

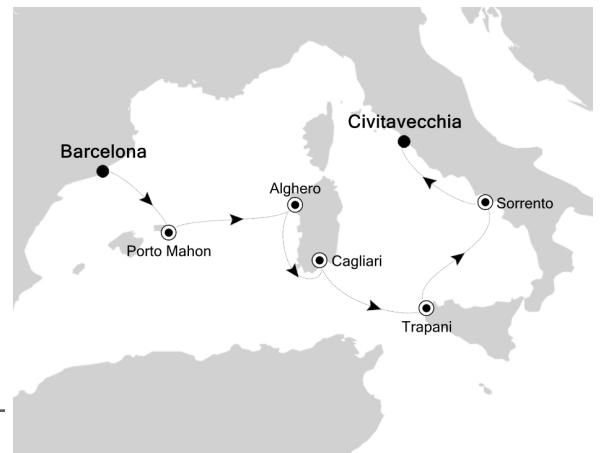

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

TOUR SUITABILITY

At Silversea we offer a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. Some excursions are decidedly only for the physically fit and active guest. Each excursion offered is clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain you're selecting excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the tour description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information and attend the port talks onboard. If you still have any questions or concerns regarding this, please contact Shore Concierge (shoreconcierge@silversea.com) prior to your cruise or visit the Shore Concierge desk for more detailed information once onboard.

ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or bespoke tailor-made tour, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you in ensuring your shore-side experiences are nothing less than a memory that lasts forever.

The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting you on tour. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicle for daily office opening hours.

When contemplating a tailor-made program onboard, please contact the Shore Concierge team as early as possible at the beginning of your cruise, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements have been confirmed, 100% cancellation fee will be applied. Unfortunately, we are unable to change or cancel airline tickets, car rental, hotel or any other reservations you made previously with your travel agent or on your own. In many ports of call there may be a local hospitality representative on board to provide additional information, for two hours after the ship's arrival. In some ports, local information may be found in the tourist information centre ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. To ensure the safety of our younger guests, children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service, if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment, to accommodate a child. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for local guides and drivers are not included in the excursion price. It is customary to tip tour guides and drivers. Such gratuities if extended, should be done so on a voluntary, individual basis.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, kindly refrain from using mobile telephones while on tour so as not to interfere with the guide's explanation. Most tours make frequent stops, allowing time for guests to use their mobile telephones. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

SMOKING

For reasons of safety and comfort, smoking is not permitted on any tour vehicles used by Silversea. Your understanding in this matter is appreciated.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

At some museums, sites and monuments, photography and/or the use of video cameras may not be allowed or may incur a charge. These charges are not included in the tour price and are at guests' own expense.

SHOPPING STOPS

While our organised excursions are not generally geared to the serious shopper, some tours allow for short shopping stops as indicated in the tour description. In the interest of all tour participants, guests should adhere to the allotted time and return to the tour vehicle promptly as advised by the tour guide or ship's escort. Please Note: The selection of shops is generally left to the discretion of the tour operator. Silversea does require that establishments be reputable, of general interest to our guests and offer quality goods. However, all purchases are the responsibility of the individual.

BCN-A / GAUDI'S BARCELONA

DIFFICULTY



Price:\$99; Duration:5.00 hrs

Discover the whimsical art of the city's most famous architect, Antonio Gaudí, during this scenic, half-day sightseeing tour of Barcelona. Depart the pier for the drive through the centre of the city towards the north and Colonia Güell.

Colonia Güell

A jewel of modernism still relatively unknown to the big public, Colonia Güell remains today as one of the most secret treasures of Catalan architecture genius Antoni Gaudí. Conceived as an industrial village to accommodate factory workers, Gaudí was in charge of building the church of the installations and even though the temple remained unfinished, the crypt is considered a culminating point of his works: the construction including for the first time practically all of his architectural innovations. After a guided visit, your tour continues on with a visit to the Church of the Holy Family, or, 'La Sagrada Família'.

La Sagrada Família

This monumental but unfinished church is Gaudí's most famous masterpiece. Its towering spires are Barcelona's most prominent landmark. Many of the steeples Gaudí envisioned have not yet been built, and much of the structure is still exposed to the heavens. Take a walk around this unfinished church on an exterior visit for photos before continuing your drive through the Eixample District.

Eixample District Tour

The Eixample District is home to some of Barcelona's most stunning examples of Modernist architecture, especially along the elegant Passeig de Gràcia. Important buildings such as the Pedrera House, the Batlló House and the Amatller House line this impressive thoroughfare.

Casa Batlló

Next, a visit is made to Casa Batlló. Originally a residence of a wealthy industrialist, Gaudí completely renovated the building between 1904 and 1906, and its façade is unsurpassed in the entire city. There are no corners; even the walls are rounded and the tile roof depicts the back of a dragon. Your guided walking tour of this Gaudí masterpiece includes the impressive main floor and rooftop, which features whimsical chimneys and offers spectacular views over the city.

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, with several steps to negotiate at the Casa Batlló (4 floors). It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Barcelona's City Government will no longer allow motor-coaches to drive by or stop near the Sagrada Família. Respectful attire that covers the shoulders and knees should be worn in order to enter the crypt. Photos and video are not allowed inside the crypt. Motor-coaches are required to park in a parking lot approximately 2-3 blocks away from the Sagrada Família. This will add an approximate 10 to 15 minute walk to and from Sagrada Família (30 minutes total) and the order of sites visited may vary.

BCN-C / BARCELONA CITY SIGHTS

Experience the beauty of Barcelona during this scenic panoramic tour of the city and its surrounding areas.

Olympic Port

Departing the pier, your immersion into Barcelona's history will be immediate with a pass by the Columbus Monument and the Old Port, while on your way to the Arc de Triomf and the Ciutadella Park; both the legacy from the 1888 World Exhibition and, the latter, once the garrison that protected the city. After a short drive arrive at Barcelona's Olympic port and enjoy some free time to really experience this window into the Mediterranean and the seducing atmosphere of this beautifully renovated restaurant and yacht's promenade.

Passeig de Gràcia

Itinerary, all arrangements, and prices are subject to change without notice. Silversea reserves the right to correct any errors or omissions. Please refer to my.silversea.com for the most current schedules, fares and complete terms and conditions.

Going back from shore side into town, your coach will proceed through Marina Avenue towards Diagonal until reaching the worldwide famous boulevard of Passeig de Gràcia; the tribute to modernism hosting Barcelona's most famed buildings, among those Antoni Gaudi's Casa Mila and Casa Batlló.

Montjuic Hill

Complete this panoramic tour with a drive through Plaça Espanya, the Fair and Congress Palace and María Cristina Avenue on the way to Montjuic Hill. Enjoy a photo stop from a scenic Montjuic's mirador with some of the best views over the city.

Return on your coach to the pier and your ship.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking; however, all guests must be able to embark/disembark the coach via steps. Guests are not allowed to remain on the vehicle during any of the stops. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair (foldable wheelchairs only). The tour sequence may vary. Wear comfortable clothing and flat walking shoes for the stops and free time.

BCN-D / HELICOPTER OVER BARCELONA

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$499; Duration: 0.67 hrs



Experience the beauty of Barcelona from a unique perspective during this scenic and exhilarating flight-seeing excursion over the coast of Barcelona city.

Depart the pier for the brief transfer to the helipad on Barcelona's harbour. Upon arrival, receive your safety and tour briefing before boarding the helicopter and commencing your 10-minute flightseeing tour.

After lift-off, marvel at the natural boundaries of Barcelona, including the mountains, rivers and the sea. In addition, take in splendid views from the coast of Barcelona where you will be able to see from a distance the most iconic landmarks as the city gates, the Forum, Torre Agbar, Gaudi's temple - La Sagrada Familia, Tibidabo Hills, avenues, and squares.

Your tour concludes with a brief transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking and is suitable for guests with limited mobility, able to climb in and out of the helicopter. Tour is priced based on a minimum of three guests per helicopter; the helicopter may not be exclusive to Silversea if all seats are not occupied. Seating on the helicopter is at the discretion of the pilot, based on weight and balance of the aircraft (window seat cannot be guaranteed). Maximum participant weight is 242 pounds (110 kg/17 stone). Provider reserves the right to weigh all passengers before boarding the helicopter to confirm passenger weight. Guest will have to occupy and pay two spaces if over weight limit. Flight route may vary and the tour's operation is subject to favourable weather conditions; please also note that aircraft weight balance might occasionally be altered by unforeseen atmospheric conditions (excessive Summer heat peak, for example) and if safety scales read negative, provider are obliged by law to cancel all flights in such a case. The helicopter flies through the coast of Barcelona to minimise noise. Guests should be comfortable flying in a light weight aircraft and not suffer from motion sickness. All guests must bring their passports. Participation is very limited; we suggest you book early.

PRM-A / HIGHLIGHTS OF MENORCA

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$99; Duration: 4.00 hrs

Discover an eclectic blend of prehistoric sites, picturesque landscapes, quaint villages and splendid holiday resorts during this half-day outing in Menorca. With natural parks, a rich cultural heritage, delicious local products and cuisine for you to discover, Menorca is not only stunning beaches, soaring cliffs and tiny islands with marine reserves teeming with life.

Depart the pier for the drive to the island's interior along the main road that divides Menorca into north and south.

Monte Toro

Itinerary, all arrangements, and prices are subject to change without notice. Silversea reserves the right to correct any errors or omissions. Please refer to my.silversea.com for the most current schedules, fares and complete terms and conditions.

At Es Mercadal, your coach leaves the main road and follows the steep and twisting pathway to the summit of Monte Toro, which is shared by a 16th-century church, a monastery, a bar-restaurant and a souvenir shop. From atop Monte Toro, take in panoramic views across the island in all directions.

Torralba d'en Salord

After descending Monte Toro, proceed for the drive to the renowned megalithic site of Torralba d'en Salord. Upon arrival, take a guided tour to see one of the well-preserved taulas found only on Menorca. These table-like structures, with a large stone slab resting on a monolith, are remains from the Talayot era, a megalithic civilisation that flourished in the Mediterranean between 1500 B.C. and the Roman conquest.

Cova d'en Xoroi

Next, your drive continues south to Cova d'en Xoroi, a series of caves situated in a scenic location in the cliffs near the holiday settlement of Cala'n Porter. Upon arrival, there are winding wooden steps leading to the caves' entrance. Once inside, visit the cave bar for a refreshing beverage. The uniqueness of the cave is well worth negotiating the walk down.

Following your tour, re-board your coach for the return drive to the harbour.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, at times on rocky, uneven ground, with 100 steps to negotiate at the entrance of Cova d'en Xoroi. Total distance covered is approximately 300m (328 yards). It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and those who utilise a wheelchair. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, walking shoes and sun protection.

PRM-B / NORTH, SOUTH & MAHON

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$69; Duration: 4.00 hrs

Discover the coastal beauty of Menorca during this scenic excursion to the Village of Fornells, Son Bou Beach, and a visit to Mahon. This traditional town of fishermen has become a major reference thanks to its outstanding fish restaurants and an unparalleled variety of nautical sports that can be practiced in the shelter of its bay. In their white-washed houses, the inhabitants of Fornells have always kept a calm life of respect with nature.

Depart the pier for the approximately 20-minute drive through the fertile north countryside to the fishing village of Fornells.

Fornells

Your first stop is to the picturesque fishing village of Fornells, set on a magnificent bay of the same name. An important harbour in days gone past for ships to take shelter from the strong north winds, today this village is now a pleasure ground for watersports which include windsurfing, kayaking and sailing. Fornells is also very well known locally for its fish restaurants and the King of Spain is amongst the many famous people that come here to eat the Menorcan Caldereta, a dish based on local lobster.

Son Bou Beach

Your tour continues to the largest sandy beach on the island, Son Bou Beach backs onto the open countryside and is relatively undisturbed in terms of modern development. However, there are still some hotels, holiday complexes, a few shoppes, bars, restaurants, and a discotheque nearby. Upon arrival, a brief photo stop is made at this scenic locale.

Mahon

The tour returns to Mahon where you will leave the coach at the main square and walk downhill back to the harbour through the centre of town. The walk through this attractive town gives one a glimpse of the different phases in the islands turbulent history, the many architectural styles reflecting the frequent changes of rule. The centre offers an interesting mix of narrow streets lines with whitewashed houses, wide open squares and grand historical buildings.

You may opt to skip the walking tour and return directly back to the ship via coach.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Distance covered is approximately 900m (.55 miles) on mainly flat areas with some uneven surfaces, gravel and cobblestones. There is a slight incline in Fornells from parking area to village. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, walking shoes and sun protection.

PRM-D / HALF DAY SCUBA ADVENTURE

DIFFICULTY



Price: \$149; Duration: 4.50 hrs



This yet unspoiled island offers some of the most unique and spectacular diving in this part of the Mediterranean. On your dive you will be able to experience the pleasures of diving in crystal clear turquoise waters where the visibility can reach more than 50 meters (164 feet).

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Dive Centre. Receive your diving instructions and equipment and board your dive boat for the ride out to S'Algar, a pristine island located off the beautiful south coast of Menorca.

Scuba Dive

Itinerary, all arrangements, and prices are subject to change without notice. Silversea reserves the right to correct any errors or omissions. Please refer to my.silversea.com for the most current schedules, fares and complete terms and conditions.

Upon arrival, begin your guided diving excursion in the crystal-clear turquoise waters of the Mediterranean. Along the way, explore caverns, swim-throughs, overhangs, etc. for every level, even beginners. Even if you are not into "caves" you will find the topography of Menorca under water, well worth a dive.

Refreshments are served on-board the boat. At the conclusion of your diving excursion, return to the Dive Centre, and then transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of activity, and is recommended for guests in good physical condition and that are certified divers. If guests have not completed a certified and logged dive within 2 years, a refresher dive is required before being able to participate in this programme. A signed waiver is required to participate on this tour. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with boat or beach shoes, and bring a sun protection and a towel from the ship. Scuba equipment is provided. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. Space on this tour is extremely limited; we suggest you book well in advance to avoid disappointment. Cagliari, Bonaria Basilica and Monte Urpino

Nora

Continue to the ancient Roman and pre-Roman town of Nora situated on a peninsula near Pula and Cagliari in Sardinia. Nora was an important trading town in its time, with two protected harbours, one on each side of the peninsula. According to legend, Nora was founded by a group of Iberians from Tartessus led by Norax, a mythological hero (the son of Eriteide and the god Hermes). It is believed to be the first town founded in Sardinia and to have been settled by the ancient Sherden or the Nuraghi people, and later colonized by Phoenicians.

The Nora Stone, a Phoenician inscription found at Nora in 1773, has been dated by paleographic methods to between the late 9th century and early 8th century BC, and has been interpreted as referring to a Phoenician military victory and conquest of the area. After a period of domination by Carthage the town came under Roman control after the conquest of Sardinia in 238 BC. It went into decline from the 4th century AD and appears to have been abandoned during the 8th century.

Venus Castle

TPS-I / TRAPANI HIGHLIGHTS & COOKING LESSON AT BAGLIO SORÌA

Soak up the history, culture and cuisine of the region surrounding the ancient port city of Trapani, a place of ancient civilization dating from 260 BC when it was named Drepanon, from the Greek word "sickle" after its curved harbor. Equal parts urban and scenic, this city boasts exquisite coastline with bright aquamarine lagoons and rocky sandstone coasts.

Panoramic Views from Ligny Tower

Begin your brief but scenic drive from the pier towards your first destination at Ligny Tower, the "Torre di Ligny," an imposing sandstone, quadrangular tower structure built in 1671 by the Prince di Ligny. This tower offers a spectacular vantage point of city, where on a clear day you can see the urban landscape and the stunning Mediterranean seascape dotted with the Egadi Islands and two smaller islands, the "Lazzaretto" and "Torre della Colombaia." Continue driving along the Salt Road ("via del sale") with its famous "Saline" salt pans containing the salt of the Mediterranean Sea, and the ancient and iconic windmills.

Cooking Lesson and Lunch at Baglio Sorìa Winery Estate

Drive a short distance to arrive at the Baglio Sorìa Winery and Estate of the Firriato family. Consisting of a restored 17th century baglio (an Italian architectural term that means a building that contains a courtyard or court). Enjoy an introductory tour of the estate's grounds and vineyards, and then make your way inside for a cooking lesson.

Enjoy an in-depth cooking lesson built around teaching you how to prepare Sicilian Slow Food, which may include Cous Cous, a local variation of the traditional North African dish brought to Sicily by Arab conquerors in the 9th and 10th centuries. As you cook, discover the real flavour of food, which consists entirely of local produce and farm products.

Spend four hours enjoying the spectacular Verdura Golf Club, part of a 5-star resort on the southwest coast of Sicily. This golf complex consists of 45 holes, centred around a sporting facility that is considered one of the best in the Mediterranean.

The course was founded by Sir Rocco Forte, a keen sportsman with a lifelong passion for golf, who hired American architect Kyle Phillips to create a thoughtful master plan for Verdura Golf Club. With two 18-hole courses (the East course and the West Course) as well as a 9-hole par three course as well as a driving range and practice area, the course encompasses over 500 pristine acres.

Depart the pier and take a 90-minute drive via coach to the Verdura Golf Club in Sciacca. depart pier and drive towards the verdure golf club in Sciacca (about 90 minutes of driving). Enjoy the sweeping views as land and sea join together as you approach the beautifully apportioned golf courses and landscapes.

Gather your equipment and choose your course, or possibly more than one course as you have four hours to explore and test your skills at this legendary golf resort. Although both courses are built to the same standard on similar terrain, the East and West courses provide alternate journeys for golfers to enjoy.

Reboard the coach at the end of your day and make the scenic return drive back to pier

Hugging the harbour where Peter of Aragon landed in 1282 to begin the Spanish occupation of Sicily, the sickle-shaped spit of land occupied by Trapani's Old Town once sat at the heart of a powerful trading network that stretched from Carthage to Venice.

Depart the pier for a sightseeing drive through Trapani, followed by a stop at the Ligny Tower, or 'Torri de Ligny'.

Ligny Tower

This massive, quadrangular tower was built by Prince di Ligny in 1671. One of the city's most beautiful panoramic viewpoints, the Ligny Tower offers splendid vistas of the Egadi, Lazzaretto and Torre della Colombaia islands in the distance.

Next, re-board your coach and drive along the salt road, or 'via del sal', which features the famous 'Saline' salt pan and windmills.

Olive Oil Farm

Upon arrival in Paceco, a visit is made to the renowned ancient olive oil farm, 'Fontanasalsa'. After a tour of the factory, proceed to the charming courtyard patio nestled amidst an orange garden for an olive oil tasting. Sample typical Sicilian delicacies that include bruschetta, olive paste, local cheeses and desserts accompanied by local wine. During your visit, the farm's owner, Mrs. Burgarella, or a member of her staff /family will briefly discuss the production and characteristics of olive oil.

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Embrace the Medieval beauty of one of Sicily's most impregnable hilltop fortifications during this half-day journey to Erice. Erice is in such a spectacular, naturally fortified position high above the natural harbour of Trapani, that it is not surprising that the site has been occupied for millennia.

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate one-hour drive to Erice, a lovely town perched on an isolated hill north of Trapani. The drive takes place along a road with numerous steep bends.

Erice

This small medieval town was founded in 415 B.C., and renowned in ancient times as an important sanctuary of Venus. Although it is often shrouded in mist due to its hilltop location, Erice offers splendid views of the sea and Egadi Islands.

The Walls

Erice's Norman-style influences are reflected in its imposing towers and fortifications. During your walking tour, see the walls that stretch from Porta Spada to Porta Trapani that protect the only side of the hill with no natural defenses. On all other sides, the sheer rock face made the town one of the most impregnable fortresses on the island.

Balio Gardens

Next, proceed for a visit to the English-style Balio Gardens. These delightful gardens were laid out in 1870 by Count Pepoli, and feature a monumental entrance with a double staircase.

Venus Castle

The last stop on your walking tour is the Venus Castle. Built on the site of the original Temple of Venus, the castle offers magnificent panoramic views and the remains of the Venus Temple.

Following your guided visit, some free time is made available for you to browse the shops before re-boarding your coach for the approximate one-hour return drive to the pier.

En route, make a photo stop at the famous 'Saline' salt pan and take an orientation drive through Trapani.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of walking, at times on cobblestones that can be slippery when wet. Approximate distance covered on foot is 1500m (1 mile). Experience a taste of life on the 'Island of Dreams' during this full-day excursion to Capri. Capri's beguiling combination of fabled beauty and hedonism has charmed Roman emperors, Russian revolutionaries and Hollywood stars for decades. It's the perfect microcosm of Mediterranean appeal - a smooth cocktail of chichi piazzas and cool cafes, Roman ruins and rugged seascapes.

On the southern edge of the Gulf of Naples lies the Isle of Capri, often called the 'Island of Dreams'. Roman emperors Augustus and Tiberius found peace and beauty here, as have the many celebrities who have visited the island. Upon seeing Capri's impressive cliffs and brightly-coloured villas, it's easy to understand the island's universal appeal.

Capri

After meeting your guide on the pier, walk to the hydrofoil/ferry terminal and embark your hydrofoil/ferry for the scenic cruise to the beautiful 'Blue Island' of Capri. Upon arrival at Capri's Marina Grande, walk to the mini-bus station, then depart for the drive to the upper village of Ana Capri. The drive is via a winding road, and offers magnificent views of the island and the nearby gulf.

Ana Capri

While in Ana Capri, browse the many shops or explore some of the main attractions. Visit the famous Villa San Michelle, or take a ride on the chair-lift to Monte Solaro, the highest point on the island and a favourite of Emperor Augustus. Ample time is made available for lunch in one of the hotels or seaside cafés (*al fresco* dining is recommended). Next, re-board the mini-bus for the brief drive to lovely Capri Town.

Capri Town

While in Capri Town, feel free to explore the town on your own or follow the guide on the short walk to the Augustus Gardens. From the park's spectacular vantage-point, view the Marina Piccola and the legendary Faraglioni Rocks, three enormous rocks that protrude from the blue waters of the Tyrrhenian Sea. Leaving the Augustus Gardens, approximately two hours is yours to have lunch on your own, visit the famous shopping street of Via Camerelle or wander through the central square; or 'Piazzetta'.
