ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. DAR-B / HISTORIC BAGAMOYO

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$239; Duration:8.00 hrs

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Significant historical associations have made Bagamoyo an interesting place to visit. Due to its location as a mainland port close to Zanzibar, Bagamoyo developed as a centre for caravans and trade in slaves and ivory. In addition, it was the terminus of the missionaries and the site of the first Roman Catholic Church in Tanzania. The body of famed explorer David Livingstone was brought here in 1874, after which it was carried for hundreds of miles from the interior. Renowned European explorers such as Speke, Burton, Stanley, Peters and Emin Pascha all visited Bagamoyo at one time or another.

Kaole Ruins

Depart the pier with the approximate 1-hour drive north. Make a stop at the Kaole Ruins to see the remains of mosques and tombs thought to have been in use between the 3rd and 4th centuries.

Lunch

From here, continue your drive to Bagamoyo, and proceed to the Travellers Lodge where a buffet lunch will be served. One hour for lunch, and another extra one hour for leisure and enjoy beach. Swimming is allowed but is subject to tide on particular day.

Holy Ghost Mission

After your lunch, next stop is the Holy Ghost Mission Complex, which consists of several buildings including the First Church which was established in 1872, the Father's House, the Mission Museum and the New Church, constructed from coral bricks in the early 1900's. David Livingstone's body was also brought here

Old Fort Photo Stop

At the conclusion of your visit, begin the return journey to Dar Es Salaam en-route you will pass the Old Fort, for a short photo stop. Dating from around 1860, the initial purpose of the Old Fort was to hold slaves until they could be shipped to Zanzibar. With its three stories, buttresses and battlements, it is quite an impressive sight. The building was used as a police post until 1992.

Your tour concludes at the pier to re-join the ship.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests are encouraged to drink plenty of water.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of activity with approximately 85 metres (279 feet) of walking and some extended periods standing during demonstrations and sightseeing. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. The distance to Bagamoyo is 45 miles (72 kilometres), approximately 1.5 hours drive each way. Guests must be aware that equipment and guides may not be up to Western standards but are the best available in this particular area; air conditioning in tour vehicles cannot be guaranteed. There are no restrooms available until arrival at Bagamoyo. We recommend comfortable shoes, light layered clothing, sun hats, sun glasses and sun lotion. Also take along swimsuits and beach towels for optional swimming (depending on tides & time). Photography is not permitted in the museum unless payment is made. DAR-C / DAR ES SALAAM CITY & RELAXATION TOUR

DIFFICULTY

Raised from the humble surroundings of a fishing village just over a century ago, Dar es Salaam blossomed into one of the most beautiful seaside capitals. The modern history of Dar es Salaam dates from 1857 when the then Sultan of Zanzibar decided to turn the inland creek just south of Mzizima into a port and trading centre. Appropriately, this town was named Dar Es Salaam meaning "Heaven of Peace". Its importance rose with the steam ship services, which rendered the former port of Bagamoyo impractical. In 1891, the German High Commissioner transferred the seat of his government from Bagamoyo to Dar Es Salaam, and in 1902 a floating dock was made operational.

Your first stop will be a visit to the renowned National Museum. This outstanding attraction is known as the Hall of Man where Dr. Leakey's finds from Olduvai Gorge including the skull of Nutcrackerman (zinjanthropus bosei) and other human fossils are displayed. The stages of man's

development over the last 10 million years are clearly traced and illustrated. The museum offers an outstanding ethnographic collection of tribal ornaments, head-dresses, witchcraft paraphernalia and traditional musical instruments collected from various regions in Tanzania. Also the history of the East African Coast is well portrayed with Chinese porcelain, glazed pottery, trade wide beads from India and a series of copper coins of the Sultan of Kilwa.

After an enjoyable visit we travel to Tinga Tinga, where we find a house or gallery if you will, of arts where local painters portray their skills in the local 'tinga tinga' art form. Sometimes referred to as crazy art, due to the very bright colour schemes and distorted figures of reality. At the Tinga Tinga center you will be able to see painters at work, and will have ample opportunity to purchase various souvenirs and household utilities that have been painted in Tinga Tinga style e.g. letter openers, trays, name plates, cup holders, key chains, as well as actual paintings on canvas.

After Tinga Tinga, continue to the White Sand Beach Resort, where a buffet lunch will be enjoyed

After lunch, next stop is the Village Museum which is located approximately 10 kms along Bagamoyo Road and has a collection of authentically constructed traditional houses of various Tanzanian tribes. It displays several distinct architectural styles with building materials ranging from sand, grass and poles to mud and rock. On certain days, villagers demonstrate their ancient skills of carving and weaving and offer their products for sale.

En route to ship, pass the State House which accommodates the offices of the President. It has an ornate structure reflecting a blend of African and Arabic architecture, partly built on the foundation of the old German Palace in 1922. We also pass a statue erected in memory of the African soldiers who lost their lives in WWI.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests are encouraged to drink plenty of water.

Please note: This tour involves an moderate amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Elevators are not available at visited sites nor at the restaurant. Guests must be aware that equipment and guides may not be up to Western standards but are the best available in this particular area; air conditioning in tour vehicles cannot be guaranteed. There are no restrooms available on the coaches. Guests are recommended to please ensure to first ask locals if they wish to take their photo. No photography of police/army or White House is allowed. Photography is not permitted in the museum unless payment is made. The fees vary for each museum and for camera size. We recommend comfortable shoes, light layered clothing, sun hats, sun glasses and sun lotion. Also take along swimsuits and beach towels for optional swimming.

DAR-A / DAR ES SALAAM HIGHLIGHTS

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 3.00 hrs

This tour provides a look at Dar Es Salaam with some insight into daily activities. Departing the pier, drive through the city centre and toward Mnazi Moja Park where you can see a replica of the Uhuru Torch Monument. The original one was erected on Mt. Kilimanjaro to commemorate freedom from colonialism that came with independence.

We then have the opportunity to enjoy a more formal historical perspective at the National Museum. During your visit, see historical and archaeological items, among them Louis and Mary Leakey's finds from Olduvai Gorge. These human fossils displayed in the Hall of Man include the skull of the so-called Nutcracker Man. There is also a collection of tribal ornaments, headdresses, witchcraft paraphernalia and traditional musical instruments collected from various regions in Tanzania. (The museum is not air-conditioned.)

From here proceed with a drive to the Makumbusho Village Museum. Our tour takes us back in time as this is where we have an opportunity to learn more about the culture of the 120 different indigenous tribes. See the different architectural styles and use of building materials, in addition to possibly eyeing artists working on some more traditional crafts.

Thereafter we visit Tinga Tinga which displays traditional art that is unique to Tanzania. During the visit we will see the artists working on their colourful designs be it on canvas, house hold utensils, letter openers and even key rings.

From here, we head back to the port.

The climate is extremely hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests should drink plenty of water.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of waking to and from the coaches and venues and extended periods of standing during demonstrations, approximately 8 steps at the National Museum (no elevators). This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. We recommend guests wear comfortable shoes and casual, light layered clothing, sunglasses, hats and sun

lotion. Guests must be aware that equipment and guides may not be up to Western standards but are the best available in this particular area; air conditioning in tour vehicles cannot be guaranteed. Guests are recommended to please ensure to first ask locals if they wish to take their photo. No photography of police/army or White House is allowed. ZAN-B / MAHARUBI PALACE RUINS & SPICE PLANTATION

Taking a spice tour in Zanzibar provides a good way to understand why Zanzibar and spices are synonymous. In the 19th century, the Sultan of Oman introduced cloves to the island, which today is Zanzibar's main export product.

Depart from the pier and drive past the house of Dr. David Livingstone, where he stayed while planning his explorations into the interior.

You will visit the ruins of Maruhubi Palace, built by Sultan Barghash, the third Arab sultan of Zanzibar, who used the building to accommodate his wife and concubines. The sultan himself lived in a separate palace in Zanzibar Town. In 1899 the Maruhubi Palace was destroyed by a fire, leaving only a few remains, including some massive stone columns which supported a large wooden balcony which surrounded the upper floor.

Proceed to the countryside, where we offer the first time visitor a look at and taste of the spices grown mostly in off-road regions not easily accessible. You will stop in a luscious green clearing, where examples of spice plants are available for you to smell, taste, touch and see, you will get to see what the products you normally buy in packets or jars in supermarkets look and taste like fresh off the plant. The great variety of spices and plants grown here is used in food flavouring and preparation, cosmetics, dyes and traditional medicines. A local boy will climb up a tall coconut tree while you are walking through the spice area, to reach those plants situated high of the ground, as he then uses his legs to shimmy back down the swaying palm. It is possible depending upon the season to sample some of the edible fruits. Spice packets are available for sale on the rustic tables set up whenever visitors are spotted.

After this experience, you will continue with a visit to the Persian baths at Kidichi, built by the first Sultan for his Persian wife. Then commence your return back to the pier.

Over time, the Baobab has adapted to its environment. It is a succulent, which means that during the rainy season it absorbs and stores water in its vast trunk, enabling it to produce a nutrient-dense fruit in the dry season when all around is dry and arid. This is how it became known as "The Tree of Life".

Next, drive across the Choungui Pass and enjoy a view of the volcanic mountain named Choungui Peak, one of 11 peaks on Mayotte and ranked the second highest on the island measuring 1,946 feet (593 metres). The highest peak is Mont Bénara however only visible from far out at sea.

Re-board your vehicle and depart for a photo stop at Tahiti Beach to admire the beautiful landscape. Tahiti beach is one of the most beautiful beaches in Mayotte with its clear water and sand and location away from noise.

Your next stop will take you inland through lush and green scenery en-route for the Botanical Gardens where you will enjoy local fresh fruit juice and fruits in a beautiful garden setting with scents of spices of the island. Upon arrival you are met by a Zulu guide and served a welcome refreshment. Then you are invited to relive the excitement and romance of the days of King Shaka, the King of the Zulus.

Walking through the village, you will see a variety of displays including Zulu women creating beadwork, weaving mats, sculpting pottery, baking bread and brewing Zulu beer. The Zulu men will show you how to make a spear & shield and how to build a Zulu 'beehive' grass hut. Your guide will interpret the daily activities and you will have the opportunity to view a short audio-visual presentation.

Next, you are invited into the Chief's Hut where Zulu dancers will perform rhythmic drum dances and tribal members will recreate a ritual by the Sangoma (traditional healer).

Following this performance, a traditional Zulu buffet dinner will be provided at a restaurant overlooking the Umhlatuze Lake.

Before re-boarding your coach for the return drive to Richard's Bay and your awaiting ship, some leisure time is available to explore the village on your own and to visit the local curio shops.

Take this opportunity to learn more about the important contribution this organization is making internationally, during this half-day outing to 'Give Back'.

Depart from the quayside in Durban and drive by coach to SOS Children's Village.

This Village was developed in response to a call for help from a city pediatrician, who was concerned at the high number of orphans abandoned at government hospitals. The Village houses 152 children, as well as reaching 962 children in the highly successful Family Strengthening Programs.

In 1992, the Natal Emergency Help Program was launched to provide temporary accommodation in rented houses for orphans living in very poor conditions in government hospitals. Once suitable land was found, a Village was built consisting of 15 family homes and an SOS Kindergarten.

The SOS Kindergarten caters for 125 children in 5 classrooms. Children in the nearby informal settlement who could normally not afford to attend pre-school are offered a scholarship to come to the Kindergarten. The teachers are also committed to building the capacity of teachers in community crèche's, by conducting holiday skills training sessions.

The Family Strengthening Program operates in the informal settlement called France, situated close to the Village. A hydroponics vegetable project has been established with the support of the Premier of KwaZulu-Natal's wife, Mrs. Ndebele. Nine women from France grow and market tomatoes and mushrooms, thus generating income for their own families. Another successful project is the self-help groups which involve poor women in small-scale savings and income generation.

On arrival at the village proceed to visit the Family Strengthening Program, a community project next to the village where the homes are headed by children. Here you will visit two or three homes and then continue to the 'White House', where everything is coordinated for the project e.g. Distribution of food parcels, bereavement programs, South Africa Department of Home Affairs help with Birth certificates and Identity Documents. You will also visit the knitting, sewing or gardening projects in the community with a presentation from your coordinator.

Return to the village which caters for the little ones as well as children from the nearby community. Proceed on a tour of the village and a presentation. After the presentation and tour, spend some time at the 'house of the week'. The Village has a few different houses with a House Mother and each week a house has the opportunity to be 'house of the week', during the presentation this will be discussed in more detail.

Return to the quayside in Durban.

Tea, coffee and refreshments are served during the course of the tour and there is time to browse through a wealth of ethnic home crafts on sale in the well-stocked curio shop, ranging from pottery, Zulu fabric art, woodcarving, beadwork and curios.

Eastern and African aromas envelop you, as you wander past herb and spice stalls or sort through baskets of delightful wooden carvings. The offerings are endless and you will have a brief time to shop and explore on your own.

Following your visit, drive along the 'Golden Mile' (beachfront), where Zulus, resplendent in their colourful regalia, transport visitors in their colourful rickshaws.

Before returning to the pier, pass by the Juma Mosque, which is reputedly the largest in the Southern Hemisphere and is famous for its massive golden dome and turrets.

Experience a taste of the Xhosa culture on this half-day memorable excursion to Khaya La Bantu.

Depart the quayside and drive through East London, passing Orient and Eastern Beaches en-route. Travel along the national highway toward the former homeland, known as the Transkei, enjoying views of rolling hills, farmland and traditional Xhosa villages en route to Khaya La Bantu, an open-air, Xhosa cultural museum.

On arrival at this reproduction of a traditional village, you will be welcomed by the local villagers and invited to join them at the community centre, which the villagers built by hand using mud for the walls and thatch for the roof. Wooden benches provide seating. Please ask the locals for premission to take pictures of them.

At the community centre, listen as one of the representatives introduces you to the various Xhosa customs and traditions and a performance of traditional dance and song.

You are then invited to join your guide for a walk through the village. See the traditional *kraal*, a round building of interwoven branches that houses cattle, pigs, goats and chickens. The friendly villagers invite you to look into their huts as they explain the techniques used to build them.

Complimentary refreshments will be served at the community centre and you will have the opportunity to taste a variety of traditional Xhosa foods, including samp(de-hulled dried corn) & beans, wild spinach with maize-rice, and pot-breads.

During your visit, a variety of handicrafts including beadwork and clothing will be on display and are available for purchase.

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the return drive to the harbour and your awaiting ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking outdoors for approximately 985 feet (300 metres) and it is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair or for those with limited mobility. The terrain at Khaya La Bantu is mainly grass and uneven ground and it can get slightly muddy after heavy rain. On arrival at Inkwenkwezi, you are welcomed by a group of Xhosa singers and dancers. Sip a welcome drink before boarding the 4x4 open-air canvas-topped vehicles.

Enjoy a two-hour game drive in search of a variety of game, including rhino, wildebeest, giraffe, warthog, zebra, springbok, impala, gemsbok and the rare Eastern Cape kudu. The bird life includes gracious crested crane, secretary bird, ground hornbill and ostrich.

Following your game drive return to the main lodge for a comfort stop before re-boarding your coach for the transfer back to East London

Please note: This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Although little walking is required (656 feet / 200 metres) on this tour, it is suggested only for those guests able to tolerate the rough ride of an open-air vehicle traveling on unpaved surfaces. ELS-D / CANOEING ON THE NAHOONE RIVER

Get an up-close look at nature surrounding East London during this fluid kayak adventure.

Depart the quayside and proceed to East London's city centre. Drive along Oxford Street, passing the City Hall, built in 1897, in the 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign. Today, the City Hall is graced with a statue of the martyred activist, Stephen Biko.

In 1836, the British established East London as a military post, which they used as a base during the Xhosa wars. The arrival of German settlers, who had been serving as mercenaries in the British-German Legion, gave the place at the mouth of the Buffalo River an economic boost - and in 1873 East London was given town rights.

Continue past the East London Museum, which was established in 1921. It is home to a number of fine exhibits, including the type specimen of the coelacanth, a fish previously believed to have become extinct some 80 million years ago.

Your canoeing adventure will take place on the Nahoon River and takes approximately 2 hours. There will be a qualified lifeguard on each canoe trail and lifejackets will be worn by all participants. Fluid kayaks will be used which are very stable and take two people each with a maximum carrying capacity of 485 pounds (220 kilograms/ 35 stone). It is a tidal estuary and there is abundant birdlife including kingfishers, cormorants, herons (a large nesting colony) darters, wooly necked stalk, sacred ibis, Egyptian geese, blacksmith plover, egret, occasional fish eagle, osprey and goliath heron sightings. Dassies are frequently seen and some mullet can be seen jumping out of the water to escape predatory fish, and if you are really lucky you may encounter an otter or sea lion in the river. There are some beautiful riverside properties to be seen as well as some small uninhabited islands. The total distance covered will be 1-3 miles (3-6 kilometres) depending on weather conditions and the fitness of the group.

Thereafter, return to the quayside, passing the residential suburbs of East London, as well as Orient & Eastern beaches en-route.

Please note: This tourinvolves extensive activity and is recommended for guests in good physical condition. Life jackets are provided and must be worn at all times while on the water. Guests should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, water shoes and ample sun protection. Kayaks are 2-person style with a maximum capacity of 485 pounds (220 kilograms / 35 stone). A waiver is required to be signed in order to participate in this tour. If you are pregnant, have had a recent operation or have a medical condition that may be deemed unsafe to paddle (if unsure please ask us), for safety reasons you may not be able to paddle. It is suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair, able to embark and disembark the coach via steps. This tour is not recommended to guests with limited mobility. The cable car visit at Table Mountain is strictly weather-permitting. If the cableway is closed, a visit the South African Natural History Museum is substituted. Wear flat, comfortable walking shoes, sunglasses, and a windbreaker-type jacket, as the wind can get cool at the summit. Please remember to bring your camera. Signal Hill is a regularly visited area for the locals in Cape Town and there could be unforeseen traffic congestion. Should there be unforeseen traffic congestion on the day of the tour we would not recommend going to Signal Hill, and a suitable alternative venue will be pre-advised. After an orientation drive through Stellenbosch, enjoy an hour at leisure to explore the town on your own. Pay a visit to the Stellenbosch Museum, which comprises four different houses depicting different eras - Schreuder House, 1709; Bletterman House, 1788; Grosvenor House, 1800 to 1830 and the OM Bergh House, 1850 (optional and for your own account). Stellenbosch

It is a university town famous for its carefully preserved architectural heritage, which includes examples of Cape Dutch, Georgian and Victorian styles as seen on Dorp Street, which is lined with houses, cottages and shops. Rows of oaks and open spaces, where jagged lines of trees etched against white walls diffuse the heat of summer, transform the streets into soft, shady tunnels. The oaks have been proclaimed national monuments.

After an orientation tour through this lovely town, from free time is afford for you to explore further on foot. Browse the shops, stroll through the town, or if you wish, visit the Stellenbosch Museum (optional and on your account), which comprises four different houses depicting different eras (Schreuder House, 1709; Bletterman House, 1788; Grosvenor House, 1800 to 1830 and the OM Bergh House, 1850).

At the appointed time, re-join the group at the coach for the drive back Cape Town and the ship.

From the summit, the natural protected area stretching from Signal Hill to Cape Point has been managed under the custodianship of the National Parks Board. This area has one of the highest concentrations of endemic plant and animal species in any area of its size, containing a staggering 2,285 plant species, more than that of the entire United Kingdom.

Re-board the cable car for the descent, and begin the return to the ship via a short orientation tour of the city of Cape Town.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking and it is suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair, able to embark/disembark the coach via steps and accompanied by someone to offer assistance. Table Mountain

Ascend from the Valley Station 1190 feet (363 metres) to the Mountain Station 3477 feet (1,060m) in a Swiss engineered Rotair cable car. The journey from the base to the summit takes just under 4 minutes where you will enjoy spectacular views as the floor of the car rotates 360 degrees during the ascent and descent.

Table Mountain gets her name from the flat topped central massif of the mountain, which viewed from the city, is surrounded by Devil's Peak on the left, Lion's Head on the right and Signal Hill in the foreground. They form a sort of amphitheatre that encloses the city centre and some of the older suburbs. Discover Cape Town's "Mother City" with its meticulously preserved Edwardian and Victorian buildings en-route to the Cape Town International Airport.

Proceed up Adderley Street, the principal thoroughfare of Cape Town, passing notable buildings which include the Groote Kerk and St. George's Cathedral. Also pass by Castle of Good Hope and the City Hall, before driving up Kloof Nek.

Next, continue to the summit of Signal Hill which connects Kloof Nek to Lion's Head. Views from the high summit at 1148 feet (350 metres) are nothing short of spectacular. Signal Hill rewards visitors with views of Table Mountain, the City, Cape Town Harbour, Table Bay, Robben Island, the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront, Cape Town Stadium and beachfront suburbs of Mouille Point and Sea Point.

Signal Hill is also one of the only places in the world where critically endangered Peninsula Shale Renosterveld (PSR) vegetation can still be found. It used to be the dominant ecosystem of the Cape Town City Bowl. However, urban growth has now covered most of this ecosystem, and along with a tiny patch on Devil's Peak, Signal Hill has the only surviving sample of this vegetation in the world.

Following the visit, continue to Camps Bay and then enjoy a scenic drive along the Atlantic seaboard, passing through the residential suburbs of Clifton, Bantry Bay, Sea Point and Green Point en-route.

Lastly, pass by the impressive Cape Town Stadium before continuing the airport.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking and is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests with limited mobility must be able to embark/disembark the coach via steps with little to no assistance. There are paved surfaces at the main car park and viewpoint area on Signal Hill however should guests wander away from the main car park and viewpoint area, the terrain does become uneven. Flat, comfortable walking shoes and a sun hat are strongly recommended. This tour is weather permitting. Signal Hill is a regularly visited area for locals; should there be unforeseen traffic congestion a suitable alternative will be pre-advised.
