General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Experience a gorgeous scenic flight across Table Bay to the Wine Valley of Durbanville and one of the best wine estates in the region, De Grendel. De Grendel means "the latch" in Dutch - this farm was historically the gateway on the route to the inland settlements of Durbanville and Stellenbosch which had to be opened to traverse the Tygerberg.

Upon being greeted at the pier, take a short transfer to the helipad at the Waterfront and view a short safety briefing before take-off.

Enjoy the scenic flight across Table Bay to the Wine Valley of Durbanville - one of the smallest wine regions in South Africa. Few places on earth offer such a spectacular outlook. Nestled atop Tygerberg Hill, surveying its surroundings with unparalleled 270 degree panoramas, De Grendel showcases Table Mountain, the city of Cape Town and the seaboard all in one landscape. Just 20 minutes from the city, this dramatic expanse of land offers perspective and accessibility.

Relax and immerse yourself in the wonders of the landscape while enjoying a wine tasting before flying back to the helipad at the Waterfront.

Your tour concludes with a short transfer back to the pier.

Stellenbosch is the capital of the Cape Winelands and was named after its founder, Governor Simon van der Stel who discovered the broad fertile valley of the Eerste River in 1680. In 1685, it was just the second town to be founded in South Africa. Today Stellenbosch is a major university town, characterized by Cape Dutch-style architecture and streets lined with oak trees, some of which have been declared national monuments. The reason most visitors come to Stellenbosch is to sample the wonderful wines of the area. There are over 200 estates that offer wine tasting in Stellenbosch. The estates are impressive and ornate, with grand manor houses and beautiful grounds. From the pier, a one-hour journey takes you to Stellenbosch, the heart of the Cape's heritage and hospitality.

After an orientation drive through Stellenbosch, enjoy an hour at leisure to explore the town on your own. Pay a visit to the Stellenbosch Museum, which comprises four different houses depicting different eras - Schreuder House, 1709; Bletterman House, 1788; Grosvenor House, 1800 to 1830 and the OM Bergh House, 1850 (optional and for your own account). Alternatively, you may wish to browse through the variety of curio shops.

After this visit, stop at one of the wine estates in the Stellenbosch area to enjoy a wine tasting and gain a glimpse of the fascinating skills practiced in the cellar. Return to Cape Town harbour along the N2 national road.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, some of which is at your discretion. There are steps at some of the wine estates. Depending on which estate is visited, this tour may not be suitable for guests in wheelchairs. This tour is not recommended to guests with limited mobility.

CPT-I / THE WINELANDS

Stellenbosch, the capital of the Cape Winelands boasts over 200 estates, impressive and ornate, with grand manor houses and beautiful grounds. The wine produced here travels around the globe. Indulge your senses on this full-day tour to South Africa's most renowned wine country, with wine tasting.

Meet your guide and coach on the pier and begin the easterly drive towards the famous Cape Winelands, set below the dramatic range of mountains called the 'Hottentots Holland'. White-washed homesteads nestling under avenues of oaks, rolling green hills covered with wild flowers, fertile valleys alive with the sounds of surging streams, restaurants with French names and Dutch flavours - such is the setting of the Winelands. It is home of some of the world's finest wines and Stellenbosch, the second oldest town in South Africa after Cape Town.

Wine-Tasting

An hour's drive takes you to the town of Paarl, surrounded by fruit and wine farms in the Berg River Valley beneath the imposing granite rocks of Paarl Mountain. Drive up a mountain road to visit the unique Taal Monument, the only monument ever built to immortalise a language, the Afrikaans language. Stop at the top of Paarl Mountain to admire the awe-inspiring vistas over the town, vineyards and mountains. Afterwards, leave the coach at a local wine estate for a guided tour of the cellar, followed by a formal wine tasting.

Franschhoek

Re-board the coach and continue to the lush Franschhoek Valley and the Huguenot village of Franschhoek, 'French Corner'. The area was originally known as Olifants Hoek, 'Elephant's Corner', after elephants took to calving in the sheltered valley with its plentiful supply of food and water.

Wine Estate Lunch

Pay a brief visit to the Huguenot Monument, situated at the foot of the Franschhoek Pass, which commemorates the arrival of the Huguenots in South Africa. The adjoining Huguenot Memorial Museum focuses on the genealogy of the Huguenot families. Your morning of touring concludes at a local wine estate, where a light lunch, with wine awaits.

Stellenbosch

After lunch, travel to Stellenbosch or 'Town of Oaks', the second oldest town in South Africa, founded by Governor Simon van der Stel in 1679. It is a university town famous for its carefully preserved architectural heritage, which includes examples of Cape Dutch, Georgian and Victorian styles as seen on Dorp Street, which is lined with houses, cottages and shops. Rows of oaks and open spaces, where jagged lines of trees etched against white walls diffuse the heat of summer, transform the streets into soft, shady tunnels. The oaks have been proclaimed national monuments.

After an orientation tour through this lovely town, from free time is afford for you to explore further on foot. Browse the shops, stroll through the town, or if you wish, visit the Stellenbosch Museum (optional and on your account), which comprises four different houses depicting different eras (Schreuder House, 1709; Bletterman House, 1788; Grosvenor House, 1800 to 1830 and the OM Bergh House, 1850).

At the appointed time, re-join the group at the coach for the drive back Cape Town and the ship.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, some of which is at each guest's discretion. There are steps and uneven surfaces at many of the wine estates. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and not all venues are wheelchair accessible. Wear comfortable walking shoes and bring protection from the sun. Depending on the number of participants, this tour may be split into groups that visit different yet comparable wine estates. Order of sites may vary.

CPT-M / GOURMET FOOD & WINE TOUR

Discover the splendid beauty, estates and flavours of the Western Cape during this exclusive, full-day gourmet food-and-wine excursion.

Cape Town, Western Cape, Somerset West, Valley, Hottentots Holland Mountains, Food & Wine

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive along the N2 National Highway to Somerset West, which lies in the valley beneath the Hottentots Holland Mountains. The Western Cape is blessed with a climate which enables world-class wines to be made here amidst breathtakingly beautiful scenery and historic estates. The region is also an epicurean's dream, with a host of top-quality restaurants offering a myriad of internationally classic, yet uniquely local taste sensations. On this exclusive gourmet experience, sample some of the award-winning wines and locally-made specialities of the Western Cape.

Estate Visits, Wine, Olive and Olive Oil Tastings, Octagonal Garden and Manor House Tours

Your first stop is at a lovely estate for a tasting of some of its wines, and a guided stroll through the Octagonal Garden and historic Manor House. This estate is recognized as a leading wine estate in South Africa, and has a history going back over 300 years. Following your visit, re-board your coach and proceed for a wine, olive and olive oil tasting at a second estate. This estate produces an extra virgin olive oil judged best in the world at a prestigious competition in Italy.

Stellenbosch Town, Gourmet Restaurant, Lunch, Estate Visit, Wine-and-Cheese Tastings

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to historic Stellenbosch. The second-oldest town in South Africa, it is known as the 'town of oaks'. Upon arrival, proceed for lunch at a gourmet restaurant. After lunch, re-board your coach and take a picturesque drive through Stellenbosch Town en route to a visit to a final estate. Here, sample their wines and award-winning, handcrafted cheeses. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 492 yards (about 450 metres), at times over uneven and natural surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the wine estates. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Pelican Point, Cape Fur Seal Colony, Kuiseb River Delta

Next, travel further along the beach to Pelican Point. Upon arrival, view a large, Cape Fur seal colony and our resident ospreys, as well as African black oystercatchers. Depending on weather and time, return through the Kuiseb River Delta with a possible sighting of the dune lark, sabota lark and/or Orange River white-eye. Your Walvis Bay bird-watching tour concludes back at the pier.

The Namib Desert is the oldest desert in the world. The word Namib means 'place of emptiness'. Come and discover the life in this desolate landscape, while exploring the dune landscape.

Depart the pier in 4x4 vehicles and proceed to the dunes. The drive along the foot of the dunes is slow, taking precaution not to drive on the gravel plains and cause unnecessary damage. Conservation issues and the geological structure of the desert are discussed en route.

Continue on an exhilarating 4x4 adventure over dunes, stopping to try to find rare desert species. The guide will stop frequently to look for tracks (known locally as reading the bushman paper) to determine which creatures were active the night before and wherever possible, will try to catch some of them. Guides will share their knowledge about each little desert animal, including adaptations and design for survival in the desert. Great care is taken to ensure each animal is returned safely to its home.

Perhaps you will find the White Lady Spider (which generally only moves after dark) as she rolls down a dune to escape and possibly see her dance at the bottom to defend herself. Maybe you will discover the elusive Palmato gecko, a nocturnal reptile, which is also transparent - see his vertebrae, blood veins and large eyes.

The Desert Sidewinder Adder is also an inhabitant of the dunes. Follow his caterpillar tracks across a dune slip-face and you may find him lying submerged in ambush for an unsuspecting Aporasaure Sand Diving Lizard. You may also spot the Namaqua Chameleon and various other little beetles, lizards and geckos that live and survive in the hot desert conditions. Experience the silence and much more.

Return to the quayside via the coastal road.

São Tomé National Museum

You will have time to discover this lovely sixteenth-century church independently.

Re-boarding your coach, your guide takes you on a panoramic drive through the town, pointing out important sites including the Presidential Palace and colonial homes. Note that it is forbidden to take pictures of the Presidential House.

Local Market

Next, continue to learn about the culture of this Island by visiting Independence Square where you will see more first-hand influence of the Portuguese people. Takoradi

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 30-minute drive from Takoradi to Sekondi. En route, drive through Takoradi Port and learn about the history of the port's railway. From here, take a panoramic drive past Monkey Hill and the adjoining wetlands. In the centre of the metropolis, see the unique virgin forest, which is inhabited by monkeys and birds.

Sekondi and Fishing Harbour

Your drive continues past Regional Hospital and along the beach road before reaching Sekondi. Upon arrival, take a sightseeing drive through the city. Learn about the history of Sekondi whilst passing such historic landmarks as Fort Orange, built by the Dutch, European Town, old Colonial buildings, High Court, commercial and old residential buildings, and the historic Railway Station with its wall clock. Next, a stop is made at the Bosumtwi Sam Fishing Harbour. Here, observe the loading and unloading of fish, mending of nets, boatyard, and women buying and preparing fish.

Market Circle and Cultural Show

Afterward, drive past Takoradi Market Circle and through the main commercial streets, including John Sarbah Road and New John Sarbah Road, before taking a guided stroll through the colourful, bustling Market Circle. Your tour concludes with a cultural show and refreshments at a local hotel. Following your visit, re-board your coach for the brief drive back to the port and shopping at the Harbour Bazaar before returning to the ship.

Takoradi - Ghana

TAK-E / PEOPLE & CASTLES

Discover traditional peoples and ancient, historic sites on this fascinating tour that explores village culture and the history of the Gold Coast African slave trade. Drive approximately 90 minutes via coach from Takoradi Port to visit a traditional fishing village typical to this region. The first thing to do upon arrival at the village is to pay a courtesy call on the Chief and his elder; then you are free to interact with the rest of the community.

Observe the villagers go about their daily business, including Gari processing; Gari is a staple food in West Africa made from cassava a root crop which is cultivated commonly in the region and matures between 4 and 6 months. The matured tubers are uprooted, peeled, washed and grated squeeze out the starch and heat dried. It can be stored for up to 6 months.

Also observe the century-old methods the villagers use for smoking the fish they catch; learn about the Chorkor smoker, a rectangular or circular earthen structure molded with clay with an open top and side. Wood is arranged and burned at the opened side for smoking the fish.

There is also the opportunity to visit the community school to watch a brief performance. Interact with the students for a bit before making your way to the next destination.

Drive 20 minutes to the Cape Coast Castle to receive a guided tour of this castle and museum (the West African Historical Museum). The castle was built by the Swedes in 1652 and was later taken over by the British. It served as the seat of the former colonial administration of the then Gold Coast (Ghana's former name) until 1877 when it was relocated to Accra. The Castle also houses the West African Historical Museum, where your guide takes you to see the slave quarters and Palaver Hall, where slaves were bargained for and sold.

Next drive to the Coconut Grove Beach Resort for lunch and cultural entertainment before continuing on to Elmina Castle. Built by the Portuguese in 1482, Elmina Castle was eventually the headquarters for a slave auction market. See the slave dungeons and condemned cells where slaves who attempted to escape were incarcerated. View its interior and exterior architecture.

Though this region is full of dark and difficult history, it is set amidst stark natural beauty. Enjoy panoramic views of the Fishing Harbor and Old Township from the castle. Return to the pier.

The climate is hot & humid, therefore a risk of dehydration - guests are encouraged to drink plenty of water.

Please Note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking at times over uneven, cobblestone, rocky, sandy, grassy, and natural surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, many steps at the sites visited and some extended periods standing during demonstrations and sightseeing. TAK-D / DRUM, DANCE & CASTLE

Commence your approximately 90 minute drive from Takoradi Port to Elmina fishing village.

Upon arrival, visit a resident Cultural Troupe at the National Centre to participate in a drumming and dancing class which affords you the opportunity of getting closer to the many types of African drums, the beat, rhythms and dance steps. This is your opportunity to learn a few steps or hit a few beats that are authentically African. Enjoy also a cold local refreshments with the cultural group.

After approximately 20 minute drive, reach to Elmina Castle. Arrive for photo opportunity of the exterior of the Elmina Castle which was built by the Europeans (Portuguese in 1471). Of interest also are the local fishing Harbour with its numerous dugout Canoes and the Elmina Castle the first structure of its kind built by substance on African soil. This was built by the Portuguese in 1482 and later used as a slave auction market.

Enjoy a short scenic drive to Coconut Grove Beach Resort for Lunch and relaxing time.

Casablanca, High Atlas Mountains, Marrakech, Medina, Gueliz

This famous landmark dominates the local skyline, and can easily be spotted from all of Marrakech. Afterward, head to the Dar Si Said Museum. A large, palatial home built in the second-half of the 19th century, the museum is one of the most impressive buildings in Marrakech.

Moroccan Lunch, Bahia Palace, Horse-Carriage-Ride, Majorelle Gardens

Leaving the museum, proceed on-foot for a Moroccan lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, a visit is made to the late-19th-century Bahia Palace. The beauty of the Bahia Palace makes it a remarkable example of 19th-century Eastern architecture, and offers an accurate depiction of how the privileged lived during the 19th century in the Imperial city. Jemaa el-Fnaa Square

Upon arrival your guide will show you the most interesting sights during a pleasant, approximately 30-minute walk through the city centre including the Alcazar of Jerez, an impressive 12th Century Moorish fortress, the Cathedral, the bustling Plaza de Arenal and the 'Gallo Azul' a favourite spot for photographers.

Bodega Tradición

This will be followed by a visit to Bodega Tradición, which is situated in the historical district of Jerez, and where, during the Muslim Empire, it was part of the walled city. All the types of sherry which are produced here have been classified by the Guarantee of Origin Regulatory Board, with a minimum age of 20 years, or V.O.R.S. - very old rare sherry vinum optimum rare signatum - a wine which has been aged for more than 30 years.

You will have the opportunity to try different varieties of sherry and brandy in this unique atmosphere of the bodega after the guided visit.

The cellar is an excellent example of the architectural tradition of the beginning of the 19th century, typical of this era, with small windows allowing only a little light to enter, thick walls, sandy floors and high ceilings. Bodegas Tradición also possesses an impressive art gallery containing a selection of paintings from the Joaquin Rivero Collection of Spanish Art, one of the most important on public display in the whole of Andalusia. It is a private collection and brings together 300 major works by the great masters of Spanish Art from the 15th to the 19th centuries.

A section of the winery has been carefully restored and houses a permanent exhibition of these works of art.

All guests will be invited to take part in a unique journey through Spanish History, as all the artistic movements that have characterized Spanish painting over the centuries are represented. Córdoba

The ancient Romans founded Córdoba due to its strategic importance as the Moorish Kingdom of Al-Andalus in 711 AD. At this time, work began on the Mosque of Córdoba, or 'La Mezquita'. After several centuries of actions and extensions, the mosque became one of the largest in all of Islam.

When the Christians conquered the city in 1236 the new rulers of the city were owed by the mosque's beauty that they left it standing, building their cathedral within, and creating the extraordinary structure seen today. Covering over 248,000 square feet, la Mezquita is considered one of the most beautiful and original buildings in all of Spain.

Jewish Quarter
