Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Phuket - Thailand

HKT-A / PANORAMIC PHUKET

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$59; Duration: 4.00 hrs

Explore the splendid natural beauty, landmarks and history of Phuket during a half-day sightseeing tour of this colorful island.

Phuket Orientation

Depart the pier for a scenic, approximately 30 -minute sightseeing drive through Phuket Town. Learn about the island and its colorful history from your guide as you pass by lush vegetation, villages, century-old Sino-Portuguese mansions, Provincial Hall, the local fresh market, the Tin Dregder monument, and the Chinese Shrine.

Next, your drive continues north of Phuket Town. Pass by the Karon Beach and Patong Beach.

Chalong Temple and Shopping

A brief visit is made to the Chalong Temple, Phuket's largest and most sacred Buddhist temple. Inside, see its renowned shrine, which has long been revered for its moulded bronze images of three respected monks. Afterwards, a comfort and refreshment stop is made at a local handicraft centre, where you may also browse for local souvenirs, clothing, and a wide array of Thai arts and crafts.

Your tour concludes with a 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking (in total approx 200 meters which is 218 yards), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 5 steps entering in the Temple. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilize a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and sun protection are recommended. Proper attire is required to enter the Chalong Temple; shorts and bare shoulders are not permitted. Shoes must be removed before entering the Chalong Temple; you may wish to bring socks.

HKT-B / PHUKET HIGHLIGHTS

Discover the picturesque and historic landmarks of Phuket during this half-day sightseeing tour of the island.

Giant Buddha Image

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to the Giant Buddha Image, a new local landmark located atop Narkerd Mountain. The Giant Buddha Image measures approximately 148 feet (about 45 metres) in height, and is approximately 82 feet (about 25 metres) across its base.

Seang Tham Chinese Shrine & Phuket Town

Next, visit the Seang Tham Chinese Shrine. One of the oldest Chinese shrines in Phuket City it was built for the Chinese migrants who moved to Phuket to work as tin labourers. Although not as large as other shrines, Seang Tham is unique in its structure and wall paintings. Your tour continues with a sightseeing drive through Phuket Town. Along the way, pass by Provincial Hall, the local fresh market, the Tin Dredger monument and the Chinese Shrine.

Phuket's Old Town & Shopping

From here, proceed to Phuket's Old Town. Upon arrival, take a guided stroll along Talang Road, see the century-old Sino-Portuguese mansions and stop for refreshments at a local coffee shop. Following your visit, commence the drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of walking for approximately 875 yards, (about 800 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, and 78 steps at the Big Buddha Image. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Modest attire is required to enter the temple; shorts and bare shoulders are not permitted, and shoes must be removed before entering. Bring a pair of socks for comfort. Local currency or credit card required for any purchases.

HKT-D / GOLF AT RED MOUNTAIN GOLF CLUB

Enjoy a day of golf at the Red Mountain Golf Club located just a 30-minute drive from Phuket.

The course is a standard par 72 covering just under 7000 yards (6400 metres) in total, making it a challenging but enjoyable course for players of all levels. There are natural waste bunkers, towering precipices, deep ravines and flooded gullies, all seamlessly integrated and challenging even

to the most experienced players. And as you weave your way through the dramatic changes in elevation, you are rewarded with panoramic views over Phuket before heading back down another gully lined with tropical forest.

Please note: Programme involves moderate to extensive activity and includes green fees, roundtrip transportation and cart. Club rental is USD 50.00 per standard set. All prices quoted in USD and are subject to change without notice. Optional rentals and purchases are not a part of the programme and are to be paid directly to the pro shop. Golf attire is mandatory; no jeans, tee-shirts or tank tops permitted. Golfers must wear soft-spiked golf shoes. HKT-E / COOK THAI STYLE AT BLUE ELEPHANT

Thai dishes are designed to balance all of the body elements and feed them on all levels with satisfying tastes and aromas that are visually appealing, withcolorful textures. Herbs and spices are the main ingredients in Thai cuisine. This class is recommended as a great introduction to the art and science to enhance an easy understanding to Thai Cuisine.

Blue Elephant Restaurant

Depart from ship via van for an approximately half hour scenic journey to the Blue Elephant Restaurant in Phuket Town. A welcome drink is served to refresh you before going to the fresh market. After a visit to the fresh market, you will be back to the Blue Elephant for a Thai Cooking Class which will be consist of 4 different dishes, they are a starter, a soup, a main dish and an accompany dish. All of your cooking dishes will be served as your lunch. After lunch, you will be back taken back to the ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking approximately 15 steps up and down to the second floor of the Fresh Market. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests under the age of 15 are not permitted to participate in this tour. Local currency or credit card required for any purchases.

HKT-F / PHANG NGA BAY BY SPEEDBOAT

DIFFICULTY

Discover one of the most picturesque and beautiful seascapes in Thailand during this memorable, half-day speedboat excursion to Phang.

Phang Nga Bay National Park

Depart the pier for the brief transfer to the speedboat jetty. After receiving your safety and boating instructions, embark the speedboat for an unforgettable one hour cruise to Phang Nga Bay National Park. En route, pass by a breath-taking seascape of limestone stacks, and marvel at how the dramatic colouring of ochre and amber hues contrasts vividly with the marvellous blue of the water. The seascape of the bay is nothing short of magical, and its awesome scenery is well worth the trip.

Khao Ping Kan Island

Whilst exploring this wondrous region, visit some of its most distinct landmarks. Your first stop is at Khao Ping Kan Island. Popularly known as James Bond Island, it was here where the filming of the last scene of *The Man with the Golden Gun* took place. Following some free time at your leisure on the island, your cruise continues on to Koh Panyi.

Koh Panyi & Scenic Cruise

This water village is comprised of more than 200 houses built on stilts, with attached wooden walkways. Its residents originally migrated from Indonesia over 200 years ago. After a brief stop here, embark the speedboat for the return ride to the jetty. Along the way cruise past mangrove swamps, Hong and Panak islands, and the grotto cave. Tide permitting, a brief visit is made inside the cave.

Upon arrival at the speedboat jetty, transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of travelling by speedboat and approximately 547 yards (500 metres) of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, embark/disembark the speedboat,30 steps at James Bond Island and 20 wooden steps at Panyi Village. Guests should be physically fit and prepared for a fast ride that may be bumpy at times. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to seasickness, those with back and/or neck problems, limited mobility, or those who utilise a wheelchair. Wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with beach or boat shoes that can get wet, and bring a towel and sun protection from the ship. Guests must be at least four years old to participate on this tour. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. The tour sequence may vary.

HKT-G / PHANG NGA BAY & RANG YAI ISLAND BY SPEEDBOAT

Experience the scenic splendour of Phang Nga Bay and its nearby islands during this panoramic, full-day sightseeing excursion via speedboat. Phuket, Phang Nga Bay National Park

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to a local jetty. Upon arrival, embark a speedboat for the panoramic, approximately one-hour boat-ride to the exquisite Phang Nga Bay National Park. As you plie the calm waters, experience views not seen on bigger boat tours. The geological features of the bay are an incredible site, formed by fault movements that pushed the massive limestone blocks up from the bottom of the sea. The result is over 40 islands of towering karst that create this unique and breath-taking scenery. Sheer cliffs, overhangs and caves typify the topography, and after millions of years, they are covered in verdant vegetation.

James Bond Island, Panyi Village, and Hong and Panak Islands

Next, a stop is made at James Bond Island, where the famous James Bond movie, *The Man with the Golden Gun*, was partially-filmed. Some free time is made available during your visit to browse for souvenirs. Afterward, continue past a mangrove swamp and grotto cave before riding south of the park, and past the wonderful rock formations of Hong, Panak and other islands. A highlight of your picturesque cruise is a visit to Panyi Village, where more than 200 houses are built on the stilts and wooden sidewalks provide a walkway between the humble residences. Some time is also made available here to browse for mementoes of your visit.

Rang Yai Island and Phuket

Your last stop is at Rang Yai Island, with its splendid beach and inviting, crystal-clear water. During your visit, you can relax and enjoy swimming and sunbathing, and relax with snacks and drinks. At the conclusion of your visit, embark your speedboat for the short ride back to Phuket. Upon arrival, disembark the speedboat, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 875 yards (about 800 metres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, with five steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, a few steps to embark/disembark the speedboat, 30 steps at James Bond Island and 20 wooden steps at Panyi Village. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with neck and/or back problems, guests prone to seasickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with beach shoes, and bring sun protection and a towel from the ship. Guests must be at least four years old to participate on this tour. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. The tour sequence may vary.

Shopping

Next, browse Rich Home Décor - an astonishing souvenir shop filled with traditional Thai products, original artwork furniture, striking souvenirs, clothes and a whole lot more.

Traditional Thai Cultural Show

Afterward, re-board your coach and head for a traditional Thai cultural show. This lively, approximately 50-minute show features dancing, exotic music, Thai boxing and martial arts. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive through Phuket Town en route to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 383 yards (about 350 metres), with five steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the entrance to the Chalong Temple, and up to 20 steps to access the Thai dancing venue. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilize a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended; guests must remove shoes before entering the Chalong Templeyou may wish to bring socks. For a more complete visit of fascinating Yangon, you may want to consider taking this full-day tour that includes lunch at the legendary Strand Hotel.

Begin your tour with the one-hour drive from the port into the city, where the tour shows you some of the major attractions:

Shwedagon Pagoda

The 2,500-year-old Shwedagon dominates the city from its hillside location and attracts tens of thousands of pilgrims each year. This amazing site exudes a unique atmosphere, both serene and exciting. Rising 300 feet (91 metres)to its blazing crest, this spiritual center is covered with 60 tons (54431 kg) of gold leaf, gold and silver bells, rubies, sapphires and topaz. The meticulously maintained pagoda was built to house eight sacred hairs of the Buddha.

Follow your guide up the escalator to the temple on to up level. During a walking tour of approximately one hour you will learn about the history and significance of this impressive complex.

Chaukhtat Gyi Pagoda

See the enormous statue of a reclining Buddha almost as large as the one in Bago. The image is housed in a large metal-roofed shed a short distance from the Shwedagon Pagoda. It is not as famous as the Bago statue, but for those not going to Bago, the colossal Chaukhtatgyi should not be missed.

Maha Bandoola Park

Now admire a monument of a different kind with a visit to Maha Bandoola Park. In the center of the park stands the 150-foot (45 metres) Independence Monument. Honoring a Burmese general of the first Anglo-Burmese War, the obelisk is surrounded by five pillars, representing the harmony of Burma with its five former semi-autonomous states.

Lunch at the Strand

Enjoy a set menu of excellent Myanmar cuisine, for which the Strand is renowned in the city. The hotel was constructed by the Sarkies brothers of Raffles and Oriental fame in 1896 and became one of the fabulous outposts in the British empire. During World War II, the hotel was closed and later nationalized. In the 1990s, an extensive renovation project by a Dutch-Indonesian consortium restored the grand dame to her original splendor and spirit. Lunch at the Strand will be among the highlights of your tour.

National Museum

After lunch, proceed to the nearby National Museum, housed in the former Bank of India building. Many exhibits feature memorabilia of the last two kings of Burma. Some of the items are richly decorated with rubies, diamonds and other precious stones. The pride of the museum is the 24-

foot-tall (7 metres) gilded Lion Throne from the royal palace at Mandalay. The museum also contains a collection of statues, carvings, Buddha images, paintings, costumes and crafts.

Bogyoke Market

Sometimes called by its British name, Scott Market, the 70-year-old market has the largest selection of Burmese handicrafts found under one roof. Time is allowed for browsing in this fascinating market.

Please note: This tour involves a total extensive amount of walking and some stairs to negotiate. It is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or those utilizing a wheelchair. Local custom requires moderate dress and that temples have to be entered barefoot. Footwear must be removed before entering in any place of worship. Order of tours may vary. Arrive at The Strand Yangon, originally opened in 1901 and considered the only luxury hotel in Rangoon, Burma. With interiors of polished teak, rattan furniture, chandeliers and black-lacquered ceiling fans, The Strand is truly the elegant colonial splendor of a bygone era.

A traditional Myanmar High Tea is served in this colonial wonder, relaxing with Sip tea and savour local treats. Your tour concludes with the drive to your awaiting ship.

The city was established in 1369 by King Byinnya and experienced its Golden Age between 1385 and 1635. When the Pegu River changed its course, the city was cut off from the sea and gradually lost its importance. The Mon Kingdom was powerful in Myanmar from the 9th to the 11th and from the 13th to the 16th century and for a brief period in the mid-18th century.

During your two-hour and a half drive to Bago, the coach stops to allow you to stretch your legs and take in some noted sights.

Local Market

About one hour from Yangon, a stop will be made at morning local Market for a glimpse at local life and activities before another one-hour drive brings you to Bago.

Continue your journey and arrive in Bago. The following sites are pointed out or explored with your guide

World War II Cemetery

Htaukkyant World War II Cemetery, also called the British War Cemetery, is one of the biggest cemeteries in Myanmar. Located in the town of Bago, it has the graves of some 27,000 Allied troops killed in the World War II campaign in Burma.

In the Htaukkyant World War II Cemetery is Today the Imperial War Graves Commission maintains the grounds. The neatness of the manicured grass and well-planted flowering shrubs seems to set the cemetery apart from the rest of Myanmar. It is a place for contemplation, to discover silence and solitude.

Venture into southern Myanmar to explore the once capital of the Mon Kingdom, Pegu, now Bago, on this full-day excursion, with lunch of local

Kyakhatwine Monastery

Next, a special visit to the Kyakhatwine Monastery has been arranged on your behalf. This is southern Myanmar's largest abbey and is a sight to behold. Here, you are invited to observe the resident monks partake of their final meal of the day in total silence.

Shwemawdaw Pagoda

The pagoda is one of the most venerated and impressive monuments in Southeast Asia, with origins dating back a thousand years. Severely damaged by earthquakes, the structure was rebuilt between 1952 and 1954 to its original glory. A soaring golden dome makes it the highest pagoda in Myanmar and one of its main attractions.

Take a break from sightseeing and enjoy Asian cuisine at a Local Restaurant.

Local Village

A cheroot, once described as a "Burmese facial feature", is almost ubiquitous in this country. Even now that smoking is less popular in many parts of the world, the Myanmar don't seem to worry too much about that. Wheter the foot-long "whackin" white cheroots' that Kipling enthusiastically mentioned, or the short green, regular varities, they are everywhere - stacked in piles on the market, they are brought in big green bundles or singly, to be enjoyed one at a time

Shwethalyaung Buddha

After lunch, continue your sightseeing program with a visit to Bago's most famous site - the huge reclining Buddha. At 165 feet (50 metres) long and 48 feet (14.6 metres) high, it is reputed to be the largest as well as the most lifelike of all reclining Buddhas. Originally built in 994 AD, it deteriorated and was lost in a jungle overgrowth. Only in the 1880s British era were the remains rediscovered during the construction of the railway line. Restoration began in 1881 and today a sturdy iron shed houses the colossal image. The walkway up to the viewing platform is crowded with souvenir and handicraft stalls.

Kyaik Pun Pagoda

Standing on Bago's outskirts is this 15th-century structure with huge Buddha images on each one of the four pagoda sides. A short walk from the coach allows for a closer look and a better photo opportunity.

At the end of the visit of the Pagoda, you will turn back to the bus and start your two-hour and a half drive back to Yangon.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of walking and some stairs to negotiate. It is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or those utilising a wheelchair. Myanmar Traditional Kitchen

All this is done while pounding chili, crushing onion, and deboning and filleting fish.

Cooking Demonstration

Re-board the coach for a 60-minute drive that brings you to an open kitchen set in a lovely garden, the site of the cooking demonstration. Here, a Myanmar executive chef explains about the various food items that were selected from the market and are prepared as part of your lunch menu. Then, if you wish, try your hand at cooking some of the dishes or just watch as the chef prepares lunch.

Afterwards, relax and enjoy this specially-prepared meal. Curries, coconut and peas are just some of the featured items in your multi-dish lunch sampler. Soft drinks, green tea or a bottle of beer are offered to help quench your thirst.

Your tour concludes with a 30-minute return drive to the pier.

Ruins of some of the once glorious structures may be seen, while others have been preserved for your enjoyment.

Bon Pyam and Thanlyin Morning Market

Your first stop is at one of the Monastery. During your visit, learn about the daily life of Buddhist monks. Afterward, proceed to the Thanlyin Morning Market. As you stroll through the vendors' shops and stalls, the fresh fragrances of fruits and flowers fills the air.

Trishaw Ride and Small Village Visit

Next, board a trishaw and head to a small village. Here, some free time is made to stroll the village's shaded streets, chat with friendly residents and observe the local village life. The Minister's Building Secretariat office

Fully completed in 1905, The Secretariat was the centre of British colonial administration in Burma, and was the pre-eminent structure associated with the government during this period. The building was also the place where Myanmar's first steps towards independence happened. The diarchy (Legislative Council) was established at The Secretariat in 1923, giving Burma a limited measure of self-rule. It was the location where Burma formally separated from India in 1937, and where the largest anti-colonial student demonstration at the time occurred in 1938.

After the Second World War, independence negotiations began, and by 1947 an agreement had been reached with the then independence leader, General Aung San. On 19 July 1947, however, Aung San and eight other cabinet members were assassinated in the west range of The Secretariat, a murder that has since been commemorated every year on 'Martyrs' Day'. Independence from Britain was finally marked in the quadrangle of The Secretariat complex's main courtyard in 1948, a key event in Burmese and British history. It continued to be the centre of post-independence governmental administration until the capital was relocated from Yangon to Naypyidaw in 2005.

Generall Aung San Museum

The museum formally opened in March 2012 and focuses on the General's short adult life. The majority of the displays are located on the ground floor in the family, dining and living rooms. See photos of the General's youth, displays of his speeches, family photos and other personal

Board your motorised, eight-seater boat for a cruise along the Sungei Kelim. Stops will be made to visit a fish farm established by the local people, to observe the wild eagles and for a walk through a limestone cave, known for its stalactites, stalagmites and bats.

Rejoin your coach for a relaxing drive back to the Awana Star Cruise Jetty.

Please note: Guests must be able to enter and disembark the local boats, making the tour unsuitable for anyone with physical disabilities. We recommend wearing lightweight clothing and flat, rubber-soled shoes. Remember to bring a hat and sun protection. Boats have canopies for shade and carry life jackets.

Discover Langkawi's scenic attractions and get acquainted with the island's cultural and artistic heritage. From the pier, take a drive to the Oriental Village - a resort-style, duty-free shopping centre. Shortly after leaving the pier, a photo stop will be made at the Telaga Harbour Park marina.

Cable Car Ride

Upon arrival at the Oriental Village, board the bubble-shaped gondola and enjoy a ride up the mountainside on a 42-degree incline. Explore the summit of 2,300-foot (700 metre) Mount Mat Cincang, and marvel at the spectacular views of the Andaman Sea and numerous islands that make up the Langkawi archipelago. Following your descent, proceed to Atma Alam.

Batik Art Village (Atma Alam)

At this village you can observe the traditional art of beautiful fabric designs being created by accomplished artists using wax and dyes.

Laman Padi

Rice is the bread of Asia, and a staple dish at every meal. On your way back to the ship, pause for a visit at this place resembling a delightful park. Visitors cross a bridge over mini-rice fields into a square with a museum and exhibits on display. The Rice Garden Museum is dedicated to the humble grain and its cultivation.

Leaving Laman Padi, head back to Tanjung Malai and the Star Cruise Jetty.

Scenic Drive and Kelim Jetty and River Delta

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to the Kelim Jetty, located at the north-eastern tip of Langkawi Island. En route, pass by Malay kampongs (villages), rice fields, rubber plantations and fruit orchards. Upon arrival at Kelim Jetty, view the river delta that feeds the mangrove swamps' ecological system.

River Safari Cruise and Limestone Cave

Next, embark your kayak and begin a guided kayaking tour through the mangrove forest. Along the way, hear the sounds of the forest's denizens, and marvel at the surrounding flora and fauna. Stops are made for a visit to a local fish farm, and a guided walk through a limestone cave known for its stalactites, stalagmites and bats. Upon returning to the Kelim Jetty, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 40-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of activity and walking for approximately 656 yards (about 600 metres), at times over uneven surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and embark/disembark the boat, 16 steps at the jetty and steps at the limestone cave. Chinatown & Little India

Depart the port for the drive to Chinatown. Next, proceed for a visit to the Mariamman Temple, Singapore's oldest and most colourful Hindu temple, then the neighbourhoods of Little India. After viewing displays of aromatic spices, brightly-coloured saris and other exotic items, your drive continues along Arab Street for an opportunity to photograph the Sultan Mosque.

Trishaw Ride

Ride comfortably through the narrow lanes of Arab Street, passing the resplendent Sultan Mosque. Built in 1928, it is a prominent landmark in this quarter. The duration of your trishaw ride is about 20-30 minutes.

National Gallery

Housed in the former Supreme Court, the UOB Southeast Asia Gallery presents the history of Southeast Asian art through artistic impulses shared across the region. The UOB Southeast Asia Gallery shares a compelling story of human culture, as seen through a region that has been the meeting point of major civilisations, religions, colonial powers, and the focus of struggles towards national independence and modernisation. The Gallery explores four main themes critical to the art of this region: Authority and Anxiety, Imagining Country and Self, Manifesting the Nation and Redefining Art.

Raffles Landing Site

A brief stop is then made at the site where Thomas Stamford Raffles is believed to have first landed in Singapore in 1819. An imposing statue commemorates the site.

Riverboat Ride

A ride along the Singapore River in one of the colourful riverboats makes for a fun-filled experience. In Raffles' days, these vessels were used to transport goods. Today, they are a popular way to experience a kaleidoscope of historic river images, including the 'godown' warehouses and the gracious buildings of the old waterfront set against the skyline of the new business district.

After disembarking your riverboat at picturesque Clarke Quay, your outing concludes with a transfer to the airport.

Please note: This tour is offered to guests who have flights departing after 4:30 pm. It requires a moderate amount of walking with some steps to climb and guests must be able to manoeuvre in and out of the riverboats. Observe and experience the typical Singapore lifestyle - one that is uniquely different from those found in the rest of Asia - on this half-day informative tour.

Board the coach and leave the pier. Your excursion begins with a visit to the Singapore City Gallery for an overview of how urban planning (including conservation, architecture, civil engineering and building) shapes the way its people live, work and play. Get a bird's-eye view of downtown Singapore from a finely detailed architectural model.

Travel to Toa Payoh, a first-generation New Town built in the late 1960s to solve the acute shortage of proper housing in Singapore. Walk through the Housing Development Board (HDB) Gallery to view a typical layout of the various towns, along with models of the various types of flats in which Singaporeans live. Today, 87% of the population lives in a HDB flat.

Continue on with a stroll through the town centre, where you can mingle with the local people and indulge in a bit of neighbourhood shopping in the many shops selling all sorts of merchandise. View the many communal facilities that make the town self-contained, including a bus interchange' sub-way station, schools, clinics, community centres, parks, a sport stadium, an indoor sports hall, and a swimming pool complex. See the many places of worship existing in close proximity to one another.

Next, take the local bus drive to Bishan, a second generation New Town, designed and built in early 1990's to accommodate the lifestyle of a more affluent and wealthier population.

There are many obvious contrasts between the first- and second-generation New Towns. The later blocks of second-generation flats are of a more contemporary design, and nearly twice the height of the first-generation flats. The town centre is occupied by a large shopping mall that caters to the shopping and entertainment needs of the whole community. Many of the communal facilities are located near to the shopping mall.

Your final stop is to Singapore latest downtown Icon - The Marina Barrage. Built across the mouth of the Marina Channel, the Marina Barrage creates Singapore's 15th reservoir, and the first in the heart of the city. With a catchment area of 24,700 acres (10,000 hectares), or one-sixth the size of Singapore, the Marina catchment is the island's largest and most urbanised catchment. Together with two other new reservoirs, the Marina Reservoir will boost Singapore's water catchment from half to two-thirds of the country's land area.

A 10-minute drive returns you to the pier.
