#### ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our quests.

#### **BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES**

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

#### ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

#### ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

#### SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

#### **ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES**

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. #### ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore- side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

#### PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

#### SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

#### CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

### Cartagena - Colombia

#### CTG-A / COLOMBIAN COFFEE EXPERIENCE

**DIFFICULTY**

#### San Felipe Fortress

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Old City. Your first stop is at the scenic San Felipe Fortress. Strategically-located on the Hill of San Lázaro, The fortress, originally known as the 'Castillo de San Lázaro', dominates the approach to the city by land or sea. Construction on the fortress began in 1536, and it was expanded in 1657. From here, re-board your coach for a sightseeing drive through the Old City, then head the a colonial house which hosts the San Alberto coffee shop.

#### Coffee Baptismand Cartagena City

Upon arrival, see and learn about the house's colonial architecture and restoration and then participate in a Coffee Baptism, a ritual for awakening the senses through coffee appreciation. Afterward, step onto the colonial patio for an opportunity to purchase some Colombian coffee. After your coffee ritual, enjoy a walking tour around Cartagena's Old City, within its narrow streets and plazas. At the conclusion of the visit, re-board the motor coach and commence a panoramic sightseeing of modern Cartagena and drive back to the ship

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 295 yards (about 270 metres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the sites visited. Walking in the Old City is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests must be at least 14 years old to participate on this tour. The tour sequence may vary.

#### CTG-B / OLD CITY BY HORSE CARRIAGE

Experience the Old World beauty of Cartagena in a unique new way during this scenic and relaxing carriage tour through the city.

#### Photo Stop at San Felipe Fortress

Depart the pier for the brief photo stop at the San Felipe Fortress. Formerly the most important military structure in Latin America, it protected the city of Cartagena during the 17th and 18th centuries. From here, proceed to the Plaza Santa Teresa, where your horse and carriage await your arrival.

#### Horse Drawn Carriage Tour

Take a carriage ride through the narrow cobblestone streets and squares inside the walled city. Along the way, admire flower-filled balconies spilling from Colonial mansions, and pass by old squares and majestic Colonial, Republican and Spanish-style buildings. Sites to be seen include San Juan de Dios Street, San Pedro Street, Custom Plaza, Los Coches Plaza, Bolivar Plaza, the Gold Museum, Inquisition Palace, Santo Domingo Street, Fernandez de Madrid Park, Santisimo Street, Tumbamuertos Street, San Diego Plaza, and Las Bovedas Street.

A small amount of free time and opportunity for shopping is made available at Las Bovedas Artisan Center before transferring back to the ship

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and carriage. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and sun protection are recommended.

#### CTG-C / EXPLORING HISTORIC CARTAGENA

Explore the Colonial heritage, architecture and landmarks of Cartagena during a half-day sightseeing tour of this picturesque city.

#### Photo Stop at San Felipe Fortress

Depart the pier for the brief photo stop at the San Felipe Fortress. Formerly the most important military structure in Latin America, it protected the city of Cartagena during the 17th and 18th centuries.

#### Old City Tour and San Pedro Claver Church

Next, enjoy a short drive to the walled Old City. Upon arrival, walk down the ramp from Santiago's Bastion to San Juan de Dios Street and begin your guided walking tour through the Old City. Along the way, admire stately Colonial buildings as you stroll along the narrow streets of the

historic centre. Your first stop is at the 17th-century San Pedro Claver Church. During your visit, discover a plethora of exquisite statues and Old World furnishings honouring the missionary Saint Peter Claver, the patron saint of slaves.

#### Palace of the Inquisition

Next, proceed to Customs Square, site of a statue of Columbus and the Palacio Municipal. Continue on to Bolivar Square, bordered by the Palace of the Inquisition to one side and a statue of Simon Bolivar in the centre. Take a guided tour of the Palace of the Inquisition, one of the most noteworthy buildings in the Old City. With its overhanging balconies, cloisters and patios, the palace is a fine example of Colonial Baroque architecture. It now houses a museum and the office of the Historical Archive.

#### Naval Museum and Santo Domingo Square

Pass by Proclamation Square and see Cartagena's Cathedral. Proceed to the Naval Museum and visit the permanent exhibitions relating to the Military Naval History of Cartagena de Indias, Universal Navigation, the Colombian Navy, including current times. Then make your way to Santo domingo Square for a panoramic view of Santo Domingo's Church, built by Saint Dominic Priests in the late 16th century, to preserve the Catholic faith among the local natives whom they protected. At the end of your guided tour, some free time will be available at Cartagena's Old City.

#### Bocagrande and Manga

Reboard the bus and head for a scenic tour of the modern Bocagrande, which is surrounded by the Caribbean Sea on one side and the Bay of Cartagena on the other. Also drive through the residential area of Manga, home to the beautiful late 19th and early 20th century mansions before returning to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking for approximately 0.5 miles (about 0.8 kilometres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the Inquisition Palace, and extended period of walking and standing at the Old City. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection from the ship.

#### CTG-D / CARTAGENA CITY SIGHTS

Experience the Old World splendor of Cartagena during a scenic, half-day sightseeing excursion through this historic city.

#### San Felipe Fortress

Depart the pier for a short drive to the Old City. The first stop is at the scenic San Felipe Fortress. Strategically-located on the Hill of San Lazaro, this fortress originally known as Castillo de San Lazaro, dominated the approach to the city by land and sea. Construction of the fortress began in 1536 and it was expanded in 1657. After a visit of the Fortress, re-board the motor coach for a brief sightseeing drive through the Old City.

#### Old City Walking Tour, Caribbean Naval Museum and San Pedro Claver Church

Upon arrival to the walled city, walk down the ramp from Santiago's Bastion to San Juan de Dios Street and start your guided tour through the Old City. Along the way, admire stately Colonial buildings as you stroll along the narrow streets of this historic center. Stop for a visit to the Caribbean Naval Museum and learn about the Caribbean Natives' culture and trade routes. After enjoying a Folkloric Show, continue your walk around San Pedro Square and visit the 17th Century San Pedro Claver Church. Discover the plethora of exquisite statues and Old World furnishings honoring the missionary Saint Peter Clave, the patron saint of slaves.

#### Inquisition Palace

Next, proceed to Customs Square, site of the statue of Columbus and Palacio Municipal. Continue on to Bolivar Square, bordered by the Inquisition Palace on one side and a statue of Simon bolivar in the center of this square. Take a guided tour of the Inquisition Palace (also known as Historic Museum of Cartagena), one of the most noteworthy buildings of the Old City. With its overhanging balconies, cloisters and patios, this palace is a fine example of Colonial Baroque architecture. It now houses a museum and the office of the Historical Archives. At the end of your guided walking tour, some free time will be available at Cartagena's Old City

#### Bocagrande and Manga

Reboard the bus and head for a scenic tour of the modern Bocagrande, which is surrounded by the Caribbean Sea on one side and the Bay of Cartagena on the other. Also drive through the residential area of Manga, home to the beautiful late 19th and early 20th century mansions before returning to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately one mile (about 1.6 kilometers) over uneven surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and a steep, high ramp at the San Felipe Fortress. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition. This tour is not suitable for guests with heart or respiratory problems, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilize a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a bottle of water from the ship.

#### CTG-F / BIRDS OF COLOMBIA

Discover some of the 1,900 bird species that thrive in Columbia during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion to the National Aviary.

Baru Islands and Colombia's National Aviary

Depart the pier on an air conditioned motor coach for a 40-minute drive to the lovely island of Baru for the visit of Colombia's National Aviary. This lovely enclave is surrounded by beautiful landscape and is the home to more than 1,900 bird species, the most in any country in the world. During the guided walking tour of this amazing venue, explore the different bird observation stations.

#### The Colombian Birds

The Tropical Forest Station features different species of macaws, harpy eagles and tangaras, as well as Macaque Monkeys. The coastline and mangroves host bird species such as ducks, cormorants, pelicans, herons, doves, storks, migrating teals, among others. At the Desert Station, look for cardinals, mockingbirds and partridges. The Andean Station features owls, eagles and the famous Andean Condor, king of the Colombian mountains.

Following your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 40-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of standing and walking for about 2 hours, for a distance of about 900 yards (850 meters) at times over uneven, gravel, and cobblestone surfaces and ramps, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the sites visited. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility and guests who use a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Sights of wildlife other than birds are not guaranteed. Guests must be at least 12 years old to participate on this tour.

#### CTG-G / GETSEMANI AND ROMANTIC RAMPARTS

**DIFFICULTY**

Explore the spectacular beauty and history of Getsemani and Cartagena's Old City during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

#### Getsemani

Depart the pier for the short drive to Getsemani. Surrounded by walls and ramparts, this historic neighbourhood spans approximately 81 acres (about 32.7 hectares) with 22 blocks, five main avenues and three churches, La Trinidad, La Tercera Orden and San Roque. During your guided walking tour along its narrow streets, marvel at the colourful houses and murals, where local artists let their imagination flow.

#### Cartagena's Old City and City Walls

Next, re-board your coach and head to Cartagena's Old City, an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Built at the beginning of the 17th century to defend the city of Cartagena from pirate attacks, this medieval city features approximately 6.8 miles (about 11 kilometres) of walls and is surrounded by 23 bastions. Construction of the walls began after the attack of Sir Francis Drake, who plundered the city in 1536. During your visit, take a guided walking tour along the bastions of Santiago and Francisco, learn about the significance of walls' construction, and hear stories about the walled city and its bastions.

#### Santa Teresa Square and Hotel

Your last stop is at Santa Teresa Square, among the most recognised monuments in Latin America. Upon arrival, marvel at Cartagena's sunset whilst relaxing with snacks, a glass of wine and refreshments at the Santa Teresa Hotel. #### San Luis Park and Hummingbird Garden

#### **Guacalillo Estuary**

Depart the pier for the scenic drive along Costa Rica's Pacific Coast en route to the Guacalillo Estuary, located near Carara National Park. Upon your arrival board your boat and start your mangrove riverboat adventure.

Mangroves are a group of unrelated woody plants that grow in protected tropical coasts and that provide a great habitat for many endemic birds like the cuckoo, hummingbirds, vireo, Panama flycatchers and many herons and egrets. These areas are also home to over 250 species of birds, mammals and insects, with the Tárcoles River's mouth to be considered as one of the richest sites for sea and shorebirds, mainly during their migration period between October and April.

#### **Tarcoles River**

The mouth of the Tárcoles River is considered by birdwatchers to be one of the richest sites for seabirds and shorebirds, especially during their migration from October to April. The osprey, gull, cormorant, pelican, and frigate birds are among the most common species in the delta. You will receive a birding guide which will help you to recognize them.

The river's shores are home to one of the largest crocodile colonies, with some specimens exceeding 9.8 feet (three meters) in length. Although Iguanas, Jesus Christ lizards and birds that include herons, egrets, ducks, spoonbills, and storks are sighted on the majority of these outings, their cooperation cannot be guaranteed. During your tour, learn about the mangrove, the species and wildlife it supports, and the importance of its preservation.

#### At El Jardin Market

On the way back to the ship, stop at El Jardín Market, where you can browse around souvenirs, sample delicious tropical fruit, taste a cup of freshly brewed Costa Rican coffee or an iced cold beer while the beautiful sounds of the marimba music plays.

Upon arrival, marvel at the sheer size and natural beauty of the farm, which comprises approximately 640 acres (about 259 hectares) of prime coffee plantation. During a guided walking tour of the Espiritu Santo Coffee Plantation, discover the growing and production secrets that ensure the delicious taste of Costa Rica coffee.

Guided Tour, Nursery, Processing Plant, Local Home Visit, Brewing Demonstration, Coffee Tasting

Your guided tour begins with a nursery visit, and demonstration of the different stages of the coffee plant during its first year. The coffee is dried under the sun, using centuries-old methods to produce top quality coffee. From here, head to the processing plant. Here, view workers fertilizing the soil with the same organic solids produced during the cleaning and peeling processes, and sweeping the coffee under the sun to ensure it dries evenly. Meanwhile, other workers take care of the final process of preparing and packing the coffee for export. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible, nor recommended for guests prone to motion sickness. ## Puerto Quetzal - Guatemala

#### QUE-D / VALHALLA MACADAMIA NUT FARM

**DIFFICULTY**

Discover how the macadamia nut industry helps the environment and economy of Guatemala during this memorable, half-day excursion to the Valhalla Organic Macadamia Nut. An added benefit of encouraging farmers to plant macadamia trees is that it prevents the use of slash-and-burn agriculture, which is prevalent here, depleting the soil of nutrients and the expense of short-term crop gains. Macadamia trees also supply ample firewood, making them even more attractive to locals.

#### Macadamia Nut Farm

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive north to the Valhalla Organic Macadamia Nut Farm. En route, pass through the Pacific Coastal lowlands of Guatemala and take in spectacular views while driving between the Acatenango, Agua and Fuego volcanoes.

Upon arrival, take a guided tour of the Valhalla Organic Macadamia Nut Farm. This picturesque farm is a sustainable agriculture development project and Ecological Tourism destination that provides a source of employment, food and fuel for the farmers' families. In 2002, the project was awarded the Golden Fete D'Excellence in Geneva.

Macadamia nuts have become one of the most important export products in Guatemala, which ranks seventh among the world's largest producers of macadamia nuts.

At the conclusion of your tour, some free time is made available to purchase macadamia goods produced on the farm before commencing the approximately 75-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 219 yards (about 200 metres) over gravel paths at the plantation, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. Guests are advised to wear light-weight clothing and comfortable walking shoes, sun protection and insect repellent.

#### QUE-E / COFFEE CLOSE TO CULTURE - FINCA FILADELFIA

Enjoy a half-day tour to Filadelfia Coffee Estate and learn about the coffee process from its beginning journey from plant to cup and enjoy a scenic drive by the highlights of La Antigua. Drive through lowland pastures, sugar plantations and cattle farms; passing between Agua, Fuego and Acatenango volcanoes, and unique landscapes.

Filadelfia Coffee Estate

The Filadelfia Coffee Estate is located in La Antigua Guatemala, in the central zone of the country, one of the best coffee producing regions in Guatemala. Guests will have the opportunity to experience two of the greatest coffee classifications, their aromas, body, acidity and their differences. A guided tour of the estate will be followed by a coffee tasting and refreshment.

#### La Antigua Panoramic Drive

Enjoy a glimpse of the city of Santiago de los Caballeros, known today as La Antigua Guatemala, founded in the Valley of Panchoy in 1543; it became the third capital in the New World after those in Mexico and Peru. In 1979 UNESCO declared it World Cultural Heritage. Cobblestoned streets, colourful facades and tiled roofs, as well as restored and un-restored churches, palaces, convents and mansions covered with vegetation and colourful bougainvillea make this colonial city a favourite for visitors from all over the world.

Depart the La Antiqua area for the approximately 1.5-hour drive back to the port area.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over plantation trails and dirt paths and is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or for those who utilise a wheelchair. Guests should wear seasonal clothing, flat walking shoes and sun protection. The drive time to the coffee farm is approximately 90 minutes. Due to Municipal regulations, driving near Main Plaza on Pullman Type buses might not be possible; therefore it is possible that quests will have to walk approximately 765 yards (700 metres) to return to the bus.

#### QUE-F / CITY OF LA ANTIGUA

Explore the Old World beauty, architecture and artefacts of the restored city of La Antigua during this memorable visit to Casa Santo Domingo. Spend time at your leisure inside the Casa Santo Domingo premises, and then proceed for lunch at the Casa Santo Domingo Hotel. After lunch, continue on to the Central Plaza, then visit a jade factory, museum, and shop to admire and browse the beautiful jewellery made from colourful

#### Casa Santo Domingo

After Guatemala's Independence of 1821, the plots of land on which the convent and temple of Santo Domingo stood were divided and sold. Later, these plots were acquired by a company with a goal of rescuing the vestiges of the convent and temple, which were buried under tons of debris. The project was designated Casa Santo Domingo, and restoration of the area began in 1989.

Upon arrival at Casa Santo Domingo, explore the Guatemalan architecture dating from the 17th century during visits to the Cultural Centre at Santo Domingo. It houses the Chamber Theatre, the Carlos Merida Museum/Gallery of Modern Art, the Colonial Arts Museum, the Handicrafts Museum, and the interesting Glass Museum, which that compares modern glass pieces with Mayan art. Following your visit, proceed for lunch at Casa Santo Domingo Hotel Restaurant.

#### Central Plaza

After lunch, continue on to the Central Plaza for a short visit and then visit a jade factory, museum and shop. Upon arrival, admire and browse the beautiful jewelry made from many colours of local jade.

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the approximately 1.5-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 800 metres (about 875 yards) over uneven terrain and cobblestone streets, with stairs to negotiate to access sites, and a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and curbs. This tour is not suitable for quests with limited mobility and quests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight clothing, sturdy walking shoes and sun protection.

#### QUE-G / RUM TASTING & JADE MUSEUM IN LA ANTIGUA

La Antiqua

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 90-minute drive to La Antigua. Nestled in the shadow of the spectacular Agua Volcano, La Antigua was founded in 1543, and remains one of the best preserved colonial cities in Spanish America. The city features exquisite churches and convents, facades and a Main Plaza. Highlights include the beautiful, 16th-century Metropolitan Cathedral Metropolitana, stunning curves of the Palace of the Captains, and the Palacio del Noble Ayuntamiento, which houses the city's municipal offices and two museums; the Museo de Armas de Santiago and Museo del Libro Antiguo. At the very centre of the square is the impressive Fountain of the Sirens.

#### Rum-Tasting

Upon arrival in La Antigua, proceed for a rum-tasting at Casa del Ron, where an expert bartender and rum connoisseur guide you through a tasting of two of Guatemala's, and the world's, finest rums.

#### Lunch, Casa Santo Domingo and Jade Museum & Workshop

Next, take a guided stroll through the most famous Colonial city in Central America. Walk to Casa Santo Domingo and visit its Museums and Cultural Center. Lunch will be served at Casa Santo Domingo Restaurant. After lunch, your walk continues to the Jade Museum. Learn about and see some of the most famous and authentic Mayan treasures, including jewels, masks, sculptures and more. Following your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 90-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 547 yards (about 500 metres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and curbs. This tour is recommended for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a light jacket or sweater from the ship. Guests must be at least 21 years old to participate in tastings of alcoholic beverages. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

#### QUE-H / LA ANTIGUA ON YOUR OWN

This convenient transfer to-and-from the city is ideally-suited for guests opting to visit La Antigua and sightsee at their own leisure.

You will board the bus for a guided transfer to a jewel of the colonial urban development and architecture.

Our driver and guide will welcome the guests, distribute maps of La Antigua city and will give information and instructions along the way. La Antigua preserves its original features and because of its immense historical and cultural value, it was declared "world Heritage" by UNESCO in 1979. Located in a valley surrounded by mountains and by towering volcanoes, today is a pleasant city of cobbled stone streets, houses and businesses with colonial style facades and tile roofs and of restored and vegetation-covered ruins of churches, palaces, convents and mansions. In La Antigua, guests will witness the charm of this former capital of the "Kingdom of Guatemala" in its three-century old churches, convents and plazas.

Following your visit, re-join the coach at the pre-designated time for the return drive to the pier in Puerto Quetzal.

Please note: This tour provides round-trip transfers between Puerto Quetzal and La Antigua. Any admission fees or meals are at each guest's own expense. Please re-join your coach promptly at the appointed time for the return drive to the pier in Puerto Quetzal.

#### QUE-I / PACAYA VOLCANO TREK

Experience the most exciting geo-adventure tour in Guatemala during this memorable, full-day trek to the Pacaya Volcano.

The Pacaya Volcano is one of the few active volcanoes in America that can be trekked, and offers an opportunity to observe volcanic activity upclose. It stands 8,372 feet (2,552 metres) in height, and has an average temperature of 59-68 degrees Fahrenheit (15-20 Celsius) with 80% humidity. Depending upon the light exposure and other weather-permitting factors, lava rivers can be spotted up-close. If clouds are not present, three other volcanoes, Agua, Fuego and Acatenango, and the Guatemala City valley can also be seen from the trail and plateau, offering ideal photo opportunities.

Depart the pier for the approximately 1.5 hour drive north along the highway towards the town of San Vicente Pacaya. Upon arrival, meet your certified guides and after a briefing begin your hike up the volcano. En route, see coffee and corn plantations, along with cedars, bamboo, pines and other tropical vegetation. Weather and safety permitting you will reach a platform where you will be met with incredible views, which you can capture on camera.

Due to the nature of hiking on an active volcano, the tour can be cancelled at any time, either before departure or during the tour to guarantee your safety at all times. Trail is not shaded, so please wear sun protection, hat and some extra water.

Total hiking time is about 2.5 - 3 hours (round trip) covering between 2.5 and 3.2 miles (4-5 km) round trip with both uphill and downhill terrain to negotiate in reaching the sightseeing area at the Pacaya Volcano's crater. Stops are made to take photos, regroup, take a light snack and catch your breath.

Following your descent, re-board your coach for the approximately 1.5 hour ride back to the pier. En route, a stop is made at a local restaurant for lunch and a comfort stop.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of strenuous walking and mountain-climbing along dirt pathways and steep inclines that can be muddy if rained upon the day before. Total amount of walking is about 3 miles (5 km). This tour is only recommended for guests in excellent physical condition, and is not suitable for guests limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. #### Izapa Ruins

Depart the pier for the 45-minute drive aboard an air-conditioned coach to the ancient ruins of Izapa. From its humble beginnings as a small village around 1500 B.C., Izapa eventually grew into the region's most influential cultural and commercial center. At the height of its influence between 60 B.C. and 100 A.D., Izapa's population numbered up to 10,000 people. Once renowned in the region for its production of highly-valued cacao, Izapa brought together many of Meso-America's ancient cultures, and was believed to have been the site of origin of the sacred Mayan Calendar.

#### Tapachulaand Museum

Next, travel by bus to the culturally-diverse city of Tapachula, whose history and heritage has been influenced by the Mayans, Mestizo's and Spanish, as well as German, Chinese, Japanese and French immigrants. Upon arrival, proceed for a visit to the Archaeological Museum. Here you have an opportunity to view Mayan artifacts found in the region, many of them from Izapa.

From here, take a guided walking tour around the colorful streets of the town square to explore some of the city's highlights. Some free time will also be made for you to browse the local artisan shops for leather goods, ceramics and more, or simply relax at one of the area's cafes and take in your surroundings.

Following your tour, transfer back to the pier and ship.

Please note: This tour involves minimal walking and is suitable for guests with limited mobility as long as they are able to embark and disembark the coach with minimal assistance and negotiate a few stairs. At the conclusion of your mangrove boat ride, rejoin your transfer for the return drive to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves minimal activity and is suitable for guests with limited mobility as long as they can embark and disembark the boats with minimal assistance. There may be a high step based on current tide levels. Guests should wear light-weight comfortable clothing, sun protection and insect repellent. Guests are required to wear a lifejacket while in the boat. Although wildlife sightings are frequent, they can never be guaranteed. Participants must be at least 6 years of age.

#### PMD-D / IZAPA RUINS AND CHOCOLATE DISCOVERY

From the pier, journey approximately 45 minutes aboard an air-conditioned bus to the ancient ruins of Izapa. From its beginnings as a small village sometime around 1500 BCE, Izapa grew into the region's most influential cultural and commercial centre with a population of possibly up to 10,000 people at the height of its influence sometime between 60 BCE and 100 ACE.

Once foremost in the region for the production of highly valued cacao, Izapa brought together many of mesoamerica's ancient cultures and many believe it may be the site of origin of the sacred Mayan Calendar although much study remains to be done in order to unlock these secrets.

#### Chocolate City

Next, travel by bus to Tuxtla Chico 'Chocolate City', where a demonstration on how the cocoa beans are transformed in to chocolate is performed for you right at the main square (plaza); you may also be able to see and sample the local cuisine, as well as see a variety of local handicrafts and exotic flowers of the region.

Local dancers and marimba players will be sharing their skills with lively performances. After a stop at the local historic church, you are on your way back to the pier.

Take the opportunity to visit the town square where you find an historic church, the city hall building as well as vendors and small stores. When your free time is up, you will be escorted back to your ship's pier.

Argovia has diversified its production and now also specializes in growing over 125 different ornamental flowers. You'll tour the flower plantation and see these extraordinary specimens of nature's gifts. Get to know all the diversity of folliage, tropical and exotic flowers, in one small and spectacular botanic garden.

Afterwards you'll have time to browse he gift shop and purchase Argovia's famous coffee to take home with you, before commencing the 90 minutes drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking with some inclines and steps to negotiate. The drive from the ship to the plantation is 1.5 hours in each direction and may be bumpy in areas depending on recent rainfall. Wear comfortable clothing, flat, walking shoes and sun protection.

#### SFO-A2 / SAN FRANCISCO CITY HIGHLIGHTS (TOUR & AIRPORT TRANSFER)

From the pier, travel along the embarcadero to Golden Gate Pavilion. The bridge is possibly the most beautiful, and certainly the most photographed, bridge in the world. Often half-veiled by the city's trademark rolling fog, San Francisco's Golden Gate Bridge, named for the strait leading from the Pacific Ocean to the San Francisco Bay, spans tidal currents, ocean waves, and battering winds to connect the City by the Bay with the Redwood Empire to the north. Spend some free time here for photos before departing for Twin Peaks. En route to the viewpoint, glide through lush Golden Gate Park, San Francisco's enormous arboreal front yard. Conceived in the 1860s and 1870s, this great 1,017-acre landmark, which stretches inland from the Pacific coast, took shape in the 1880s and 1890s thanks to the skill and effort of John McLaren, a Scot who arrived in 1887 and began landscaping the park. From the park, a short drive through the city streets brings you to Twin Peaks. Of the 43 hills in San Francisco, Twin Peaks offers the city's most spectacular views. The almost identical summits, Noe and Eureka, rise approximately 922 feet above the city. On a clear day, you are treated to a 360-degree view spanning the Golden Gate to Alcatraz, to Berkeley, to the peninsula. Transfer to San Francisco International airport.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking and most areas visited. This tour is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair.
