ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, firstserved basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please meet with the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

ON-TIME TOUR DEPARTURES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, tour departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and tour departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com)

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. 

NYC-A / THE ULTIMATE HELICOPTER TOUR

Price:**\$599**; Duration:**2.50** hrs

Enjoy a helicopter flight over the dramatic New York skyline on this tour.

Depart the pier in a private van for the heliport where you will board a helicopter for a flight over Manhattan. See the beauty of Central Park, the Hudson River, the George Washington Bridge and the cliffs of the New Jersey Palisades. You will fly over the harbor and get a distant view of the magnificent Verrazano Bridge, Governors Island, the Intrepid Sea Air Space Museum and its Space Shuttle. Marvel at the splendor of Rockefeller Center, the Empire State, Chrysler, Met Life buildings and the World Financial Center. Delight in flying by the historical richness of the Statue of Liberty, Ellis Island, Greenwich Village, South Street Seaport and the 126-year old Brooklyn Bridge.

After landing back at the heliport, your tour will conclude with a transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1 mile (1.6 kilometres) and is suitable for guests with limited mobility as long as they can embark and disembark the van with minimal assistance, and board the helicopter via a high step. It is not suitable for guests who are wheelchair bound. The maximum weight of each guest must not exceed 275 pounds (125 kilograms). Seating is based on weight distribution and is assigned at the pilot's discretion. For security purposes, no bags are allowed on the flight. Lockers are available at the helicopter. The flight is not exclusive to Silversea Guests. Total flight time is 20 minutes.

NYC-C / LOWER MANHATTAN & 9/11 MEMORIAL

Price:**\$99**; Duration:**4.00** hrs

Explore the sights of New York City and the 9/11 Memorial during this half-day guided walking tour of Lower Manhattan.

Panoramic Drive

Your introduction to New York City begins with a coach transfer to Lower Manhattan during which a knowledgeable, licensed NYC guide will offer entertaining commentary and point out major sights.

Lower Manhattan

Leaving the coach at Battery Park on the southern tip of Manhattan, your guide will lead you on a walking tour of Lower Manhattan, the Financial District and the site of the World Trade Center. Along the way you will see famous Broadway, pass Trinity Church, and Wall Street with the New York Stock Exchange. Take note of the iconic "Charging Bull" statue, which has become the unofficial symbol of Wall Street.

9/11 Memorial

Then, arriving at the World Trade Center you will be provided with an entry pass to the newly completed 9/11 Memorial. Set within an 8-acre Memorial Plaza landscaped with a small forest of oak trees, the Memorial features two massive pools built over the footprints of the original Twin Towers, with 30-foot waterfalls cascading down into the pools. The names of the 2,982 men, women and children killed in the attacks of September 11, 2001 and February 26, 1993 are inscribed in parapets surrounding the reflecting pools. You will have time to view and contemplate the Memorial, its visitor's center and the on-going construction of the site which, when finished, will be home to New York's tallest building. Your guide will answer any questions and explain aspects of the construction. Please be reminded that the 9/11 Memorial is a place of remembrance and quiet reflection.

Following your visit, walk back to the coach for the return drive to the pier.

Please Note:This tour involves an extensive amount of slow walking and standing (for approximately 2 hours) and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or guests utilizing a wheelchair. Please be reminded that it is mainly an outside walking tour and will operate in all weather conditions. Guests are recommended to dress in layers; wear comfortable shoes and bring a rain jacket. Tour sequence will depend on clearance at the pier and traffic conditions.

NYC-D / CENTRAL PARK & THE MET

Price:**\$129**; Duration:**4.50** hrs

Travel outside of Manhattan's business districts on this relaxed and interesting tour that highlights two well-known New York destinations. Panoramic Drive, Central Park

Your tour starts with a narrated scenic drive to the Upper West Side, viewing many homes of celebrities including as well as the Lincoln Center. A brief stop is made at the Dakota building, famous for being the place where John Lennon lived and died. From here, follow your guide for a









short walk through 'Strawberry Fields' the area of Central Park devoted to him. The New York's most famous and beloved park is over 150 years old, covers an area of 843 acres and plays host to 25 million visitors each year, along with having the distinction of having over 200 movies filmed there.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art

Re-join your coach and continue on to famous 5th Avenue and the Metropolitan Museum of Art, one of the world's largest and most prestigious museums in the world. Founded in 1870, the Museum is one of the most visited museums in the world, featuring over two million works of art. The institution's permanent collection spans a wealth of history that includes everything from a transported Egyptian Temple to a large collection

of 19th and 20th century European paintings. Here, after receiving Audio Guides and you will have approximately 2.5 hours to explore the museum at your leisure. Your tour guide will inform you of any special, temporary exhibits, provide you with a map to help you navigate your way around and ensure you make the best use of your time. For those who would like a bite to eat or some refreshment, the Museum houses several cafés for your convenience.

Following your visit at the Met, you will travel further along 5th Avenue before transferring back to the pier where your tour concludes.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of slow walking and standing for approximately 3 hours. This tour is suitable for guests who utilize a wheelchair however guests must be able to negotiate the steps to get in/out of the coach. The Museum is fully handicap accessible. Guests may remain on the coach during the stop at Central Park. We recommend guests to wear comfortable walking shoes and bring water from the ship. There is no photography of any kind allowed at the Museum. The order of the sites visited or viewed may vary.

NYC-B / LIVE LIKE A NEW YORKER IN THE WEST VILLAGE

Guests can experience the unique sights, sounds and flavours of New York City from a local's perspective during this memorable, half-day excursion to Greenwich Village.

Manhattan Subway Ride to Washington Square

Depart the pier with your guide for the short walk to the 50th Street subway (Line A, C or E). Upon arrival, your guide will provide you with a Metrocard, and a map of the city and subway. Your subway ride takes you to West 4th Street/Washington Square, where your guided stroll begins through Greenwich Village. One of New York's most appealing and eclectic neighbourhoods, Greenwich Village is simply referred to as 'The Village', a favourite weekend destination for New Yorkers and a lovely place to stroll.



Greenwich Village Walking Tour

Stroll the leafy streets lined with Federal-style town houses and ivy-covered brownstones, which defy the symmetrical street grid pattern that brings order to the world above 14th Street. Residents from 'The Village' remain loyal to the local organic bakery and the corner produce market. It's a neighbourhood on a very human scale, with small delights around every corner. During your narrated walking tour, learn about the history, culture, architecture and entertainment offerings that set Greenwich Village apart from the rest of New York City.

Bleecker Street

As you stroll along Bleecker Street, stop to sample a variety of New York food specialties, including the best thin-crust pizza, delicious rice balls, a crispy cannoli and tasty cupcake, which have secured Greenwich Village's reputation as being one of the greatest culinary and cultural center of the city. In addition, discover the Old Italian neighbourhood, hidden gardens, the narrowest house in NYC and much more. Following some free time for independent shopping and exploration on Bleecker Street, board a coach for the approximately 30-minute transfer back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.4 miles (2.2 kilometres), at times over flat and cobblestone surfaces, with numerous stairs to negotiate on the subway platforms and at various venues. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilize a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection and a light jacket or raincoat from the ship. The tour sequence may vary. Space on this tour is extremely limited; we suggest you book well in advance to avoid disappointment.

NYC-F / MANHATTAN HIGHLIGHTS & TOP OF THE ROCK



Price:**\$159**; Duration:**4.00** hrs

Discover New York City at its best on this half-day highlights excursion. New York City is comprised of 5 boroughs sitting where the Hudson River meets the Atlantic Ocean. At its core is Manhattan, a densely populated borough that's among the world's major commercial, financial and cultural centres.

Panoramic New York

Depart the pier with your guide en-route for Manhattan to view the Rockefeller Centre, Times Square, the Theatre District, the Empire State Building and St Patrick's Cathedral. Travel through New York neighbourhoods such as trendy Greenwich Village, Little Italy and the Financial District and Fifth Avenue with its designer stores and boutiques. See glimpses of Central Park, which covers some 843 acres at the core of this bustling metropolis, and provides the people of the city with a green oasis.

9/11 Memorial

One of the highlights of your New York exploration will be a visit to the 9/11 Memorial. The newly completed 9/11 Memorial consists of 2 massive pools set within the original footprints of the Twin Towers with 30-foot waterfalls cascading down their sides. Take some time to reflect and pay your respects to those that lost their lives there. At the 9/11 Memorial area you will also be able to admire the outstanding newly built One World Trade Centre; the New York's tallest commercial building.

Top of the Rock Observation Deck

Next Experience, the Rockefeller Centre and the 70 story TOP OF THE ROCK[™] Observation Deck. The view itself is unique and astonishing, unobstructed for 360 degrees and stretching for miles in every direction. It is the most spectacular view in New York City. Back on the ground you will see the famous home of NBC's Today Show and the annual location for New York's spectacular Christmas tree and nostalgic ice-skating rink before returning to the pier.

Please Note: This tour requires a minimal amount of activity for approximately 91.44 metres (300 feet) and is suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a folding wheelchair however guests must be able to get in/out of the coach with minimal assistance or that of their travelling companion. There is approximately 30-minutes of slow walking at the 9/11 Memorial (not the museum). There is approximately 60 minutes of slow walking at the Top of the Rock Observatory. Both venues are fully handicap accessible. Guests may opt to return to the coach at any time during the tour. We recommend guests wear weather appropriate clothing and comfortable walking shoes, sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses and water from the ship.





Waterford, River Arrigle and Jerpoint Abbey

The Observatory galleries unravel time, space and astronomy, while the Planetarium explores the heavens and at Flamsteed House, Sir Christopher Wren's original building, is where London's only public camera obscura is housed.

National Maritime Museum

The National Maritime Museum is formed from the Queen's House and has 2 separate wings, joined by colonnades. The museum was first opened in 1937. The west and east wings, plus the linking colonnades, were built in 1807-16 by Daniel Alexander; the west wing holds the main body of the museum whilst the east wing is mostly used for special exhibitions. There is a wonderful collection of boats and naval memorabilia, relics, maps, charts and uniforms, all of which tell the long story of Britain's history as a seafaring nation. Nelson's blood stained uniform from the Battle of Trafalgar is one of the star attractions. The number of exhibits in the Museum is enormous and main intention of the Museum is to show off the history of mankind's association with the sea.

Visits to the Royal Observatory and Maritime Museum are free-flow but the guide will be on hand to lead the way and to add facts and history and insights.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or guests who utilise a wheelchair. A visit to the Planetarium at the Observatory is not included in this tour. Guests will walk from the Royal Observatory to the National Maritime Museum, the walk is downhill and is approx. 0.6 miles (1 kilometer).
