ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Explore the culture and heritage of Kuala Lumpur during this full-day sightseeing tour via coach and on foot.

Independence Square & Jamek Mosque

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to Independence Square. The former site of the Royal Selangor Club, Independence Square overlooks the main historical buildings of the city. After a photo stop here, walk over to the Jamek Mosque. Built in 1909, it is the oldest mosque in Kuala Lumpur, and features graceful arches and domes that are reminiscent of Moorish architecture.

Central Market, Sze Yeh Temple & Chinatown

Your walk continues on to the Central Market. Once a bustling wet market, this heritage building houses many shops offering antique clocks, jewellery, gems, woodcarvings, batik, pewter, and more. A stop is then made at a nearby coffee shop for a refreshing cup of local 'pull tea' and 'pratta' bread. From here, walk to Chinatown for a visit to the Sze Yeh Temple, believed to be the oldest Chinese temple in Chinatown. 'Chi-Chong-Kai', as the local Chinese call Chinatown, is a fun place to shop and eat.

Sri Maha Mariamman Temple

Next, visit the Sri Maha Mariamman Temple. Built in 1968 to worship Goddess Mariamman, the temple features an approximately 75-foot-high (about 23-metre-high), five-tiered, pyramid-shaped tower adorned 228 Hindu gods and goddesses. Stop for lunch following your temple visit. Shoes must be removed at the Sri Maha Mariaman Temple prior to entering; you may wish to bring socks.

Petronas Twin Towers & Shopping

After lunch, a photo stop is made at the entrance to the magnificent, world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers, the world's tallest twin buildings. This 88-story structure soars to a dizzying height of 1,483 feet (452 metres) above the city skyline. Your tour concludes with approximately one hour of free time at the Suria KLCC, a modern, six-level shopping mall. You can sit and relax, or browse for mementoes in the wide array of retail shops.

At the designated time, re-join your coach and commence the approximately 80-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a total extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.2 miles (about 2 kilometres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and a total of 15/20 steps to go to the second floor of the Central Market. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Shoes must be removed at the Sri Maha Mariaman Temple prior to entering; you may wish to bring socks. Lunch is offered at Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL Tower.

This programme offers the flexibility of shopping and sightseeing at your own pace.

Depart by coach from the pier for a scenic drive to Kuala Lumpur, traveling past the township of Klang and viewing the beautiful passing sights. En-route, an experienced guide will be happy to answer your questions while pointing out several points of interest.

Following the one-hour drive from Port Klang, the coach delivers you to the Pavillion Shopping Complex. With over 450 retail shops spread across seven levels offering some of the world's most renowned brand names, you will be spoilt for choice. Within walking distance are Starhill, Lot 10, Bukit Bintang Plaza and Berjaya Times Square. From here, follow your own programme - your itinerary, on your schedule.

At the appointed time, meet the waiting coach where you originally arrived at the Pavilion Shopping Complex for the transfer back to Port Klang.

Please note: This coach transfer tour is intended for guests wishing to pursue their own interests in Kuala Lumpur. It provides round-trip coach transportation, accompanied by an English-speaking hostess. Lunch is on your own. The drive from Port Klang to Kuala Lumpur is approximately one hour in each direction. Local traffic conditions can cause traffic jams and therefore delays in the driving time for up to 1 hour.

Explore the highlights of Kuala Lumpur and world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers during this panoramic, full day sightseeing excursion.

National Museum

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to the National Museum. The country's premier museum, the National Museum is a repository for the nation's rich heritage and history. Built in 1963, the façade features a Minangkabau-styled roof with two impressive front murals. The museum showcases four main galleries; 'Early History', 'Malay Kingdoms', 'Colonial Era' and 'Malaysia Today'.

Independence Square & Heritage Building

Next, re-board your coach and proceed to Independence Square. A photo stop is made at the historical site where the Union Flag was lowered, and the Malaysian flag was raised for the very first time, at midnight on 31 August 1957. The flagpole is the highest in the world, towering 328 feet (100 meters) above the ground. Surrounding Independence Square is the Sultan Abdul Samad Building, which houses the Federated Malay States administration and High Court.

Central Market

Leaving Independence Square, take a guided stroll to the Central Market, one of Kuala Lumpur's most popular landmarks. Built in 1928, this former wet market was revamped and converted into a handicrafts outlet in the early-1980s. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to browse the Central Market for local handicrafts and souvenirs at your leisure. Following your visit, proceed for lunch at the Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL tower.

Petronas Twin Tower

After lunch, re-board your coach and head to the Petronas Twin Towers, twin skyscrapers in Kuala Lumpur. At a height of approximately 1,483 feet (about 452 metres), they were the tallest buildings in the world from 1998 to 2004, and remain the tallest twin towers in the world today. The buildings are a landmark of Kuala Lumpur, along with nearby Kuala Lumpur Tower. Take in amazing panoramic views over the city during a visit to the 42nd-storey SkyBridge connecting the two towers, and 88th-floor Observatory of the eastern tower. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 75-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 0.65 miles (about 1.05 kilometres), at times over uneven surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 20 steps at the National Museum and Central Market; elevators are available at the Central Market. Walking at the Central Market and Petronas Twin Tower is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour. Guests must be at least 21 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. The tour sequence may vary to accommodate the available time slot at the Petronas Twin Tower. The Petronas Twin Towers requires inspection of bags prior to entering. Lunch is offered at Atmosphere 360, the revolving restaurant in the KL Tower.

National Monument and Independence Square

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to the National Monument. Designed by acclaimed sculptor Felix De Weldon, this 50-foot-high (15-metre-high) bronze monument was constructed in 1966. After a photo stop here, re-board your coach and drive past the railway station en route to a photo stop at Independence Square. The former site of the Royal Selangor Club, Independence Square overlooks the main historical buildings of the city.

Jamek Mosque and KL Tower

Next, proceed to the Jamek Mosque. Built in 1909, it is the oldest mosque in Kuala Lumpur, and features graceful arches and domes that are reminiscent of Moorish architecture. After a photo stop here, your tour concludes with a visit to KL Tower. Upon arrival, proceed to the Observation Deck for breath-taking panoramic views of the city.

Following your visit, re-board the coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Batu Caves and Pewter Factory

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 1.5-hour drive to the limestone outcrops of the Batu Caves. Upon arrival, ascend the 272 steps en route to the Cave Temple to view elaborately painted sculptures of various Hindu gods inside. From here, proceed for a guided tour of the Royal Selangor Factory. Royal Selangor is the world's largest producer of quality pewter housewares and gifts, and internationally recognised for its innovative design and superior craftsmanship.

Petronas Twin Towers

Afterwards, proceed to the magnificent, world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers, the world's tallest twin buildings. This 88-story structure soars to a dizzying height of 1,483 feet (452 metres) above the city skyline.

Following a photo stop at the entrance to the Petronas Twin Towers, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 65-minute drive back to the pier.

An impressive landmark by day, Shwedagon becomes a stunning vision by night as the ancient, jewel-encrusted stupa is illuminated with light. Explore the temple, home to major Buddhist relics on this evening tour.

Shwedagon Pagoda by Night

The 2,500-year-old Shwedagon dominates the city from its hillside location and attracts tens of thousands of pilgrims each year. This amazing site exudes a unique atmosphere, both serene and exciting. Rising 300 feet to its blazing crest, this spiritual center is covered with 60 tons of gold leaf, gold and silver bells, rubies, sapphires and topaz. The meticulously maintained pagoda was built to house eight sacred hairs of the Buddha.

Follow your guide up the escalator to the temple on the third level. During a walking tour of approximately one hour you will learn about the history and significance of this impressive complex. Before the journey is over enjoy participating in the candle lighting ceremony.

Then, board your coach for the return transfer to the pier in Thilawa.
