

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain you're selecting excursions that meet your physical capability. ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore- side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours. When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

For reasons of safety and comfort, smoking is not permitted on any tour vehicles used by Silversea. Your understanding in this matter is appreciated.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

KEL-B / KUALA LUMPUR IN DEPHT

DIFFICULTY

Explore the culture and heritage of Kuala Lumpur during this full-day sightseeing tour via coach and on foot.

Independence Square & Jamek Mosque

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to Independence Square. The former site of the Royal Selangor Club, Independence Square overlooks the main historical buildings of the city. After a photo stop here, walk over to the Jamek Mosque. Built in 1909, it is the oldest mosque in Kuala Lumpur, and features graceful arches and domes that are reminiscent of Moorish architecture.

Central Market, Sze Yeh Temple & Chinatown

Your walk continues on to the Central Market. Once a bustling wet market, this heritage building houses many shops offering antique clocks, jewellery, gems, woodcarvings, batik, pewter, and more. A stop is then made at a nearby coffee shop for a refreshing cup of local 'pull tea' and 'pratta ' bread. From here, walk to Chinatown for a visit to the Sze Yeh Temple, believed to be the oldest Chinese temple in Chinatown. 'Chi-Chong-Kai', as the local Chinese call Chinatown, is a fun place to shop and eat.

Sri Maha Mariamman Temple

Next, visit the Sri Maha Mariamman Temple. Built in 1968 to worship Goddess Mariamman, the temple features an approximately 75-foot-high (about 23-metre-high), five-tiered, pyramid-shaped tower adorned 228 Hindu gods and goddesses. Stop for lunch following your temple visit. Shoes must be removed at the Sri Maha Mariaman Temple prior to entering; you may wish to bring socks.

Petronas Twin Towers & Shopping

After lunch, a photo stop is made at the entrance to the magnificent, world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers, the world's tallest twin buildings. This 88-story structure soars to a dizzying height of 1,483 feet (452 metres) above the city skyline. Your tour concludes with approximately one hour of free time at the Suria KLCC, a modern, six-level shopping mall. You can sit and relax, or browse for mementoes in the wide array of retail shops.

At the designated time, re-join your coach and commence the approximately 80-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a total extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.2 miles (about 2 kilometres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and a total of 15/20 steps to go to the second floor of the Central Market. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Shoes must be removed at the Sri Maha Mariaman Temple prior to entering; you may wish to bring socks. Lunch is offered at Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL Tower.

KEL-F / KUALA LUMPUR ON YOUR OWN

This programme offers the flexibility of shopping and sightseeing at your own pace.

Depart by coach from the pier for a scenic drive to Kuala Lumpur, traveling past the township of Klang and viewing the beautiful passing sights. En-route, an experienced guide will be happy to answer your questions while pointing out several points of interest.

Following the one-hour drive from Port Klang, the coach delivers you to the Pavillion Shopping Complex. With over 450 retail shops spread across seven levels offering some of the world's most renowned brand names, you will be spoilt for choice. Within walking distance are Starhill, Lot 10, Bukit Bintang Plaza and Berjaya Times Square. From here, follow your own programme - your itinerary, on your schedule.

At the appointed time, meet the waiting coach where you originally arrived at the Pavilion Shopping Complex for the transfer back to Port Klang.

Please note: This coach transfer tour is intended for guests wishing to pursue their own interests in Kuala Lumpur. It provides round-trip coach transportation, accompanied by an English-speaking hostess. Lunch is on your own. The drive from Port Klang to Kuala Lumpur is approximately one hour in each direction. Local traffic conditions can cause traffic jams and therefore delays in the driving time for up to 1 hour.

KEL-G / GOLF AT SULTAN ABDUL AZIZ SHAH GOLF CLUB

Enjoy a day golfing at the Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Golf Club, the perfect getaway for golf and recreational pleasures. Designed by Ross Watson, the 18-hole course is carved out of an oil palm estate.

Depart the pier and travel along the modern highway towards suburb of Shah Alam Township. Kelab Golf Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah is the country's premier golf resort offering a 27-hole USGA class championship golf course, the first and only course in the world with all holes lit for night play. The 27-hole course is designed by world-renowned golf course designers, Thompson Wolveridge and Associates which is helmed by 5-time British Open Champion, Peter Thompson. Utilising the terrain's natural undulations and the lakes' natural beauty, combined with over 25,000 replanted trees and shrubs, the result is a scenic landscape that is most breathtaking. The course also encompasses mounds and foothills to provide golfers with the thrills they seek. The fairways here are broad yet the greens are deceivingly tricky.

Please note: Programme involves moderate to extensive activity and includes green fees, roundtrip transportation and shared cart. Club rental is USD 55 per set, right hand set only. A bucket of practice range balls is USD 10; a sleeve of new balls is USD 15. If available, caddy service is USD 18. All prices quoted in USD and are subject to change without notice. Optional rentals and purchases are not a part of the programme and are to be paid directly to the pro shop. Golf attire is mandatory; no jeans, tee-shirts or tank tops permitted. Golfers must wear soft-spiked golf shoes. Golf must be booked the latest 72 hours prior to play and is subject to cancellation charges if cancelled within this time. A minimum participation of two golfers is required to operate this tour.

KEL-H / KUALA LUMPUR & TWIN TOWER

Explore the highlights of Kuala Lumpur and world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers during this panoramic, full day sightseeing excursion.

National Museum

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to the National Museum. The country's premier museum, the National Museum is a repository for the nation's rich heritage and history. Built in 1963, the façade features a Minangkabau-styled roof with two impressive front murals. The museum showcases four main galleries; 'Early History', 'Malay Kingdoms', 'Colonial Era' and 'Malaysia Today'.

Independence Square & Heritage Building

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to Independence Square. A photo stop is made at the historical site where the Union Flag was lowered, and the Malaysian flag was raised for the very first time, at midnight on 31 August 1957. The flagpole is the highest in the world, towering 328 feet (100 meters) above the ground. Surrounding Independence Square is the Sultan Abdul Samad Building, which houses the Federated Malay States administration and High Court.

Central Market

Leaving Independence Square, take a guided stroll to the Central Market, one of Kuala Lumpur's most popular landmarks. Built in 1928, this former wet market war revamped and converted into a handicrafts outlet in the early-1980s, in. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to browse the Central Market for local handicrafts and souvenirs at your leisure. Following your visit, proceed for lunch at the Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL tower.

Petronas Twin Tower

After lunch, re-board your coach and head to the Petronas Twin Towers, twin skyscrapers in Kuala Lumpur. At a height of approximately 1,483 feet (about 452 metres), they were the tallest buildings in the world from 1998 to 2004, and remain the tallest twin towers in the world today. The buildings are a landmark of Kuala Lumpur, along with nearby Kuala Lumpur Tower. Take in amazing panoramic views over the city during a visit to the 42nd-storey SkyBridge connecting the two towers, and 88th-floor Observatory of the eastern tower. At the conclusion of your visit, reboard your coach and commence the approximately 75-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 0.65 miles (about 1.05 kilometres), at times over uneven surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 20 steps at the National Museum and Central Market; elevators are available at the Central Market. Walking at the Central Market and Petronas Twin Tower is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour. Guests must be at least 21 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. The tour sequence may vary to accommodate the available time slot at the Petronas Twin Tower. The Petronas Twin Towers requires inspection of bags prior to entering. Lunch is offered at Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL Tower.

Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment. The drive from Port Klang to Kuala Lumpur is approximately one hour in each direction. Local traffic conditions can cause traffic jams and therefore delays in the driving time for up to 1 hour.

KEL-I / AMVERTON COVE GOLF & ISLAND RESORT

Depart the pier and travel along the modern highway towards to Carey Island. The 18 hole course of Amverton Cove offers pleasure to champion and amateur golfers alike. Designed to bring out the best in every golfer, this challenging dream course has a very natural layout with link feel. Each hole is designed and sculptured accordingly to its natural setting with an individual feel and playing character.

This Course of championship caliber features strategically located sand hazards, ponds, lakes, mangrove forests and lush plantings amidst a picturesque landscape. Many run off areas call for a variety of options for approach and recovery shots. Putting form off the green and 'bump and run' shots will be common practice.

Mangrove forests border or cross 6 holes and a wonderful boardwalk to the back tees of hole 4 takes you on a 70 meter walk through the tidal forest and up close to the birds, crabs, mudskippers and other inhabitants of the frost. Lake comes into view or plays on 17 holes, creating both play strategy and wonderful views.

Please note: Programme involves moderate to extensive activity and includes green fees, roundtrip transportation and shared cart. Club rental is USD 30 per set, right hand set only. A bucket of practice range balls is USD 10; If available, caddy service is USD 15. All prices quoted in USD and are subject to change without notice. Trincomalee

Depart the pier for a picturesque sightseeing tour of Trincomalee and its surrounds. A natural deep-water harbour, Trincomalee has attracted seafarers for centuries; Ptolemy, Marco Polo, and traders from across Southeast Asia and China have all docked here. This seafaring town is also home to the largest Dutch fortress in Sri Lanka, as well as the oldest Hindu temple. Today, its pristine beaches are a hub for surfing, scuba diving, whale-watching and fishing.

Kon swaram Temple, Trincomalee City Drive

Your tour begins with a scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to the Kon swaram Temple. Dedicated to Lord Shiva, the Kon swaram Temple is nestled amidst the historic and much-fought-over Fort Fredrick, a 17th-century Dutch Fort. The original shrine was demolished in 1622 by the Portuguese, who called it the 'Temple of a Thousand Columns', and fortified the heights of the fort with material derived from its destruction. Some of the artefacts from the originally demolished temple were kept in the Lisbon Museum, including a stone inscription by King Kulakkottan. Leaving the temple and fort, take an orientation drive through one of the oldest cities in Asia, along with the sights, sounds, culture and architecture that reflect its glorious history as a bustling port.

Refreshment Stop, Velgam Vehera Temple Ruins, Brick Dagobas, Balustrades, Guard Stones

Following a brief refreshment stop at a local hotel, a final stop is made at Velgam Vehera, an important historic temple revered by both Sinhala and Tamil Buddhists. Built during the reign of King Devanampiyathissa (307 B.C.-267 B.C.) it's been declared an archaeological protected site by the Sri Lanka Archaeological Department. The collapse of the Anuradhapura and Polonnaruwa Kingdoms, which led to migration of the population to southern parts of Sri Lanka, resulted in the temple being abandoned and falling into ruin. During your guided walking tour of the ruins, see stone inscriptions, brick dagobas, balustrades and guard stones scattered around the temple complex. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 208 yards (about 190 metres), at times over uneven, stone, sandy, and grassy surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach,ten steps at the Velgam Vehera Temple, ten steps at the Welcombe Hotel and 15 steps at Kon swaram Temple. Learn about and observe the care, feeding and conservation of the elephants of Pinnawela during this memorable full-day tour to the Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage.

Depart the pier for a short 15-minute drive to the Colombo Railway Station. On arrival, board the train for the approximate 2-hour ride to Rambukana Railway Station where your coach will be waiting for the short transfer to the Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage. Rest assured, the short journey is well worth it! During the ride, take in the scenic beauty of the lush, green Sri Lankan countryside from the grandeur of your airconditioned train car.

Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage

The Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage was created to care for baby elephants found abandoned or orphaned. Today, approximately 80 animals are cared for, fed, studied and trained by the Sri Lankan Wildlife Authority. Once acclimated to a lifestyle in captivity, the elephants are unable to care for themselves in the wild. As a result, they grow up and reproduce in the protection of the reserve, and very small babies may be spotted amongst the ever-growing family.

Elephant Care, Bathing & Feeding

During your visit, the staff explains and demonstrates the care afforded to these magnificent animals, as well as the on-going battle for the conservation of their native habitats. If your timing is right, you can observe the staff helping the elephants take their daily bath in the nearby river. Your visit includes a relaxing lunch at the *Pinnalanda River View* restaurant, followed by an opportunity to watch the elephants being fed, as well as experiencing feeding them yourself!

At the conclusion of your visit, board your coach for the approximate 3.5 hour drive back to the pier. A comfort stop will be made en-route.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of walking for approximately 530 yards (484 metres) over uneven surfaces and 40 steps at the Colombo Railway Station, 60 steps at the Rambukkana Railway Station, 8 steps at the Pinnalanda River View Restaurant and 50 steps at the Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage. Ingiriya Tea Plantation

Depart the pier for the approximate 2-hour drive to the Ingiriya Tea Plantation .Formerly a British colony known as Ceylon, this small Indian Ocean island is famed for producing some of the finest teas in the world. Since the 1880s, Ceylon tea, the name by which it is still popularly known, has been the country's principal and most famous export; for generations, it has formed the backbone of the Sri Lankan economy, and plays a major part today in the country's fortunes. Arrive at the plantation to a special welcome with garlands made from tea leaves.

Gain firsthand knowledge on how tea is processed - beginning with the plucking from the tea bushes, to the grading of the finished product - as you tour a tea plantation and factory. For guests who would like to purchase some tea, a sales point is available within the complex.

Then, with rubber growing in the same region, you also witness a demonstration of the rubber tapping process by which the latex is extracted from the rubber tree. The rubber industry too occupies an important place in the economy of Sri Lanka and is the second most important plantation crop, as also a major foreign exchange earner.

Guided Tour & Tasting

Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of the facility and learn about tea-grading, packaging, bagging and more. Next, witness a tea-tasting session, and see how the expert tasters and packers offer tea aficionados a truly unique tea experience. A sales outlet is available in the lobby to purchase some tea before leaving.

Experience the added privilege of enjoying a cup of pure Ceylon tea before boarding your coach for the approximately 2-hour drive back to the pier.

A former haunt of Colombo high society, Galle Face Green is situated in the foreground of the Neo-classical facades of the Colombo Club and the *Galle Face Hotel*. After a refreshment stop at a local hotel, proceed for a visit to the Gangarama Temple, the nicest and most intimate of Colombo's Buddhist temples.

Afterwards, commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Explore the religious, cultural and artistic influences of Sri Lanka during this memorable, half-day visit to the Kelaniya Temple, with a shopping stop in Colombo.

Scenic Drive & Kelaniya Temple

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive into the countryside, and a visit to Kelaniya. Upon arrival, proceed for a visit to the Kelaniya Temple, an active Buddhist temple purportedly built on a site visited by the Buddha over 2,000 years ago. He is said to have preached his doctrine to a gathering of serpent kings here. Today, worshippers come to lay sprigs of lotus flowers around the great white 'dagoba', light oil lamps and sprinkle the base of the Tree of Enlightenment with purified water.

During your visit, marvel at the temple's fine drawings, lovely frescoes, fascinating, geometrically patterned ceilings, and three important images of Buddha; two seated and one reclining. Adorning the outer walls are more light-hearted works, including rows of whimsical dwarfs and elephants in bas-relief.

Shopping In Colombo

Following your visit, re-board your coach and return to Colombo for an opportunity to do some shopping. Colombo is renowned for its precious and semiprecious stones; sapphires, star rubies, topaz, garnets, citrine, and more can be found at the gems and jewellery outlet. Generally two venues are visited, a handicraft store and a jewellers.

Colombo and Geoffrey Bawa's former residence

Depart the pier for Colombo, capital and major port of Sri Lanka and a fascinating city that links the past with the present. Its culture and art are a unique mix of relics of Portuguese, Dutch and English settlements, blended with Indian influences.

Your tour begins at house number 11, on 33rd Lane, residence of renowned architect, the Late Geoffrey Bawa. It is an architectural bricolage housing arts and artefacts from his collection. This interesting composition in a row of four houses slowly acquired over a period of time, started with the construction of a pied-à-terre in 1958. The final result is an introspective labyrinth of rooms and garden courts which together create the illusion of limitless space. While the main house evokes a feeling of a lost world of verandahs and courtyards, the new tower serves as a periscope with views across the treetops towards the sea.

Panoramic drive and lunch

Re-board the vehicle for a panoramic drive past some of the city's highlights.

Lunch today is at Gallery Café - another legacy of Geoffrey Bawa. His former office now houses the café and art gallery run by Shanth Fernando.

National Museum and city sightseeing

Delve deeper into this culture at the elegant, white, colonnaded National Museum, the largest museum in Sri Lanka. View the fascinating and sometimes scary mask collection, which has its share of demons, including Prince Maha Kola, wearing a diadem of interwoven snakes. Another gallery contains a display of outstanding Hindu and Buddhist bronzes. One group of statuettes is connected with the cult of Shiva, and includes a fine sculpture of Shiva as "lord of the dance." Some of the images are mobile - not intended to be worshipped in the most sacred places, but destined for ritual processions around the temple or through the streets of the town. The museum also houses a collection of the regalia of the last King of Kandy.

At the conclusion of the tour, drive past the Colonial heritage of Colombo - the Old Parliament and government buildings; Galle Face Green where Colombo high society once strolled, to see and be seen by those who mattered, against the backdrop of the neo-classical facades of the Colombo Club and the Galle Face Hotel. Today there are joggers who talk politics and business as they run, and there may be kite flyers trying to catch a breeze.

This tour offers guests the opportunity to experience the natural wonder of the Vallée de Mai, home to the fabled Coco de Mer, a World Heritage Site. As well, spend some time at Praslin's glorious beaches, notably Côte d'Or Beach.

Vallée De Mai

Following the tender ride ashore, board your coach for the 15-minute drive to the Praslin National Park, set in the central hills and covering an area of more than one square mile. During a guided walk into this magical forest, feel an atmosphere of great tranquillity surround you. Only the carefully laid out paths betray the fact that human hands have been at work here to make the homeland of the coco de mer accessible to the visitor and to provide an idea of the vegetation existing on the island prior to the arrival of Europeans.

Follow your guide on a nature trail and learn about a variety of interesting botanical species. At times, the palm fronds form such a thick roof that the sun is obliterated. Even walking just a short distance into this green palm thicket will enable you to marvel at the endemic coco de mer palms, some of which grow 60 to 90 feet (18-28 metres) high. For many years, the origin of the palms' uniquely shaped fruit, which washed ashore on African and Asian coasts, was shrouded in mystery. One of the legends suggested that giant underwater trees produced them, thereby giving the heavy (up to 40 pounds, 18 kg), double-cheeked nut its name. During the early 1900s, this rare object was such a highly prised collector's item that one illustrious owner even had it embellished in gold. Following your walk, there is time for a quick look at the gift shop before reboarding the coach.

Côte d'Or Beach

Next, a 20-minute drive brings you to the coastal area. At lovely Côte d'Or Beach, have about an hour to relax, swim and enjoy a cold drink, while taking in the shoreline beauty. Your tour concludes with the drive back to the pier.

Victoria, Mahe, Helicopter Flight to Silhouette Island

Silhouette Island, Mount Dauban, Rainforest, La Passe Village, Trails, White-Sand Beaches

The island's white-sand beaches rim its mountainous interior. Silhouette's highest peak is Mount Dauban, which soars approximately 2,428 feet (about 740 meters) above a virgin rainforest filled with rare hardwoods, exotic orchids and carnivorous pitcher plants. The mountain was named for the Dauban family, which owned Silhouette until the 1960s. Silhouette's only settlement is the village of La Passe, on the island's western coast. The island has well-maintained trails, allowing visitors to explore beaches and some of the rainforest. Following your flight-seeing discovery of Silhouette Island, land at the helipad, de-board your helicopter and begin your guided walking tour.

Guided Walking Tour, Old Cemetery, Chapel, Hilton Labriz, Lunch, Beach, Indian Ocean, Free Time

At the conclusion of your visit, walk back to the jetty and helipad for check-in, and your panoramic, approximately 15-minute flight back to the helipad in Mahe. Upon arrival, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking (2.5 hours walking trail of historical sites), at times over uneven, sandy, and natural ground and exposed roots, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and board/de-board the helicopter, and 20 steps at the sites visited. Mahe - Seychelles

SEZ-B / ON THE SPICE ROUTE

DIFFICULTY

This full-day tour provides an excellent introduction to the Seychelles. Golden beaches stretch beneath spectacular granite peaks, covered in dense tropical vegetation, from which there are breathtaking views over turquoise seas. The tour begins with a guided visit to Victoria, the world's smallest capital. From the antique clock tower and the modern National Library Building to the bustling market, Victoria possesses a special charm. Explore the town with time for shopping before rejoining your coach to the Botanical Gardens.

Botanical Gardens

At the southern edge of Victoria lie some lovely gardens that are protected from development by their status as a national monument. Your guide shows you a delightful variety of rare and colourful plants including the endemic coco de mare. There is the possibility to see giant land tortoises and fruit bats. Following your tour of the gardens, continue your drive up the Bel Eau Road. A photo stop offers an excellent panoramic view of Victoria, including the port, yacht basin and the main buildings of the capital.

Mission Lodge Ruins

After driving up the spectacular Sans Souci Road where you see some of the island's cinnamon plantations, arrive at the Mission Lodge. Originally known as Venn's Town, the site was established as a school for children of freed slaves. Ruins blanketed with tropical greenery and a magnificent avenue of endemic trees are the only reminders of the school. A brief walk lets you enjoy this beautiful setting.

From here, a short drive brings you to a local hotel for refreshments. Then continue the scenic drive along lower Sans Souci Road, with views of mountain slopes covered with tea shrubs. Your sightseeing drive continues through picturesque fishing villages to the Batista Restaurant. Here, savor a delicious Creole lunch featuring local specialties served by the beach.

Craft Village

After lunch, visit the Craft Village, a cluster of colonial-style houses that evoke the island's fascinating past. The buildings' architecture gives a precise idea of how people lived between 1850 and 1950. A Creole house has been beautifully restored and furnished in the old colonial style. As you wander through this charming area, watch local artisans at their trade, such as weaving hats, making jewelry from shells, woodworking, painting on silk and transforming vegetable fibers into hats and baskets. Also found in the Craft Village is La Marine, a centre that makes and sells replicas of old style frigates and galleons that once plied the waters around the Seychelles' islands. Depart the Craft Village for Victoria, driving along the coastal road, and return to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1200 metres (3937 feet) with 20 steps at the Botanical Gardens & 25 steps at the Mission lodge, and some driving on winding roads. It is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair or those with limited mobility. Guests are advised to wear lightweight clothing and comfortable shoes and, if you wish, bring a beach towel from the ship.

SEZ-C / ST. ANNE MARINE PARK ADVENTURE

Explore St. Anne Marine National Park, the first designated marine park in the Indian Ocean. In this protected area, you are introduced to a variety of sea life through the windows of a semi-submersible vessel. The rest of the day is spent relaxing and enjoying the beach on Moyenne Island.

From the pier board your sailing catamaran and head out for St. Anne Marine National Park.

St. Anne Marine National Park

The park comprises the waters surrounding St. Anne, Moyenne, Round, Long and Cerf Islands. After a leisurely cruise around the islands, transfer from the catamaran to a semi-submersible boat for a 30-minute ride. Large viewing ports offer close-up views of over 150 species of tropical fish, including scorpion, parrot and butterfly fish and red gorgonian coral fans. Transfer back to the catamaran for fish feeding; en route enjoy a scenic cruise as your guide points out the sights in the marine park. Depart for Moyenne Island enjoying scenic views of the inner islands of St. Anne, Round and Long.

A sumptuous Creole buffet lunch will be served onboard while local musicians provide entertainment. Your afternoon on Moyenne Island includes time to relax on the beach or swim in the warm turquoise waters.

After this delightful day, re-board the catamaran for the sail back to the port and sip the local rum on the way.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity; guests need to negotiate getting on and off the boat and semi-submersible. It is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair or those with limited mobility. Snorkeling equipment is provided. Discover the exquisite tropical gardens and beaches along the south coast of Mahe during this sun-drenched, half-day sightseeing excursion. Victoria, Scenic Drive, South Coast of Mahe, Photo Stops, Beautiful Beaches

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately two-hour drive south to the Jardin de Roi. En route, take in stunning panoramic vistas of the south coast of Mahe, and photo stops at beautiful beaches. Situated high in the rainforest valley of south Mahe is the picturesque, approximately 85-acre (about 34.4-hectare) Jardin du Roi. This working plantation grows a splendid variety of spice plants, tropical fruit trees, essential oil plants and endemic palms.

Jardin Du Roi History, Walking Tour, Refreshments

In 1771, the famous Pierre Poivre, or 'Peter Pepper', decided that Seychelles' Mahe Island was situated at the perfect latitude for growing spices, an important commodity in those times. The site at the base of this hill was originally used for 10 years as a spice plantation, but was burnt to the ground in 1780 by Lieutenant Romainville, the commandant of the French military, who feared a British ship was approaching. The site lay dormant until a new plantation was created in 1860 by Mr William Green Sr., who extended the plantation into the virgin rainforest of this valley; descendants of the Green family still manage this operating plantation today. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of the Jardin Du Roi, followed by refreshments.

Anse Royale Beach, Free Time, Indian Ocean, Sunbathing, Swimming

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the nearby Anse Royale Beach, one of the finest beaches in the Seychelles. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to soak up the warm, tropical sun and/or take a dip in the inviting, crystal-clear seas of the Indian Ocean that kiss the shores of the Seychelles. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Enjoy the highlights of one of the world's smallest capitals. Your tour begins with the drive past Independence House which adjoins a large roundabout. A winged sculpture to commemorate Victoria's bicentennial (1770-1970) can be viewed from the coach. The town's central point is the silver-coloured clock tower, erected in 1903 as a replica of the tower at London's Vauxhall Bridge. Around the clock tower cluster bank buildings, the colonial-style law courts and the Anglican Cathedral. Then pass the National Museum, constructed in 1911 with an endowment from the British-born steel magnate, Andrew Carnegie. After driving up the spectacular Sans Souci Road, discover some of the island's cinnamon plantations before reaching your first stop.

Mission Lodge Ruins

Originally known as Venn's Town, the site was established as a school for children of freed slaves. Ruins blanketed with tropical greenery and a magnificent avenue of endemic trees are the only reminders of the school. While the children received a basic education, the adults worked as labourers in the surrounding plantations. A brief walk lets you enjoy this beautiful setting. Following your visit, a short drive brings you to the Tea Tavern where refreshments are served. Then continue the scenic drive along lower Sans Souci Road, with views of mountain slopes covered with tea shrubs. Pass through the coastal villages of Port Glaud and Grand Anse on the south coast and travel through dense vegetation of the La Misère Mountain Pass, enjoying more spectacular views of Victoria and the inner islands.

Botanical Gardens

On the return trip, visit these lovely gardens located at the southern edge of Victoria. The gardens are protected from development by their status as a national monument. Your guide shows you a remarkable variety of rare and colourful plants, including the endemic coco de mar, as well as giant land tortoises and fruit bats. The tour concludes with the return drive to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking and some driving on winding roads. It is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair or those with limited mobility. Guests are advised to wear lightweight clothing and comfortable shoes.

Your tour takes you to the northern center of the island where you will appreciate the lush vegetation, the towering granite peaks, the enchanting villages and its world-famous magnificent beaches.

Botanical Gardens

On arrival in Victoria, the small capital of the Archipelago, your first stop is to the Botanical Gardens which host some of the most representative species of local flora and fauna. You will also have a chance to see the colony of giant tortoises, a rare species of fruit bat and the Coco-de-mer, the largest seed in the world, and one of the symbols of the Seychelles.

Victoria Walking Tour

Next, enjoy a walking tour of Victoria where you will see and learn about the National Library, the Clock Tower, the National Museum, and the Cathedral and soak up the lively atmosphere of the local market.

Berjaya Beau Vallon Bay Resort

Next, re-board your vehicle for the short drive to Berjaya Beau Vallon Bay Resort where you will be greeted with a beverage and you will have some free time to relax, swim, take a stroll and soak in the sun near the crystal clear waters that hug the coastline of the Seychelles.

At the conclusion of the tour, re-board your vehicle for the short ride back to the pier.

Please Note: This tour requires a minimal to moderate amount of walking for approximately 900 meters (2952 feet) over sometimes uneven ground, exposed roots, and sand on the beach with approximately 10 steps at the Botanical Gardens. This tour is not suitable for guests who are confined to a wheelchair as the venues are not wheelchair accessible, however guests with limited mobility may participate with the assistance of their travelling companion. DAR-B / HISTORIC BAGAMOYO

DIFFICULTY

Significant historical associations have made Bagamoyo an interesting place to visit. Due to its location as a mainland port close to Zanzibar, Bagamoyo developed as a centre for caravans and trade in slaves and ivory. In addition, it was the terminus of the missionaries and the site of the first Roman Catholic Church in Tanzania. The body of famed explorer David Livingstone was brought here in 1874, after which it was carried for hundreds of miles from the interior. Renowned European explorers such as Speke, Burton, Stanley, Peters and Emin Pascha all visited Bagamoyo at one time or another.

Kaole Ruins

Depart the pier with the approximate 1-hour drive north. Make a stop at the Kaole Ruins to see the remains of mosques and tombs thought to have been in use between the 3rd and 4th centuries.

Lunch

From here, continue your drive to Bagamoyo, and proceed to the Travellers Lodge where a buffet lunch will be served. One hour for lunch, and another extra one hour for leisure and enjoy beach. Swimming is allowed but is subject to tide on particular day.

Holy Ghost Mission

After your lunch, next stop is the Holy Ghost Mission Complex, which consists of several buildings including the First Church which was established in 1872, the Father's House, the Mission Museum and the New Church, constructed from coral bricks in the early 1900's. David Livingstone's body was also brought here

Old Fort Photo Stop

At the conclusion of your visit, begin the return journey to Dar Es Salaam en-route you will pass the Old Fort, for a short photo stop. Dating from around 1860, the initial purpose of the Old Fort was to hold slaves until they could be shipped to Zanzibar. With its three stories, buttresses and battlements, it is quite an impressive sight. The building was used as a police post until 1992.

Your tour concludes at the pier to re-join the ship.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests are encouraged to drink plenty of water.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of activity with approximately 85 metres (279 feet) of walking and some extended periods standing during demonstrations and sightseeing. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. The distance to Bagamoyo is 45 miles (72 kilometres), approximately 1.5 hours drive each way. Guests must be aware that equipment and guides may not be up to Western standards but are the best available in this particular area; air conditioning in tour vehicles cannot be guaranteed. DAR-C / DAR ES SALAAM CITY & RELAXATION TOUR

DIFFICULTY

Raised from the humble surroundings of a fishing village just over a century ago, Dar es Salaam blossomed into one of the most beautiful seaside capitals. The modern history of Dar es Salaam dates from 1857 when the then Sultan of Zanzibar decided to turn the inland creek just south of Mzizima into a port and trading centre. Appropriately, this town was named Dar Es Salaam meaning "Heaven of Peace". Its importance rose with the steam ship services, which rendered the former port of Bagamoyo impractical. In 1891, the German High Commissioner transferred the seat of his government from Bagamoyo to Dar Es Salaam, and in 1902 a floating dock was made operational.

Your first stop will be a visit to the renowned National Museum. This outstanding attraction is known as the Hall of Man where Dr. Leakey's finds from Olduvai Gorge including the skull of Nutcrackerman (zinjanthropus bosei) and other human fossils are displayed. The stages of man's development over the last 10 million years are clearly traced and illustrated. The museum offers an outstanding ethnographic collection of tribal ornaments, head-dresses, witchcraft paraphernalia and traditional musical instruments collected from various regions in Tanzania. Also the history of the East African Coast is well portrayed with Chinese porcelain, glazed pottery, trade wide beads from India and a series of copper coins of the Sultan of Kilwa.

After an enjoyable visit we travel to Tinga Tinga, where we find a house or gallery if you will, of arts where local painters portray their skills in the local 'tinga tinga' art form. Sometimes referred to as crazy art, due to the very bright colour schemes and distorted figures of reality. At the Tinga Tinga center you will be able to see painters at work, and will have ample opportunity to purchase various souvenirs and household utilities that have been painted in Tinga Tinga style e.g. letter openers, trays, name plates, cup holders, key chains, as well as actual paintings on canvas.

After Tinga Tinga, continue to the White Sand Beach Resort, where a buffet lunch will be enjoyed

After lunch, next stop is the Village Museum which is located approximately 10 kms along Bagamoyo Road and has a collection of authentically constructed traditional houses of various Tanzanian tribes. It displays several distinct architectural styles with building materials ranging from sand, grass and poles to mud and rock. On certain days, villagers demonstrate their ancient skills of carving and weaving and offer their products for sale.

En route to ship, pass the State House which accommodates the offices of the President. It has an ornate structure reflecting a blend of African and Arabic architecture, partly built on the foundation of the old German Palace in 1922. We also pass a statue erected in memory of the African soldiers who lost their lives in WWI.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests are encouraged to drink plenty of water.

Please note: This tour involves an moderate amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Elevators are not available at visited sites nor at the restaurant. DAR-A / DAR ES SALAAM HIGHLIGHTS

This tour provides a look at Dar Es Salaam with some insight into daily activities. Departing the pier, drive through the city centre and toward Mnazi Moja Park where you can see a replica of the Uhuru Torch Monument. The original one was erected on Mt. Kilimanjaro to commemorate freedom from colonialism that came with independence.

We then have the opportunity to enjoy a more formal historical perspective at the National Museum. During your visit, see historical and archaeological items, among them Louis and Mary Leakey's finds from Olduvai Gorge. These human fossils displayed in the Hall of Man include the skull of the so-called Nutcracker Man. There is also a collection of tribal ornaments, headdresses, witchcraft paraphernalia and traditional musical instruments collected from various regions in Tanzania. (The museum is not air-conditioned.)

From here proceed with a drive to the Makumbusho Village Museum. Our tour takes us back in time as this is where we have an opportunity to learn more about the culture of the 120 different indigenous tribes. See the different architectural styles and use of building materials, in addition to possibly eyeing artists working on some more traditional crafts.

Thereafter we visit Tinga Tinga which displays traditional art that is unique to Tanzania. During the visit we will see the artists working on their colourful designs be it on canvas, house hold utensils, letter openers and even key rings.

From here, we head back to the port.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - quests should drink plenty of water.
