

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 - 7 days prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 7 days prior to your sailing date. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain you're selecting excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the tour description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information and attend the port talks onboard. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore- side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours. When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

St George's - Grenada

GND-A / AROUND THE ISLE OF SPICE

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$119; Duration:7.00 hrs

Indulge your senses with the picturesque beauty and enticing aromas of the 'Isle of Spice' during this full-day sightseeing excursion through Grenada.

Dougaldston Estate and Gouyave Nutmeg Factory

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 45-minute drive along the picturesque west coast of Grenada en route to the Dougaldston Estate. Upon arrival, receive an introduction to the spices of the island. From here, re-board your coach for the drive to the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory. During your visit, learn about the many uses for nutmeg, and observe how nutmeg and mace are seasoned, processed and sorted.

'Carib Leap' and River Antoine Rum Distillery

Next, drive northward for a magnificent view of the Grenadine Islands and a visit to the 'Carib Leap'. Here, the last fighting Caribs committed suicide in 1651, overwhelmed by the prospect of French rule. Your tour continues with a visit to the River Antoine Rum Distillery. Established in 1785, it is the oldest working distillery in the Caribbean. Despite its age, the River Antoine Rum Distillery is especially well-planned with environmentally-friendly features.

Belmont Estate and Grand Etang Lake

Following your visit to the distillery, re-board your coach and drive to the *Belmont Estate*. Upon arrival at this plantation house, proceed for a typical Creole lunch accompanied by splendid vistas of the surrounding estate. After lunch, take the rainforest road to Grand Etang for a visit to Grand Etang Lake, which fills the crater of one of the island's extinct volcanoes. The lush rainforest surrounding the lake is home to the Mona monkey, and diverse flora and fauna.

This tour concluded's at the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 0.2 miles (about 0.3 kilometres), with 20 steps to negotiate at the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory and ten steps to negotiate at the River Antoine Rum Distillery. The Belmont Estate is closed on Saturdays. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing and bring sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses from the ship. Photography is not permitted inside the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory. A minimum number of guests per guide is required for operation of this tour.

GND-B / SNORKELLING CHAMPAGNE LOBSTER CRUISE

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$159; Duration:6.00 hrs

Experience the splendid beauty and marine life of Grenada during this snorkelling, champagne and lobster cruise to idyllic Hog Island. Grenada Underwater Sculpture Park Snorkelling

Depart the pier for the brief transfer to the Shadowfax Jetty, then embark your boat and proceed to snorkel at the Grenada Underwater Sculpture Park, the world's first underwater sculpture gallery. After the bay got damaged by storm surge, the sculptures were designed to assist in the regeneration of the area by providing habitat for marine life and by providing new surfaces for corals to grow upon. Upon arrival at the Underwater Sculpture Park, receive your snorkel gear and safety instructions before commencing your guided, approximate one-hour snorkel tour.

Hog Island and Lobster Lunch

Next, set sail along the scenic southwest Caribbean coast of Grenada towards Point Salines, the southernmost point of Grenada. From here, sail upwind on the Atlantic side of Grenada en route to secluded Hog Island. Take a swim, explore this 'Robinson Crusoe Island' or simply relax and soak up the tropical sun before dining on a lobster lunch served with champagne and wine.

Following your memorable visit to Hog Island, embark your boat for the approximate 1.5-hour sail back to St. George's Harbour. Upon arrival at the Shadowfax Jetty, transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of activity. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Guests wishing to enter the water, must be able to swim and in good physical condition, are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with water shoes, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship. A complimentary open bar with snacks, beach games, and snorkelling gear and instructions are included during this excursion. Alcoholic beverages will only be served to guests over the age of 21 and only after completion of the snorkelling portion of this tour. If guests prefer a dish other than lobster, they may request chicken or fish directly to their guide upon departure from the ship.

GND-C / RUM AND BEACH

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$59; Duration: 3.50 hrs

Embrace the scenic beauty and flavours of Grenada during this half-day excursion to the Clark's Court Rum Distillery, and a relaxing visit to Morne Rouge Beach.

Clark's Court Rum Distillery

Depart the pier for the brief drive to St. George's, located in the southern part of the island. Upon arrival, proceed for a visit to the Clark's Court Rum Distillery, founded in 1937 and adjacent to sugarcane fields.

During your guided tour of the factory, learn about the distilling process from sugar cane, syrup and molasses to rum, and also the ageing and blending processes involved in the production of rum. In addition, see old steam engines dating as far back as 1886 that are still in use today. Following your guided tour, sample the distillery's award-winning rums and receive recipes describing different ways to mix and serve rum.

Morne Rouge Beach

Next, your drive continues on to Morne Rouge Beach, a secluded, white-sand beach graced by crystal-clear waters and almond trees offering natural shade. Your two-hour visit includes beach chairs, restroom facilities with changing rooms, showers and two complimentary beverages. You can swim, explore the beach or simply relax with a refreshing drink and soak up the tropical sun. Afterward, re-board your coach for the brief drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking, with 24 steps to negotiate inside the Clark's Court Rum Distillery. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Guests must be at least 21 years old to participate in the tasting's of alcoholic beverages. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship.

GND-D / TROPICAL BEACH TOUR

DIFFICULTY

Discover the history and seaside beauty of Grenada during this picturesque, half-day excursion to Fort George, and a relaxing visit to a secluded beach.

Fort George

Depart the pier for the brief transfer through a labyrinth of roads en route to Fort George. Built in the early-18th century on a volcanic spine 175 feet (53 metres) above St. George's Harbour, Fort George offers spectacular panoramic views of the small capital and the Caribbean Sea. During your guided tour, learn about the history of the fort and Grenada.

Beach Visit

Next, your drive continues on to a secluded, white-sand beach located on the southern point of Grenada. Your two-hour visit includes beach chairs, restroom facilities with changing rooms, showers and a complimentary beverage. You can swim, explore the beach, sunbathe or simply relax with a refreshing drink in the shade of a sea grape tree. Afterward, re-board your coach for the brief drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, with 30 steps to negotiate at Fort George. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship.

GND-E / NUTMEG AND WATERFALL

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$59; Duration:4.00 hrs

Explore the pristine natural beauty and history of Grenada during this half-day sightseeing excursion, and a memorable visit to Concord Falls.

Dougaldston Estate and Gouyave Nutmeg Factory

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 45-minute drive along the picturesque west coast of Grenada en route to the Dougaldston Estate. Upon arrival, receive an introduction to the spices of the island. From here, re-board your coach for the drive to the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory. During your visit, learn about the many uses for nutmeg, and observe how nutmeg and mace are seasoned, processed and sorted.

Concord Falls

Next, proceed for a visit to Concord Falls, where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest. Upon arrival, relax with a complementary drink and take a refreshing swim in the lovely natural waterfall-pool. Following your visit, commence the approximate 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 150 yards (about 137 metres), with 20 steps to negotiate at the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory and ten steps to negotiate at Concord Falls. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility, but is not wheelchair-accessible. Extra caution must be exercised if the pathways are wet, as they can become quite slippery. Guests are advised to

wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship. The tour sequence may vary. Photography is not permitted inside the Gouyave Nutmeg Factory.

GND-F / ECO TREK AT BAMBOO FALLS

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$59; Duration:3.50 hrs

Experience the natural splendour of Grenada on-foot during this hiking excursion at the Bamboo Waterfall.

Grand Etang

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to Grand Etang. Located high up in the mountains of the island's interior, Grand Etang's varied elevations and terrains boast several different ecological subsystems, culminating in the elfin woodlands high up the slopes of the reserve's central mountains. At an altitude of 1,476 feet (450 meters), this small mountainous territory is rooted in sheer rock, with towering mahogany and giant gommier trees of up to 131 feet (40 meters) in height. Grand Etang's flora also includes a multitude of ferns, tropical flowers and other indigenous plants. The lush vegetation provides shelter for a wide variety of animal, reptile and bird species.

Private Plantation and Bamboo Waterfall

Next, begin your guided trek through the heart of the tropical rainforest. Your trek will involve a challenging hike over muddy terrain and river crossing before reaching the idyllic Bamboo Waterfall. En route, pass through a private plantation with cocoa, nutmeg and banana trees. Upon arrival at the Bamboo Waterfall, you may opt to take a relaxing soak. Afterward, your eco-trek concludes with a refreshment stop at Grand Etang before commencing the approximately 40-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.5 miles (about 2.4 kilometres), with uneven and muddy surfaces, inclines, and 2 river crossings. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests must be at least eight years old to participate on this tour. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with closed-toe trekking shoes or sneakers, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, towel and a bottle of water from the ship. A signed waiver is required to participate on this tour. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

GND-G / ACCESSIBLE GRENADA

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$129; Duration:4.00 hrs



This accessible Grenada shore excursion combines the best highlights of the island. Explore the local Spice Market on Market Street in St. George, visit a local nutmeg factory, experience the Dougaldston Spice Processing plant, and enjoy a scenic drive through the beautiful Grand Etang National Park.

Start your day by meeting your friendly guide/driver by the cruise dock and begin short drive to the first stop of the day, in the old parts of the center of St. George's. Here, you will explore the hub of the town, Market Square, where you'll enjoy browsing the colorful local Spice Market. Experience the authentic island atmosphere and smell of nutmeg, cocoa and vanilla, as you stroll through a wide array of island spices, gifts and souvenirs for sale.

The next stop of your day is a local Nutmeg factory. Here, you will see the processing steps of nutmeg and learn about the importance of nutmeg for the island's history and economy. Nearby, you will visit the Douglaston spice depot, where you will enjoy a short presentation of all the spices produced here including cinnamon, pimento, clove, bay leaves, turmeric, ginger, and mace.

The final part of your day will be spent on a scenic drive through the beautiful rain forest. Enjoy views of lush volcanic mountains and tropical flora, and see the many spice, cocoa and banana plantations peppered throughout the landscape. If you are lucky, you may even see some local Mona monkeys! You will arrive to the mesmerizing Grand Etang National Park where you will have a chance to visit the onsite visitor center. Here, you will learn about how the Caribbean Islands were formed, the local weather and plants and how the volcanic Crater Lake was formed. The Chobolobo Liqueur Factory and Punda

Continue to Chobolobo to enjoy a taste of the world famous Blue Curacao Liqueur and see how it is made. Next, your guide will point out major points of interest as you drive through Punda in the heart of Willemstad. Next, your guide will point out major points of interest as you drive through Punda in the heart of Willemstad. Experience the beauty of Curaçao's capital on a tour that takes you through historic Willemstad. From the pier, you are transferred by taxi across the Queen Juliana Bridge to the waiting trolley train.

Scharloo

Your tour begins at Fort Amsterdam then it is off to Scharloo, a residential neighborhood with picturesque homes built by Curaçao's wealthy merchants during the 1880s. Stop at Bolo di Bruit, known as the Wedding Cake House and the city's most photographed building. It is now the site of the Central Historical Archives.

Pietermaai Cathedral

Leaving Scharloo, enter Pietermaii Cathedral, the largest and most impressive church on the island. In addition, view Queen Wilhelmina Park, the scene of frequent cultural events, and Water Fort Arches, an imposing fortress that was the site of the Willhem III Barracks.

Fort Amsterdam

Finally, visit Fort Amsterdam built in 1635 to guard the vital entrance of the harbor from enemy ships. The citadel was later converted into the Governor's Palace and the office of the Central Government of the Netherlands Antilles. The fort is one of many structures that lend a sense of history and atmosphere to the city, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

At the end of the tour a taxi awaits to take you back to the ship or you may wish to stay in town and walk the short distance back to the ship.

Please note: Tour provides easy sightseeing with little walking. Guests must be able to maneuver the steps on and off the trolley.

CUR-D / SEAWORLD EXPLORER

Discover the fascinating underwater world of Curação as you glide along in the comfort of your air-conditioned semi-sub.

From the dock in Willemstad, it's only a short drive to the Seaworld Explorer, a state-of-the-art semi-submarine. Developed in Australia for use on the Great Barrier Reef, this vessel does not actually submerge. You'll descend into the hull of this cruising underwater observatory, and sit in air-conditioned comfort, 5 feet below the surface of the water.

As you explore the sea life through large glass windows, see dozens of colorful tropical fish such as Yellowtail Snapper, Sergeant Majors, Parrotfish and Queen Angelfish. Your underwater adventure also includes a narrated tour of the coral reefs along the south side of the island, which took thousands of years to grow. Look out for the diver, who will feed some of the fish, alongside the *Seaworld Explorer*. Just offshore you'll also observe the ocean wall, which drops sharply to depths of several hundred feet.

Please note: The Seaworld Explorer is not suitable for those who suffer from seasickness. This tour involves limited walking, however passengers must be able to negotiate 2 or 3 steep steps onto and off the Seaworld Explorer. Marine life sightings are dependent on local sea conditions.

Scarborough - Trinidad and Tobago

SCA-A / TOBAGO HIGHLIGHTS, TROPICAL GARDEN & NATURE RESERVE

DIFFICULTY

Enjoy a half-day tour of the southern highlights of this lovely island and a walk in the forest to observe the indigenous birdlife.

Depart the port and begin the tour along the Claude Noel Highway. After a short drive along this road, turn off onto Shirvon Road, passing several residential areas en route to the first stop at Fort James.

Mysterious Tombstone and Fort James

The fort was destroyed several times and the present one was erected in 1800. Another much quoted attraction is the enigmatic tombstone of Betty Stevens. Its puzzling inscription reads, "She was a mother without knowing it, and a wife, without letting her husband know, except by her kind indulgences to him." This epitaph has baffling people for over 230 years. After making your own guesses as to its' meaning continue on to the main event of your trip, The Tropical Garden and Nature Reserve.

Tropical Garden and Nature Reserve

This piece of paradise centers around a bird feeding house. Watch in wonder as mobs of neon humming-birds flit and flutter around the feeding stations. Woodpeckers, parakeets, jacamars and egrets make their regular appearances too; so keep a close lookout.

Following this walk in the forest, re-boarding your coach for the return to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity and walking over uneven ground. Birdwatchers, may wish to bring their binoculars. We suggest guests dress in lightweight tropical attire, flat walking shoes and wear ample sun protection.

SCA-B / ARGYLE WATERFALLS

Experience Tobago's rainforest-clad interior and one of its prettiest waterfalls, Argyle Falls, during this half-day outing.

Begin your tour with the scenic 1-hour ride in a coach along the island's dramatic Windward road, passing throught several small villages such as Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Pembroke, Bell Garden and Roxborough, where you enter the Main Ridge Forest Reserve. From here a guided tour takes you on a walk through the Roxborough Rain Forest, the oldest protected Rain Forest in the Western Hemisphere.

After a forest walk of approximately 20 minutes, arrive at the Argyle waterfalls- a series of three tiered cascades reaching up to 175 feet (53 metres) high and crashing into crystal clear pools. Some free time here will allow you to take a swim or just take in nature at its best. After about an hour return to your awaiting transport for the 1-hour return drive to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves moderate activity and walking over uneven ground and rocks, which may become slippery when wet. Extra caution is advised. Guests wishing to swim should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel from the ship. Guests may wish to wear trekking shoes they do not mind getting wet or soiled. Guests are advised to wear light-weight clothing, sun protection and insect

repellent. Extra caution must be exercised by guests wishing to enter the water as the rocks may be slippery. There are no lifeguards on duty and swimming will be at guest's own risk. SCA-D / BUCCOO REEF AND NYLON POOL

Explore the underwater world without getting wet during this scenic glass-bottom boat tour over the living coral reefs of Tobago, then dive in to explore the reef up close and personal.

Begin the tour with a scenic drive to Pigeon Point Heritage Park. Upon arrival, take off your shoes and wade in approximately 2 feet of water to, board a glass-bottom boat and cruise out to Buccoo Reef, one of the most accessible coral reefs in the Caribbean, just a short distance off Pigeon Point and Store Bay beaches.

En route to Buccoo Reef, your captain will pass over the Coral Gardens, pointing out fascinating underwater sea life along the way. Upon arrival, guests wishing to snorkel or swim will have approximately one hour to enjoy the water before cruising to Nylon Pool, a shallow white-sand area within Buccoo Reef with waters said to rejuvenate anyone lucky enough to swim in it. Dubbed by Princess Margaret as 'Nylon Reef' during her honeymoon in 1962, she commented, "It's so crazy-blue, it looks like nylon."

This entire area, a Tobago national treasure, is designated as the country's only marine protected area under the Marine Areas Preservation and Enhancement Act of 1970 once explored by Jacques Cousteau himself.

Following your visit to the Nylon Pool, your captain will set a course back to the landing at Pigeon Point Beach, where you will board your transportation for your return trip back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves minimal activity for guests that stay on the boat. Guests wishing to snorkel or swim, must be in good physical condition and able to swim in water too deep to stand. A mask and snorkel is provided or you may wish to bring your own. We recommend guests wear lightweight comfortable clothing over their swimsuit, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship. A ramp is used for boarding the boat; Be prepared to get wet boarding the boat.

SCA-G / TOBAGO COCOA DISCOVERY

Discover the stages by which cocoa is grown and processed for consumption during this fascinating and flavourful, half-day sightseeing excursion to the Tobago Cocoa Estate.

Scarborough, Windward Coast Rd., Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Pembroke, Belle Garden, Roxborough

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive along Windward Coast Road and through the villages of Bacolet, Mount St. George, Pembroke, Bell Garden, and Roxborough. From here, turn off the Main Ridge and enter the oldest rainforest reserve in the Western Hemisphere. Upon arrival at the Tobago Cocoa Estate, learn about the history of the cocoa industry and its standing on the island.

Tobago Cocoa Estate, Cocoa Production Process, Rainforest Walk, Cocoa Tasting

During a walking tour of the estate, take an opportunity to view the drying, fermentation and various other stages of cocoa production, visit a mud oven and house where the cocoa is dried, and learn about the many products that are available here. In addition, explore the lush vegetation and abundant plant-life growing in Tobago's Rainforest, and view other local produce growing on the estate. Following your walking tour, proceed for a tasting of chocolates or a refreshing cup of 'cocoa tea', made from raw cocoa. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Windward Coast Road, Bacolet, Mt. St. George, Granby Point, Pembroke Village and Heritage Park

Next, re-board your coach and continue along Windward Coast Road, passing through several coastline villages such as Bacolet, Mount St. George, Granby Point and Pembroke. A stop is made in Pembroke Village for a guided tour of the Pembroke Heritage Park.

Speyside Lookout, Charlotteville, Lunch, Jemma's Sea ViewKitchenRestaurant

Sugar Factory ruins, Rainforest, Atlantic Coast, Goldsborough Waterfall, Fort Granbee, Hope Village

In the popular Diamond Botanical Garden, your tour guide will take you on a spectacular stroll while sharing all that he knows about the fauna and produce of the island. The path in the garden is accessible with no steps or steep inclines. At the end of the Gardens, you will see the amazing Diamond Waterfall right in front of you. A traditional St. Lucia buffet lunch will be served at an accessible restaurant close to the gardens.

Please Note: This tour is designed to be accessible for all guests. It is suitable for guests on a wheelchair who can transfer to a seat. Fond Latisab Creole Park

Depart for a drive through the countryside to Fond Latisab - Taste St. Lucia's very own local Creole traditions as you join a cultural tour of the Fond Latisab Creole Park in the beautiful community of Babonneau. Experience cultural practices such as; the preparation of cassava bread, cooking on macambou leaves, and the very authentic display of wood-sawing, all while the Chak-Chak band plays traditional music in the background.

Discover the ancient Amerindian manner as you witness several traditional practices. See the fascinating method of log sawing to the rhythmic music of a local Chak-Chak band as you experience a glimpse into the rich folk heritage of St. Lucia. You might even be able to learn a few words of Patois, the language of Creole heavily laced with French, African and English grammar. You'll have the opportunity to taste the cassava bread and a local fruit drink before returning to your ship.

Fauna is very abundant throughout the tropical rainforests, however; animals are difficult to spot during the day. From the Aerial Tram you can also appreciate all the different shades of green as well as the various sizes and shapes that the leaves have created as a strategy to capture sunlight. The course is very secure and very quiet; this allows you to listen to the many different sounds of the rainforest.

Beginning from the pier on a fully air-conditioned bus, travel through the Capital city of Castries through the mountains to a village nestled over 2,000 ft. (600 metres) in the mountains. Open-air gondolas safely glide you through and over the tree tops, where knotted and twisting woody vines wind to the tops of old growth rainforest trees. Dense thickets of surreal vegetation merge with cascades of flowers. Lavender stars, orange bursts, yellow berries and white lace

Throughout the class, learn about the many fascinating health benefits of trinitario dark chocolate. A 20-minute cooling-down period allows the liquefied chocolate to solidify after it has been put into its mould. During the break, you can take in spectacular panoramic views of the city, enjoy a beverage from the Cellar Bar or browse the duty-free gift shop. Leaving the waterfalls, re-board your minibus and proceed for a buffet lunch at the *Beachfront* restaurant. After lunch drive back to port in Kingstown and board the ferry for the 50-minute transfer back to Bequia. Upon arrival, you are dropped off at Port Elizabeth. Located only a minute from the port, this classic Caribbean town is filled with colourful sailboats, schooners and visiting yachts, and the main shopping district in Bequia. You can browse the shops here for handicrafts, souvenirs, food and beverages, then commence the short walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 528 yards (about 483 metres), at times over uneven and sandy surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to embark/disembark the boat and manoeuvre in/out of the boat. Walking at Port Elizabeth is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is recommended for guests that are in good physical condition, and can swim in water too deep too stand.
