General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours.

When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

Manila - Philippines

MNL-A / SITES OF OLD MANILA

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$69; Duration:3.75 hrs

Explore the history, architecture and landmarks of Manila during this scenic, half-day tour of the Old City.

Fort Santiago

Depart the pier for the brief drive along Roxas Boulevard, a six-mile-long (10-kilometre-long) promenade that was reclaimed from Manila Bay. From here, proceed to the heart of the old walled Spanish city of Intramuros, where the history of Manila as a capital city began.

Your first stop is at Fort Santiago, which overlooks the Pasig River. It is the country's foremost cultural relic, and the site of key moments in Philippine history. Following your visit, walk to the local handicraft store just outside the fort to browse for souvenirs.

San Agustin Church & Museum

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the San Agustin Church and Monastery, also located within the walls of Intramuros. The church dates from the 16th century, and is the country's oldest structure. Its extensive collection of religious artefacts makes the San Agustin Church and Monastery the country's largest ecclesiastical museum.

Rizal Park and Manila Hotel

Your tour continues with a brief visit to Rizal Park. The park is the former site of a native community, Bagumbayan, which stood beyond the Spanish walls of Intramuros.

Following a photo stop at the park's Rizal Monument, commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier, with a welcome drink at the *Manila Hotel* en route.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking for approximately 328 yards (about 300 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 30 steps at the venues (including some uneven and narrow steps at Fort Santiago). This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, non-slip walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. No photography is permitted inside the San Agustin Church.

MNL-B / MODERN MANILA

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$79; Duration:4.00 hrs

Explore the history of Manila during a memorable, half-day excursion to this modern metropolis.

Ayala Museum

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to the Ayala Museum. Upon arrival, take a guided tour of the museum, whose core historical collections include 60 handcrafted dioramas that chronicle the rich tapestry of the Philippine's evolution. The museum also features a one-of-a-kind boat gallery, showcasing miniatures of some of the watercraft that have contributed to the development of Philippine maritime trade and its Colonial economy. Archaeological and ethnographic objects from the country's northern and southern communities complement the historical collection. The Fine Arts collection features important works by three painters considered pioneers in Philippine art; *Juan Luna*, *Fernando Amorsolo*, and *Fernando Zobel*.

American Cemetery and Memorial

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the 152-acre (62-hectare) American Cemetery and Memorial, perhaps the largest and most beautiful Armed Forces resting place outside the continental United States. With a total of 17,206 graves, it is home to the largest number of graves of any cemetery for U.S. personnel killed during World War II, and holds war dead from the Philippines and other Allied nations. The marble headstones are aligned in eleven plots forming a circular pattern, and set amidst a wide variety of tropical trees and shrubbery. Following your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 656 yards (about 600 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. No photography is permitted inside the Ayala Museum. The Ayala Museum is closed on Mondays and on holidays.

MNL-C / PAGSANJAN RAPIDS AND FALLS

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$139; Duration:9.00 hrs



Embrace the picturesque beauty of Manila in a unique and exciting new way during this memorable, full-day excursion to the Pagsanjan River.

Pagsanjan River

Depart the pier for the approximately three-hour drive southeast of Manila to the town of Pagsanjan, with a comfort stop made en route. Located in the scenic native countryside, Pagsanjan is the home of the famous Pagsanjan River and Falls.

Scenic Canoe Ride

Upon arrival at the *Pagsanjan River View Resort*, proceed to the canoe launching area. Receive your safety instructions, then embark in a canoe manned by able-bodied boatmen for a ride upstream to the falls. Along the way, skim by rocks and boulders amidst steep gorges and lush vegetation.

Pagsanjan Falls

Upon reaching the falls, some free time is made available for you to relax and take in your idyllic surroundings. During your visit, you can take an optional bamboo raft-ride through the pounding curtain of water, which falls from a height of 70 feet (21 metres) above the gorge.

'Shooting the Rapids' & Lunch

Your ride back is a more thrilling experience. 'Shoot the rapids' while going downstream, with your boatmen skilfully manoeuvring the canoe between rocks and boulders until you reach calm waters. At the conclusion of your river excursion, change into dry clothing and proceed for lunch at the resort.

After lunch, commence the approximately three-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of activity, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, and a canoe and optional bamboo raft ride over choppy waters, rapids and falls. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. This tour is not suitable for pregnant women, guests with back and/or neck problems, or limited mobility, or those who utilise a wheelchair. All guests will get wet on this tour. The speed of the river varies depending on rains and volume of water, which can fluctuate. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing, and bring a swimsuit, flip-flops, sun protection and a change of clothing from the ship. The duration of the drive between the pier and Pagsanjan is approximately 3 hours in each direction.

MNL-E / PANORAMIC MANILA

DIFFICULTY

Discover the splendid highlights of Manila during this picturesque, half-day excursion through the city and its surrounds.

Manila City and Intramuros

Depart the pier for a scenic, approximately 30-minute orientation drive through Manila. Along the way, take in a panoramic view of the old walled city of Intramuros, built during the Spanish Colonial period, and Fort Santiago, which served as the headquarters of Spanish, American and Japanese colonizers until its destruction in 1945.

Manila Cathedral, Casa Manila and San Agustin Church

Next, pass by the Manila Cathedral, Casa Manila, a reconstructed 19th century landmark, and San Agustin Church. Constructed between 1587-1604, the San Agustin Church is the oldest surviving church in the Philippines, and the only building left intact when Intramuros was reduced to rubble during the liberation of Manila in 1945.

Coconut Palace, American Cemetery and Manila Hotel

Your drive continues past the Coconut Palace, Cultural Centre of the Philippines, and Philippine Convention Centre en route to the Makati Financial District and American Cemetery and Memorial. Your tour concludes with a stop for refreshments at the Manila Hotel before commencing the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 109 yards (about 100 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended.

MNL-F / INTRAMUROS TOUR

DIFFICULTY

Explore the history, architecture and landmarks of Manila during this scenic, half-day excursion to the Old City of Intramuros.

Fort Santiago and Intramuros

Depart the pier for the short drive along Roxas Boulevard, a 6.2-mile-long (ten-kilometre-long) promenade that was reclaimed from Manila Bay. From here, proceed to the heart of the old walled Spanish city of Intramuros, where the history of Manila as a capital city began. Your first stop is at Fort Santiago, which overlooks the Pasig River. It is the country's foremost cultural relic, and the site of key moments in Philippine history. Following your visit, walk to the local handicraft store just outside the fort to browse for souvenirs.

San Agustin Church and Monastery

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the San Agustin Church and Monastery, also located within the walls of Intramuros. The church dates from the 16th century, and is the country's oldest structure. Its extensive collection of religious artefacts makes the San Agustin Church and Monastery the country's largest Ecclesiastical museum.

Rizal Park

Your tour continues with a brief visit to Rizal Park. This park is the former site of a native community, Bagumbayan, which stood beyond the Spanish walls of Intramuros. After a photo stop here, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 656 yards (about 600 metres), at times over uneven surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 30 steps at the sights visited (including some uneven and narrow steps at Fort Santiago). This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, non-slip walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Photography is not permitted inside the San Agustin Church.

MNL-H / A DAY IN TAGAYTAY

DIFFICULTY

Discover the lush, tropical beauty, breath-taking vistas and historic landmarks of Manila during this scenic, full-day excursion to Tagaytay.

Manila, Las Pinas, San Jose Church, Bamboo Organ, Jeepney Factory Tour

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to Las Pinas. Upon arrival, proceed for a visit to the San Jose Church to see the world-famous, 19th-century Bamboo Organ. Afterward, re-board your coach and proceed to the nearby Jeepney Factory for a glimpse at how the iconic mode of transportation, the 'Jeepney', is manufactured.

Countryside, Villages, Rice Fields, Orchards, Plantations, Tagaytay, Taal Volcano, Taal Vista Hotel

Next, re-board your coach for a leisurely, approximately 1.5-hour drive through the countryside to Tagaytay. En route, pass through coastal villages, rice fields, fruit orchards and coconut plantations before reaching the cool climate of Tagaytay, a popular summer retreat that beckons those living in Manila. Nestled in a secluded corner of Tagaytay Ridge, approximately 2,250 feet (about 686 metres) above sea level, is the Taal Vista Hotel. From here, take in spectacular panoramic views of your surrounds, including the Taal Volcano. The smallest volcano in the world, Taal is best described as a volcano within a lake, within a larger volcano.

Lunch and Sightseeing Drive

After lunch at the Taal Vista Hotel, re-board your coach and commence the panoramic, approximately 1.5-hour drive back to the pier. En route, pass by renowned landmarks such as the Cultural Centre of the Philippines, Folk Arts Theatre, Rizal Park, Intramuros, Fort Santiago, Manila Cathedral, and the San Agustin Church.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 295 yards (about 270 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the Bamboo Organ Church. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Avoid bringing valuables (such as jewellery or large amounts of cash) on this tour. The driving distance between the pier and Tagaytay is approximately 1.5 hours in each direction. The tour sequence and duration may vary due to local traffic conditions.

MNL-I / MANILA ARTS AND CULTURE

DIFFICULTY

Explore the evolution of the arts, culture and traditional lifestyles of the Philippines throughout history during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Manila, National Museum

Depart the pier for the short drive to the National Museum. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of this government agency museum, which includes research and conservation programs within the museum, and throughout the archipelago. The museum shares the mission and vision of a Filipino nation unified by a deep sense of pride in their common identity, cultural heritage and natural patrimony, and imbibed with the spirit of nationalism, and a strong commitment to the protection and dissemination of Filipino legacy.

National Museum of Natural History

The National Museum of Natural History tells the story of the Philippines' mega biodiversity and unique geological formation. It is also the first museum in the Philippines dedicated to natural history. During your guided walking tour, see a replica of Lolong, the longest crocodile ever held

in captivity, a hall meant to show how scientists preserve specimens, and a huge, DNA helix-shaped elevator called the 'Tree of Life'. The museum has six floors, but only three floors are open to date.

Ho Chi Minh, Pho Noodle Shop, Vietnamese-Style Breakfast

Most Vietnamese usually begin their new day with a breakfast of noodle soup or 'bánh mì', a type of sandwich that consists of a Vietnamese baguette that is split lengthwise and filled with various savoury ingredients, along with a cup of coffee. Apartment Café, Sitting-Plump Café, Notre Dame Cathedral, Post Office, Reunification Palace

This old apartment was formerly frequented by naval officers during the post-war period after Reunification Day in 1975, and features several little coffee shops within it. The cafe is somehow able to keep a traditional Saigonease feel to it, even though it sits in the centre of an otherwise modern part of town. After visiting the different coffee shops inside the Apartment Café, re-board your coach and drive to *Café B t*, the 'Sitting-Plump Café'. In the central park near the Notre-Dame Cathedral, Central Post Office and Reunification Palace, students, workers and even foreigners can be found with a plastic cup of this cafe's coffee in-hand. This area also offers wonderful views of some of the city's most attractive highlights.

Racquet Café, Saigon Retro Concept Café

Next, re-board your coach and drive to Café V t, the 'Racquet Café'. Museum of Ho Chi Minh City

Depart the pier for the short drive to the centre of Ho Chi Minh City. Once called the 'Pearl of the Orient', Ho Chi Minh City is today a bustling metropolitan hub with a sea of motorbikes. Your tour begins with a visit to a Museum of Ho Chi Minh City which was the 1st Presidential Palace in the South of Vietnam before the Unification Palace. It has been a museum since 1999, beside the two main rooms about American, French War in Vietnam, it has a room showing the timeline about Ho Chi Minh City, and how does it developed until now. You also has a chance to discover a secret air raid shelter that located under this building.

Reunification Hall

Your next stop will be visit to the Reunification Hall which is former Presidential Palace of the South Vietnamese regime. The Saigon regime collapsed on April 30, 1975, when a North Vietnamese Army (NVA) tank crashed down the front gate of the palace. Perhaps the most interesting of all is the bunker area inside the Palace which is former telecommunication center and war room of the South army. It is really worth your visit.

War Museum

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to the War Museum. During your guided visit, explore war relics and detailed exhibits, at times shocking, about the American war in Vietnam. The museum comprises a series of themed rooms in several areas, with period military equipment placed within a walled yard. This museum is currently the most popular museum in Ho Chi Minh City, it has welcomed half of million visitors each day.

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board you coach for 20minutes drive back to the ship

Ho Chi Minh, Pho Noodle Shop, Vietnamese-Style Breakfast

Depart the pier for the short drive to your first stop, *Pho*, a local noodle shop. Most Vietnamese usually begin their new day with a breakfast of noodle soup or 'bánh mì', a type of sandwich that consists of a Vietnamese baguette that is split lengthwise and filled with various savoury ingredients, along with a cup of coffee. Coffee here is not just a drink, but a social aspect of life. Morning, noon and/or night, coffee is for people of all ages and classes, and a part of Saigon's history is brewed into every cup of coffee made here.

Following your Vietnamese-style breakfast, re-board your coach and head to *Café Chung C*, also known as the '*Apartment Café*'.

Apartment Café, Sitting-Plump Café, Notre Dame Cathedral, Post Office, Reunification Palace

This old apartment was formerly frequented by naval officers during the post-war period after Reunification Day in 1975, and features several little coffee shops within it. The cafe is somehow able to keep a traditional Saigoneese feel to it, even though it sits in the centre of an otherwise modern part of town. After visiting the different coffee shops inside the Apartment Café, re-board your coach and drive to *Café B*, the '*Sitting-Plump Café*'. In the central park near the Notre-Dame Cathedral, Central Post Office and Reunification Palace, students, workers and even foreigners can be found with a plastic cup of this cafe's coffee in-hand. This area also offers wonderful views of some of the city's most attractive highlights.

Racquet Café, Saigon Retro Concept Café

Next, re-board your coach and drive to *Café V*, the '*Racquet Café*'. BKK-A / GRAND PALACE & SCENIC OLD BANGKOK

Explore the Imperial treasures of Bangkok, the Grand Palace and its Emerald Buddha, on this half-day orientation tour. A sightseeing drive through the old city completes your outing.

Following a 45-minute coach trip from the Port of Bangkok through the bustling streets of the city centre, arrive at Bangkok's greatest treasure, the Grand Palace. During a 1.5-hour guided walking tour, visit or view some of its most important highlights:

Royal Palace Grounds

These vast grounds encompass over 100 buildings, representing 200 years of history and architectural experimentation. Most of the architecture, royal or sacred, can be classified as old Bangkok style. Extensive murals line the inside walls of the compound. The temple structures are colourful, comprising gilded stupas, polished orange and green tiled roofs, mosaic-encrusted pillars, and rich marble pediments.

Grand Palace

The main building is the Grand Palace, one of the most beautiful examples of an ancient Siam Court. Built in 1782 by King Rama I at the beginning of the Chakkri Dynasty, the palace was at one time the residence of the Kings of Thailand. Today, royal ceremonies and state events take place here. Visit the audience hall and marvel at its splendid interior.

Wat Phra Kaew

Known also as the 'Temple of the Emerald Buddha', Wat Phra Kaew adjoins the Grand Palace and houses the revered image of the 23- inch-high (58-cm-high) Emerald Buddha. The jade statue is enshrined in a glass case, sitting on a pedestal high above the worshippers. This mystical figure and its legendary spiritual power draw pilgrims from all over.

At the end of your visit, re-join the coach for a sightseeing drive through Old Bangkok.

Sights of Old Bangkok

Enjoy viewing major highlights from your coach as it passes the City Pillar Shrine, Chitraladahotarn Palace (official residence of King Bhumibol and Queen Sirikit), the Democracy Monument (built in commemoration of the change of government from absolute monarchy to democracy with the king as head of state), and the City Pavilion, primarily used today for royal ceremonies and official events.

Ananta Samakom Throne Hall

Stop for exterior photos of the majestic Ananta Samakom Throne Hall, the ornate grey-marble Italian renaissance-style building, built by King Chulalongkorn in 1907 to receive guests and foreign dignitaries. Currently, the Royal Throne Hall it is only used for the ceremonial opening of the first session of Parliament, royal receptions, and private functions. Following your tour, time permitting, a brief stop will be made at a local store that offers a range of vibrant Thai silks, local souvenirs and superb jewellery before being transferred back to the ship.

BKK-C / BANGKOK TEMPLES WITH TUK TUK RIDE

Visit three of the most impressive temples in Bangkok: Wat Po, known as the 'Temple of the Reclining Buddha', Wat Trimit home of the 5.5 tons solid Gold Buddha image, and Wat Benchamabophit, the 'Marble Temple'. A short Tuk Tuk ride compliments your half-day outing.

Wat Trimit

As 95% of Thailand's population is Buddhist, there are around 400 wats (temples) in Bangkok. Begin your outing with a 30-minute drive from the pier to Wat Trimit, formerly called "Wat Samjeantai. This temple was built by three Chinese comrades around 150 years ago. It was restored in 1937 and granted the new name of Wat Trimitwithayaram. The main attraction in the temple is the incredible Golden Buddha Temple. Weighing in at five and a half tons, and standing over 10 feet high, this massive statue dates back to the 700 year-old Sukhothai period.

Tuk Tuk Ride

Next, board a Tuk Tuk for a sightseeing ride to Wat Po. Tuk Tuks are three-wheeled, motorised taxis or 'auto rickshaws', named after the noise they make. Covered, with room for two, these quaint scooters are nimble at navigating the congested city streets.

Wat Po

Arrive at the 'Temple of the Reclining Buddha', or Wat Pho, one of the largest and oldest wats in Bangkok. Home to more than one thousand Buddha images, it is named after the largest single Buddha image, that of a reclining Buddha, 150 feet (46 metres) long and 50 feet (15 metres) high. It is decorated with gold plating on the body and mother of pearl on the eyes and the soles of his feet.

Wat Benchamabophit

Re-board your coach and proceed to visit is to Wat Benchamabophit, the 'Marble Temple', built of Italian marble with unique European ecclesiastic details.

Complemented by stained-glass windows housing a Sukhothai-style Buddha statue, a superb cloister-collection of bronze Buddha images are housed here.

This full-day excursion offers a visit to one of Thailand's most majestic historical sites, included on UNESCO's World Heritage list since 1991. Begin your outing with a 90-minute drive north to Ayutthaya, considered one of Thailand's major attractions. Then, enjoy visiting the following highlights:

Bang Pa-In Summer Palace

En route to Ayutthaya wall, make a visit at the Bang Pa-In Summer Palace. The palace comprises a collection of buildings of various ages and various architectural styles surrounded by a lake. Built in the 17th century and left unoccupied when Bangkok became the capital, the palace gained importance again in 1851 when King Mongkut restored it and resumed residence there. Enjoy a visit and marvel at the richly decorated turn-of-the-century European aristocratic style, interspersed with whimsical Thai touches.

Ayutthaya Historical Park

Continue drive to the ruined city of Ayutthaya was once the ancient capital of Siam for four centuries and in its heyday was said to be more beautiful than either London or Paris. Located on a 2.5-mile (four kilometre) island at the confluence of three rivers, Ayutthaya was once encircled by a seven-mile (11-kilometre) wall. After the destruction of the city by the Burmese in 1767, a new dynasty was established and the capital was moved to Thonburi. Today, much of the ancient fabled city is contained within a Historical Park, where archaeological studies are still carried out.

While many of the buildings are in ruins, those drawn to relics of the past still find a visit to the remaining temple compounds and numerous structures awe-inspiring and a memorable experience. Begin the historical park tour with a noteworthy visit at the spectacular **Wat Chai Wattanaram**, reminiscent of Angkor Wat in Cambodia.

Take a break from sightseeing and enjoy lunch at the *Krungsri River Hotel* (or similar).

Wat Na Phra Meru

Another good example of typical Ayutthaya-style temple, it was not destroyed by the Burmese. Constructed during the late 14th- and early 15th-centuries, the name suggests it was a royal cremation site. Of special note are the Buddha images - one fully decorated in regal attire and the other of black stone.

Following your visit, re-join your coach for the trip back to Bangkok and the ship.

Indulge your senses as you explore Jim Thompson's Thai house with its renowned silks before enjoying a Thai cooking demonstration on this half-day tour.

Depart the ship by mini-van for the 30-minute drive to Jim Thompson's world famous Thai house. Built in old Thai style, this rambling house was the work of the legendary American adventurer, Jim Thompson, who came to Thailand at the end of World War II and revitalised the Thai silk industry. His disappearance into the Malaysian jungle still remains a mystery today. The house, now a museum, displays Mr. Thompson's extensive collection of Thai paintings, pottery, Benjarong porcelain, and exquisite furniture. One part of the complex includes show rooms and a store where bolts of beautiful silk fabric and finished items are on display.

Re-board your mini-van and drive to the Bussaracum Restaurant (or similar), Thailand's first restaurant to specialise in royal household dishes, which are known for their distinctive ingredients, decorations and flavours. It is a spacious renovated home compound surrounded by the

gardens where many of the herbs and spices used by the restaurant's skilled kitchen staff are grown. Here you are invited to practise on a cooking demonstration, followed by a sampling of Thai refreshments.

Afterwards, your mini-van returns you to the ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, approximately 1,300 feet (425 metres), with about 30 steps to climb. This tour is not wheelchair accessible. Transportation is via mini-vans as the road to Jim Thompson's House is too narrow for coaches. Shoes must be taken off before entering the Thai Houses at Jim Thompson's House; wear slip-on shoes and bring socks for comfort. There is limited space on this tour; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

Discover some of Bangkok's most renowned and historic landmarks during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Bangkok, Suan Pakkad Palace Museum and Traditional Thai Houses

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive into the heart of Bangkok City. Upon arrival, your first stop is at the Suan Pakkad Palace Museum. During your guided walking tour, see the well-tended tropical garden with serene ponds surrounding eight traditional Thai houses owned by Prince and Princess Chumbhot. Some of the houses belonged to the prince's family, and all are more than a century old.

Ancestral Artefacts and Lacquer Pavilion

Most of the art objects on display in the houses belonged to Prince Chumbhot's ancestor, and depict the daily life of royalty. Included are food containers decorated with mother-of-pearl and silver, betel nut boxes, clothing and ecclesiastical fans. Other noteworthy artefacts include archaeological finds from Ban Chiang, rocks and mineral collections, shells, Benjarong pottery, and other Thai ceramics. The significant house is the 17th-century Lacquer Pavilion, which was originally located at a temple near Ayutthaya. Now fully-restored, it's an exquisite example of Thai architecture, with richly-carved gilded wood walls and an interior filled with lively Ramayana and Buddha mural paintings drawn in gold on black lacquer.

Wat Ratchanadda, Loha Prasart and Gold Buddha

Next, re-board your coach and drive towards Bangkok's Old City. En route, a visit is made to Wat Ratchanadda, a royal temple best known for the Loha Prasart, or 'Metal Castle', which was built in 1846 at the request of King Rama III, and inspired by two other similar temples found in India and Sri Lanka. Loha Prasart is an approximately 118-foot-high (about 36-metre-high) structure supporting 37 metal spires, which represent the 37 virtues toward enlightenment. The main chapel of the temple also houses a beautiful golden seated Buddha image, along with murals, paintings and door carvings. Afterward, re-board your coach and proceed for a brief shopping and comfort stop at a local store (time permitting). At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and comment the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, at times over uneven surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 60 steps to negotiate at the sites visited (30 steps at each stop). . This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended.
