutter around the feeding stations. Woodpeckers, parakeets, jacamars and egrets make their regular appearances too; so keep a close lookout.

Following this walk in the forest, enjoy a refreshing rum or fruit punch before re-boarding your coach for the return to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity and walking over uneven ground. Birdwatchers, may wish to bring their binoculars. We suggest guests dress in lightweight tropical attire, flat walking shoes and wear ample sun protection.

SCA-B / ARGYLE WATERFALLS

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$79; Duration: 3.50 hrs

Experience Tobago's rainforest-clad interior and one of its prettiest waterfalls, Argyle Falls, during this half-day outing.

Begin your tour with the scenic 1-hour ride in a coach along the island's dramatic Windward road, passing throught several small villages such as Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Pembroke, Bell Garden and Roxborough, where you enter the Main Ridge Forest Reserve. From here a guided tour takes you on a walk through the Roxborough Rain Forest, the oldest protected Rain Forest in the Western Hemisphere.

After a forest walk of approximately 20 minutes, arrive at the Argyle waterfalls- a series of three tiered cascades reaching up to 175 feet (53 metres) high and crashing into crystal clear pools. Some free time here will allow you to take a swim or just take in nature at its best. After about an hour return to your awaiting transport for the 1-hour return drive to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves moderate activity and walking over uneven ground and rocks, which may become slippery when wet. Extra caution is advised. Guests wishing to swim should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel from the ship. Guests may wish to wear trekking shoes they do not mind getting wet or soiled. Guests are advised to wear light-weight clothing, sun protection and insect repellent. Extra caution must be exercised by guests wishing to enter the water as the rocks may be slippery. There are no lifeguards on duty and swimming will be at guest's own risk. Binoculars are also recommended for bird-watching. The flow of water at the falls is directly impacted by the seasonal rain received.

SCA-D / BUCCOO REEF AND NYLON POOL

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$59; Duration: 3.00 hrs

Explore the underwater world without getting wet during this scenic glass-bottom boat tour over the living coral reefs of Tobago, then dive in to explore the reef up close and personal.

Begin the tour with a scenic drive to Pigeon Point Heritage Park. Upon arrival, take off your shoes and wade in approximately 2 feet of water to, board a glass-bottom boat and cruise out to Buccoo Reef, one of the most accessible coral reefs in the Caribbean, just a short distance off Pigeon Point and Store Bay beaches.

En route to Buccoo Reef, your captain will pass over the Coral Gardens, pointing out fascinating underwater sea life along the way. Upon arrival, guests wishing to snorkel or swim will have approximately one hour to enjoy the water before cruising to Nylon Pool, a shallow white-sand area within Buccoo Reef with waters said to rejuvenate anyone lucky enough to swim in it. Dubbed by Princess Margaret as 'Nylon Reef' during her honeymoon in 1962, she commented, "It's so crazy-blue, it looks like nylon."

This entire area, a Tobago national treasure, is designated as the country's only marine protected area under the Marine Areas Preservation and Enhancement Act of 1970 once explored by Jacques Cousteau himself.

Following your visit to the Nylon Pool, your captain will set a course back to the landing at Pigeon Point Beach, where you will board your transportation for your return trip back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves minimal activity for guests that stay on the boat. Guests wishing to snorkel or swim, must be in good physical condition and able to swim in water too deep to stand. A mask and snorkel is provided or you may wish to bring your own. We recommend guests wear lightweight comfortable clothing over their swimsuit, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship. A ramp is used for boarding the boat; Be prepared to get wet boarding the boat.

SCA-G / TOBAGO COCOA DISCOVERY

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$89; Duration:4.00 hrs



Discover the stages by which cocoa is grown and processed for consumption during this fascinating and flavourful, half-day sightseeing excursion to the Tobago Cocoa Estate.

Scarborough, Windward Coast Rd., Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Pembroke, Belle Garden, Roxborough

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive along Windward Coast Road and through the villages of Bacolet, Mount St. George, Pembroke, Bell Garden, and Roxborough. From here, turn off the Main Ridge and enter the oldest rainforest reserve in the Western Hemisphere. Upon arrival at the Tobago Cocoa Estate, learn about the history of the cocoa industry and its standing on the island.

Tobago Cocoa Estate, Cocoa Production Process, Rainforest Walk, Cocoa Tasting

During a walking tour of the estate, take an opportunity to view the drying, fermentation and various other stages of cocoa production, visit a mud oven and house where the cocoa is dried, and learn about the many products that are available here. In addition, explore the lush vegetation and abundant plant-life growing in Tobago's Rainforest, and view other local produce growing on the estate. Following your walking tour, proceed for a tasting of chocolates or a refreshing cup of 'cocoa tea', made from raw cocoa. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 0.6 miles (about one kilometre), at times over uneven and natural surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and insect repellent from the ship. Guests must be at least seven years old to participate on this tour.

SCA-H / TOBAGO ISLAND EXPLORER

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$149; Duration:7.00 hrs



Experience the coastal splendour and historic sites of Tobago Island during this scenic, full-day sightseeing excursion.

Scarborough, Fort King George, Cannons, Artefacts, Ocean Vistas, Tobago Museum

Depart the pier for the short drive through the town of Scarborough en route to your first stop, Fort King George. Built in 1781, this elevated fort features cannons, artefacts, a museum in the barracks and stunning ocean vistas. Upon arrival, take a guided tour of fort's Tobago Museum.

Windward Coast Road, Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Granby Point, Pembroke Village and Heritage Park

Next, re-board your coach and continue along Windward Coast Road, passing through several coastline villages such as Bacolet, Mount St. George, Granby Point and Pembroke. A stop is made in Pembroke Village for a guided tour of the Pembroke Heritage Park.

Speyside Lookout, Charlotteville, Lunch, Jemma's Sea ViewKitchenRestaurant

Leaving the park, re-board your coach and head to the Speyside Lookout. Following a photo stop here, proceed for a brief stop in Charlotteville en route to a local lunch at *Jemma's SeaviewKitchen* restaurant. After lunch, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 85-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 0.6 miles (about one kilometre), at times over grassy surfaces and slight inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the sites visited. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection is recommended. Guests must be at least seven years old to participate on this tour. The tour sequence may vary.

SCA-I / TOBAGO 4X4 ADVENTURE

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 4.00 hrs



Discover parts of Tobago not commonly seen by most visitors to the island during this panoramic, half-day, off-road excursion.

Scarborough, Tobago, Off-Road Driving, Rivers, Old Plantations, Birdlife, Wildlife

Depart the pier for an exciting, off-road excursion in search of adventure and hidden sights that most visitors to Tobago never get to discover. Drive on dirt roads off the beaten track, and through rivers and old plantations from the Caribbean coast into the heart of the island. Along the way, see a variety of birds, including the colourful motmot, and Tobago's wildlife up-close.

Sugar Factory ruins, Rainforest, Atlantic Coast, Goldsborough Waterfall, Fort Granbee, Hope Village

Following a short stop at the ruins of an old sugar factory, re-board your coach and drive along the southern boundary of the rainforest en route to the Atlantic coast, with a stop at the Goldsborough Waterfall, a lovely hidden waterfall. Afterward, re-board your Jeep and continue along a river where it is easy to spot caymans, then proceed for visits to Fort Granbee and Hope Village. At the conclusion of your tour, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 40-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of off-road driving over bumpy and uneven natural surfaces and inclines, and a moderate amount of walking, at times over uneven and natural surfaces, with a few steep steps to negotiate to get on/off the 4x4. This tour involves bench-style seating inside and outside of 4x4s modified for this purpose. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with neck/back problems, guests with heart/respiratory conditions, guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair; guests must be able to get in/out of the 4x4 without assistance. Guests must follow the safety instructions of their guides at all times, and, for safety reasons, must remain seated with their seatbelts fastened once the vehicle is in motion; the seatbelts are lap belts. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, insect repellent, a bathing suit and towel from the ship. Guests must be at least six years old to participate on this tour. A signed waiver is required to participate on this tour. Although frequently encountered on this type of tour, wildlife sightings are not guaranteed. The tour sequence may vary. Space on this tour is extremely limited; we suggest you book well in advance to avoid disappointment.

SCA-L / TOBAGO BON ACCORD SEA KAYAKING

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$119; Duration:3.00 hrs



Embrace the spectacular natural beauty of the Lagoon and the Caribbean Sea from up-close during this invigorating, half-day kayaking excursion.

Scarborough, Bon Accord Lagoon, Mangroves

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Bon Accord Lagoon. Upon arrival, enter the Boardwalk and board the Kayaks. After receiving your safety and kayaking instructions and equipment, gear up and begin your guided, approximately two-hour kayaking journey within the beautiful mangrove lagoon and Caribbean Sea.

Bird Species, Marine Life, Boardwalk, Natural Sanctuary, Wetlands, Buccoo Reef

Along the way, look for turtles, cattle egrets, flamingos, and many other bird species that inhabit this beautiful ecosystem. Stops are also made to stroll along the Banks of the Lagoon and Buccoo Reef, and visit the natural sanctuary and wetlands. At the conclusion of your kayaking tour, return to the Bon Accord Lagoon. Upon arrival, disembark your kayak, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Jungle Trek

Follow your well-trained guide through the jungle trail for a close-up look of the wonderful surroundings. During the walk, there will be several stops in which the guide will explain survival techniques such as how to construct a shelter or find a climbing plant containing drinking water.

After the jungle trek, embark the boat for the return journey to the floating pier in Manaus.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. The river boat is equipped with basic restroom facilities. Sightings of wildlife in their natural habitat cannot be guaranteed. Please be aware that water levels in this area constantly vary, therefore the itinerary is subject to change without prior notice. You may get wet while participating in this tour. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with long trousers and flat-soled, closed-toe, flat non-slip shoes walking shoes, and bring sunscreen, insect repellent, a hat and sunglasses from the ship. Transportation is by local riverboat. Caution is advised when embarking and disembarking the riverboats and canoes.

Manaus, Speedboat-Ride, Rio Negro, Lake Acajatuba, Lakefront Village, Pink Dolphins

Depart the pier aboard an aluminium speedboat for the scenic, approximately 90-minute cruise up the Rio Negro en route to a community on the shores of Lake Acajatuba. Some years ago, two local girls began feeding the resident, and now very famous, pink dolphins from a floating pier. These beautiful cetaceans have since become very accustomed to having human visitors, and are extremely friendly.

See, Touch and Swim with the Dolphins, Dolphin-Feeding, Free Time, Shopping

Your visit to this lakefront community features a unique opportunity to see, touch and even swim with the dolphins whilst standing on a submerged platform, as your guide hand-feeds these amazing creatures. Following your dolphin encounter, some free time is made available to explore the village and browse for handicrafts. At the conclusion of your visit, embark your speedboat and commence the approximately 90-minute ride back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 262 yards (about 240 metres), at times over uneven and natural surfaces, with a few steps to embark/disembark the speedboat and 15 steps to access the village during the dry season. Walking in the local village is at the discretion of each guest. The boating distance between the pier and Lake Acajatuba is approximately 90 minutes in each direction, and very bumpy. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with neck and/or back problems, guests with heart and/or respiratory conditions, guests prone to seasickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with beach or boat shoes, and bring sun protection, insect repellent, a towel and bottled water from the ship. Do not wear sunscreen or jewellery, as these can injure the dolphin's skin. Guests must be at least 12 years old to participate on this tour. Although frequently encountered on this type of tour, wildlife and marine life sightings are not guaranteed. A signed waiver is required to participate on this tour. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions.

Scenic West Coast Drive

Bathsheba Beach and St. John's Church

Upon arrival at idyllic Bathsheba Beach, take a stroll on this world-renowned surfing beach. Marvel at dramatic views of the rugged coastline, pounding Atlantic surf and intricately-carved wooden pulpit made with over 30 types of wood. Leaving the beach, re-board your coach and head to St. John's Church for stunning views of the Atlantic coastline.

Gun Hill Signal Station

Next, proceed to Gun Hill Signal Station. Located in the centre of the island, Gun Hill was a former military post and lookout during World War II, and offers wonderful panoramic views of the island.

Your tour will conclude with a transfer to the airport.

Orchid World

St. John's Parish Church

Your guided tour also includes a visit to the burial place of Ferdinando Paleolgus, a descendent of Emperor Constantine the Great, whose family was driven from the throne of Constantinople by the Turks.

Lunch at Sunbury Plantation

A light buffet lunch will be served at the Sunbury Plantation House. After lunch, re-board your coach and commence the short drive to the airport in time for your return flight home.
