ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Auckland - New Zealand

AKL-A / AUCKLAND CITY SIGHTS

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 4.00 hrs



This tour is for guests who are in-transit and continuing on the next voyage only.

This outing will provide an educational introduction to New Zealand's largest city, often referred to as the 'City of Sails'. With its magnificent harbour, reminiscent of Sydney, San Francisco, Hong Kong, and Cape Town, Auckland is regarded as one of the world's most exciting cities.

Board your coach with your driver-guide and get acquainted with this sprawling metropolis and its attractions.

Auckland Sky Tower

Your first stop is at the Auckland Sky Tower. This iconic landmark commands 360 degree panoramic views of Auckland's Waitemata Harbour and Rangitoto Island. After free time for photos, re-board your coach.

Auckland Museum

Your next stop will visit this outstanding museum, offering an extensive collection of Maori artefacts and culture on display. Prize exhibits include a magnificent 82-foot (25-metre) -long war canoe and a carved meeting house. The museum also contains a fine collection of objects from the South Pacific and the 'Scars of the Heart' exhibition commemorating New Zealand's involvement in all the major wars of the 20th century.

Panoramic Sightseeing

Re-join your coach for a scenic drive through Parnell, one of Auckland's oldest districts. Remarkable restoration has created an upscale shopping area that retains the charm of a small village. Continue along Tamaki Drive to Okahu Bay, where you can see some of Auckland's finest residential homes.

Returning to the city, travel past the former America's Cup Yachting Village and then across the Auckland Harbour Bridge, built in 1959 to link the North Shore suburbs to Auckland. Your coach then returns you to your ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking; most areas visited are wheelchair accessible. It is suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair; however, guests must be able to embark and disembark the coach via the bus steps. Order of sights may vary; tour itinerary can be reversed.

AKL-G / MURIWAI GANNET COLONY & HAUMOANA FARM

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 4.50 hrs



Discover the exquisite natural beauty, farmland and birdlife of New Zealand during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Kumeu, Huapai, West Coast, Muriwai Beach, Gannet Colony

Depart the pier with your driver-guide for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive through the wine-growing areas of Kumeu and Huapai en route to Muriwai Beach, located on the rugged west coast. At the clifftops overlooking the beach, take a short walk through the native plants to the lookout point to see the gannet colony here; one of only two mainland gannet colonies in the world. Depending upon the season, you may be able to view the birds' nesting and feeding routines, and their spectacular diving technique as they hunt for fish.

South Kaipara Peninsula, Haumoana Farm, Sheep Mustering and Shearing Demonstration

Leaving Muriwai, re-board your coach and drive through the rural farming districts. Along the way, a stop is made at Haumoana Farm, a 200-acre (about 81-hectare) holding situated on the South Kaipara Peninsula. The farm runs 300 Romney sheep for prime lamb and wool production, 200 cattle and a small fallow deer unit. Upon arrival, you are welcomed by your hosts, Greg and Barbara Ross, who will share their experience on the farm. See the mustering of sheep by trained sheepdogs, a skilled shearing demonstration that illustrates just how quickly a sheep can be shorn of its wool, and other typical farm activities.

Main House, Morning/Afternoon Tea, Waitoki, Dairy Flat

Following your guided tour, you are invited to the main house for morning or afternoon tea served with assorted home baking. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 1-hour drive back to the pier via the farming areas of Waitoki and Dairy Flat.

Please note: The Muriwai Gannet Colony stop is self-guided. This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 219 yards (about 200 metres), at times over uneven, gravel and grassy surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, and 30 steps and inclined paths to access the viewing platforms at the Muriwai Gannet Colony. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to motion sickness,

guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a weatherproof coat or jacket from the ship. The tour sequence may vary.

Bay of Islands - New Zealand

BAY-A / WAITANGI & KERIKERI

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 4.00 hrs

This half-day tour provides a good introduction to the Bay of Islands area and its Maori and European history. It was here that many of New Zealand's formative events occurred. After tendering ashore, meet your driver-guide and board the coach for the drive to Kerikeri via Paihia.

Kerikeri

Visit New Zealand's oldest building on a guided tour, the Kemp House dating from 1822 and the adjacent Stone Store built in 1832. It was at Kerikeri where the Church of England missionaries established their second mission station in 1819. Continue with your drive to the Waitangi Golf Course Lookout for a fine view over the area. Then, a short distance farther, arrive at the Waitangi Treaty Grounds.

Waitangi Treaty Grounds

Visitors to this historic place become acquainted with the signing of the most significant pact between the Maori and Great Britain on February 6, 1840. See the historic Treaty House before strolling through the beautiful grounds and admiring an elaborately carved Marae (Maori meeting place), as well as a waka, a huge canoe that required over 70 warriors to paddle.

From here, head back to the Wharf, and tender back to the ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, approximately 500 yards (460 metres) downhill at the Treaty Grounds, with a few steps to climb. Participating guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair, able to get on and off the coach via steps, may not be able to access all of the sites. The order of sites seen may vary.

BAY-B / COASTAL DISCOVERY BY HELICOPTER

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$399; Duration:1.25 hrs

An opportunity to explore the unique and stunning coastline surrounding the Bay of Islands region and flying over the "Hole in the Rock" at Cape Brett.

The Bay of Islands offers some of the best coastal and island scenery in New Zealand, this helicopter scenic flight offers exceptional views of these beautiful islands leading to the infamous "Hole in the Rock".

Cape Brett Lighthouse

Join your minivan for a short transfer from the Wharf to the beachfront helipad in Paihia. Your flight heads across Russell with views over to Opua and surrounds before tracking along the stunning peninsula coastline to Cape Brett and it's lighthouse where you will experience an exciting turn to fly around the Hole in the Rock and its remote coastline on the Eastern side on the Cape Brett Peninsula.

Kerikeri Peninsula

The return portion of the flight flies directly over the main islands of the area with birds eye views of their white sandy beaches. Before coming into land you will see views of the Kerikeri Peninsula then past the Waitangi Treaty grounds and Paihia township before landing back at Paihia, where awaiting is your return transfer to the Wharf.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking and is not recommended for those who utilise a wheelchair. Guests must be able to embark and disembark the mini van and helicopter with minimal assistance. It operates in a chartered, 5-seater Longranger Helicopter, and minivan vehicles. A minimum/maximum of 4 guests is required for operation; space is very limited. Total flying time is approximately 30 minutes. Due to weight and balance limitations, as well as guest safety and comfort, the maximum weight per passenger is 297 pounds (135 kilograms/21 stones). Seating is at the pilot's discretion. All members of your party are required to submit their weight information to the Shore Concierge once on board. Operation of this tour is subject to favourable weather and wind conditions and may be cancelled by the pilot on short notice.

BAY-C / BAY OF ISLANDS MAORI HERITAGE

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$129; Duration: 5.00 hrs

An informative introduction to the history of New Zealand can be experienced on this tour as you learn both the Maori & European stories of their early beginnings. Other highlights include visiting the historic Kerikeri Basin, walking amongst the enormous Kauri trees and being welcomed onto a traditional Maori Marae (Meeting House), where the customs of the local tribe will be explained.

Kerikeri

Get acquainted with the rich traditions and culture of the Maori people, who have lived in this area for more than 800 years. After tendering to the wharf, you will be welcomed by your Maori guide and transferred to nearby Kerikeri. Stop for photos of the historic Kerikeri Basin, where two of New Zealand's oldest buildings are located, Kemp House and the Stone Store. Continue through the picturesque town of Kerikeri, well known for its citrus orchards, to the beautiful Puketi Forest.

Puketi Forest

Enjoy a short walk in the forest, which has many towering kauri trees, the largest of New Zealand's native trees. Once covering the whole of Northland, the kauri was grossly exploited for building timber in the late 19th century and there are now very few fine specimens of this gigantic tree still around

Traditional Marae

A special highlight will be a visit to a traditional Maori, Marae, or meeting place. You will drive through the lush green Northland countryside to the Marae. Here you will experience a traditional Maori welcome before entering the richly carved meeting house of the Maori people. The elders of the tribe will explain the carvings and the traditions of the Maori people to you. They trace their ancestry back to the Maori voyages to New Zealand from Polynesia, approximately 800 years ago. Juice or water will be served at the Marae.

Waitangi Reserve

Return to the Bay of Islands via Waimate North where, for a short time in the late 1830s and early 1840s, the influential Anglican Church established its New Zealand headquarters. Finally, pass by the many locations around Paihia and the Waitangi Reserve where Maori ancestors fiercely debated the Treaty of Waitangi - New Zealand's founding document, and to a viewpoint overlooking the grounds, before returning to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, approximately 500 yards (457 metres), with a few steps to climb. Participating guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair, able to get on and off the coach via steps, may not be able to access all of the sites. The order of sites seen may vary. If there is a tangi (funeral) the guests may visit a different Marae.

BAY-D / KAWITI GLOWWORM CAVES & KAWAKAWA

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$89: Duration:4.00 hrs

Explore this region's geological wonders dating back 300 years and see a multitude of stalactites and stalagmites within limestone caves covered with millions of glow worms at the Kawiti Glow Worm Caves. Get close enough to see the actual body of the glow worm and its blue/green tail light.

Kawiti Glow Worm Caves

Depart the pier with your driver-guide for a scenic drive into the countryside to the Kawiti Caves, which to this day are still owned by the Kawiti family, whose early founders fought against the British army. Follow your guide along a wooden boardwalk through a 655 foot (200 metre) limestone cave system. As you wonder at the glow worms above, your guide will explain the life cycle of the New Zealand glow worm (Arachnocampa Luminosa) and the intricate webs used to catch their prey (mosquitoes and midges). You will get close enough to see the actual body of the glow worm with its blue/green tail light, before making the return bushwalk walk through a natural corridor of karst rock formations and pristine rainforest. Re-board your coach for the short drive to Kawakawa, the quintessential New Zealand town.

Kawakawa

Next, visit nearby Kawakawa which still has a railway line running down the middle of its main street. However, its claim to fame is its public toilets designed by Friedensreich Hundertwasser, the famed Austrian architect and artist. With a thatched roof and a living tree, gold balls, mosaic tiling and bottle-glass windows all integrated into the structure, the colourful toilets are the unmistakable hallmarks of the Austrian-turned-New Zealand artist. They are without doubt the most photographed toilets in the world.

Re-board your coach for the drive back to the pier, travelling via the scenic village of Paihia.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking for a distance of approximately a half mile (1.2 kilometres) over undulating unpaved paths, with approximately 200 steps. Portions of the walk are on steep inclines and can be strenuous. Guests should be in good physical condition. This tour is not suitable for guests who suffer from claustrophobia, have limited mobility, or those who utilise a wheelchair. Dress in layers, bring a warm jacket and wear flat, comfortable walking shoes.

BAY-E / KAYAKING TO HARURU FALLS

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$109; Duration:3.00 hrs

Experience the pristine natural beauty of the Bay of Islands during this scenic kayaking excursion amidst the calm waters of the Waitangi Estuary. Waitangi Estuary Kayaking

After tendering ashore, meet your kayaking guide and walk across the Waitangi Bridge to the Coastal Kayakers base. Following your safety and kayaking instructions, board your two-passenger kayak and commence your guided kayaking excursion in the beautiful Waitangi Estuary.

Mangrove Trees

Along the way, pass by an abundance of mangrove trees. The lifeblood of the estuary, this unique tree features an extensive root system protruding out from under the water and is a favourite breeding-ground for many small fish.

Haruru Falls

At the end of the Waitangi Estuary is Haruru Falls, which are surrounded on one side by the beautiful Waitangi Forest. Although not especially high, the Haruru Falls are a spectacular sight nonetheless, especially after any recent rainfall. After a stop for light refreshments, commence the return transfer back to the wharf.

Upon arrival, walk back across the Waitangi Bridge and tender back to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of activity, including walking for approximately 700 yards (about 640 metres) and two hours of kayaking. After the tea break you will have some time to stroll through the park at your leisure. Get up close and personal with the animals and hand feed a kangaroo, wallaby, or emu. Other wildlife you may spot could include dingoes, possums, owls, foxes and Tasmanian Devils.

At the conclusion of your exciting visit to the park, re-board the coach and transfer back to your ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking over gravel paths. Most areas of the Wildlife Park are wheelchair accessible; however, wheelchairs are not permitted in animal enclosures. Adelaide, Goolwa, Coorong National Park, Wilderness Wetlands Cruise

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately two-hour drive to Goolwa. Upon arrival, embark your awaiting boat and begin your approximately 3.5-hour, 18.6-mile (about 30-kilometre) cruise into the world-renowned Coorong National Park wilderness wetlands.

Salt Water Lagoons, Archaeological Remains

The Coorong National Park is a protected area located in southern Australia approximately 97 miles (about 156 kilometres) southeast of Adelaide, and predominantly covers a lagoon ecosystem. Located southeast of Adelaide, Coorong National Park stretches over more than 81 miles (about 130 kilometres), protects string of saltwater lagoons and is considered an important archaeological site. The Park has great cultural significance to the Ngarrindjeri people, as it holds evidence of campsites used by the Aboriginal people thousands of years ago.

Morning Tea, Murray River, Goolwa Barrage, Seal Colony, Wetlands, Sand Dunes, Optional Walk

Morning tea is served whilst cruising along the Murray River en route to the Goolwa Barrage (weir). Pass through the barrage, and take in wonderful, up-close views of the long-nosed fur seal colony. Afterward, continue across the Murray Mouth and into the pristine wetland wilderness of Coorong National Park, famous as the setting for both *Storm Boy* movies. These stunning vistas host Australian native and migratory wetland birdlife, with the backdrop of spectacular high white-sand dunes. Take an optional guided walk through the dunes en route to the Southern Ocean Beach, and learn how the Aboriginal people lived in this area.

Lunch, Murray Mouth, Seal Colony, Goolwa

After re-boarding your boat, cruise further into the Coorong whilst enjoying a freshly-prepared lunch served with local wine. After lunch, cruise back to Goolwa across the Murray Mouth and past the seal colony.
