General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Looking for a special program with your travelling companions? In a nod to our Italian heritage, let us reserve for you our Silver Shore "Privato" service - a private vehicle with driver and/or guide. Create your own itinerary or leave it to us. This service is available in most ports which you can reserve on MySilversea (my.silversea.com) or at the Shore Concierge desk onboard for a truly tailor-made arrangement. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore excursions must be purchased on or before the booking deadline for each port of call. Tours are available on a first-come, firstserved basis; some tours are very popular with guests often ending up being wait-listed: in order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com from 120 days until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate on excursions are subject to space availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. Please note that certain shore excursions may have different reservation deadlines and may incur cancellation fees if cancelled after the deadline. Unless otherwise indicated in the tour description for a particular shore excursion a 100% cancellation fee will be charged for shore excursions cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled start time. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge desk within the cancellation deadline period.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

For those of you that are not aware, at Silversea you can pre-reserve your excursions at leisure prior to your journey on the internet, log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. If you have pre-reserved your excursions on line, your tickets will be delivered to your suite upon embarkation and all charges will be billed to your shipboard account.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Once on board, you may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a consolidated tour booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the tours in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Tour tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

Departure times from the ship are published in the ships daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicle. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least ten minutes prior to the tour departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pier-side to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore.

PORT TALKS

Throughout your cruise we'll be offering Port & Shore Excursion information given by our Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant prior to arrival in each port of call. Our aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and many of your questions about our ports of call will be answered in these briefings, giving you more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port. The information is presented in the theater or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicle. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. CHILDREN ON TOUR

SVZ-A / SCILLY ISLES'S WILDLIFE CRUISE & ST MARTINS VINEYARD TOUR

DIFFICULTY

Price:**\$99**; Duration:**4.50** hrs

Depart from your ship by local boat and enjoy an hour and 30 minutes boat trip around the eastern Isles, as you sail along the water your skipper will give commentary on the local wildlife and if you are fortunate enough you may even spot glimpses of local birdlife, seals and sea life of the Scillies.

St. Martin's island, Vineyard

Your boat trip ends at St. Martin's; a quiet island which has some of the best beaches in the Scillies, offering some spectacular views. Away from the hustle and bustle of St Mary's, your visit to St. Martins will be relaxed and you can take time to enjoy the scenery.

Today, visit a thriving local business on St. Martins and sample wine and nibbles at the UK's most south westerly vineyard, the owners will take great pleasure in showing you some of the vines and wine making processes. The St. Martin's vineyard was established in 1996 by Val & Graham Thomas - originally as a holiday hobby. The St. Martin's Vineyard and Winery is sited on the south facing slopes of a tenancy farm originally used to produce bulbs and cut flowers by Derek Perkins, Val's father. The first of the vines trialed were white varieties - Reichensteiner and Madeleine Angevine. Now, they produce five varieties, three white, one rose, and one red.

Highertown, North Farm Gallery, local Chapel, Local Church Town, Flower Farm

After your trip to the Vineyard, the owner will escort you a little further into Highertown to enjoy some free time. Visit the North Farm Gallery, local Chapel or make a visit to the local Church town Flower Farm. Ponder what Island life would be like as you view the quaint businesses around you on a backdrop of beautiful cliff's and fine sandy white beaches.

With a total population of just over two thousand, an exceptionally mild climate, and countless golden sandy beaches, Scilly is a beautiful haven of peace and tranquility loved by visitors and locals alike.

SVZ-C / TRESCO ABBEY GARDENS

Price:**\$49**; Duration:**3.00** hrs

Tender ashore to the island of Tresco and be met by your local guide before 30 minutes walking for to Tresco gardens for a guided tour. Tresco is best known for its Abbey Gardens, laid out by the remarkable Augustus Smith - a wealthy merchant banker who purchased the islands from the Duchy of Cornwall in the mid-1830s. Work on the gardens commenced in 1834 on the site of the old Benedictine Abbey.

By building tall wind-breaks, Augustus Smith (a botanist and plant collector) channeled the weather up and over the network of walled enclosures he built around the Priory ruins, and the three terraces he carved from the rocky, south facing slope looking towards St Mary's. In this way he maximized the generous climate that Tresco enjoys thanks to the prevailing effects of the Gulf Stream. The climate is mild, with sunshine hours generally greater than the UK average, rainfall less, and winter frost and snow unexpected.

Tresco Abbey Garden

Tresco is thought of as a perennial Kew without the glass - shrugging off salt spray and Atlantic gales to host 20,000 exotic plants. Many of those plants would stand no chance on the Cornish mainland, less than 30 miles away. Yet even at the winter equinox more than 300 plants will be in flower. All in all, the garden is home to glorious species from 80 countries, ranging from Brazil to New Zealand and Burma to South Africa. Subsequent generations have continued the development of the Garden, which is today a major attraction of the islands.





Stornoway, Lewis Isle, West Coast, Callanish Standing Stones, Visitor's Centre, Stones Walk

Upon arrival, proceed to Callanish for a visit to the Callanish Standing Stones. The stones stand like a petrified forest on the flat top of a peninsula which reaches out into East Loch Roag. Dun Carloway Pictish Broch

Next, re-board your coast and continue around the west coast of Lewis Isle to the site of the Dun Carloway Pictish Broch. Probably built some time in the last century B.C, it would have occasionally served as a defensible residence for an extended family, with accommodation for animals at ground floor level. It would also have served as a visible statement of power and status in the local area.

Gearrannan Blackhouse Village, Traditional Blackhouses, Museum, Crofting Demonstration

Your tour continues with a drive north to the Gearrannan Blackhouse Village, a reconstructed settlement of traditional blackhouses where people and animals lived in close proximity. The houses were made using dry, stone masonry, and have thatched roofs distinctively weighted down with rocks. During your guided tour, visit the small museum, observe a display of a typical crofting activity such as weaving or butter-making (subject to availability), and take in splendid views from this dramatic site on the wild Atlantic coast. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Depart the pier for the for the scenic, approximately 55-minute drive across Lewis Isle en route to the Parish of Ness and its charming little harbour, the Port of Ness. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to explore this traditional fishing village at your leisure. For generations, Ness has been home to many seafarers who are celebrated in the works of local artists. You can take a delightful stroll about the harbour area, and visit the Harbour View Gallery to admire the artwork on display.

St. Moluag Church, Butt of Lewis Lighthouse, Lighthouse and Ocean Views

Next, re-board your coach and continue on to St. Moluag Church. Upon arrival, take a guided tour of this ancient church and learn about its mysterious legacy. Afterward, re-board your coach and head to the Butt of Lewis Lighthouse, which is situated in a stunning location. 

Experience the lovely Stornoway coast, landmarks and Lews Castle grounds on-foot during this scenic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Stornoway Walking Tour, Seafront, Bridge, Coastline, Woodlands, Gardens

Depart the pier for a scenic walking tour along the seafront to admire the fishing boats dancing on the waves. From here, cross the bridge and follow the pathway along the coastline. En route, pass by grounds that were originally laid out as part of the formal gardens of Lews Castle, built on the foundations of an estate house dating from 1680. The grazing land was transformed into extensive woodlands, large gardens, and a conservatory complex to house a wide range of native and exotic plant species.

Jetty, Colourful Houses, Forest, Gallows Hill, Castle Grounds, Panoramic Views

Next, continue walking along the coast en route to a small jetty offering splendid panoramic vistas across the bay to the colourful houses of Stornoway. From here, your path climbs gently through the forest to the highest point of the castle's grounds, located on Gallows Hill where once the town's gallows stood. From this viewpoint, take in spectacular panoramic views of Stornoway and its surrounds. This area also features evidence of prehistoric settlements dating back to 4000 B.C., including the largest number of Neolithic and Bronze Age monuments around Stornoway.

Lews Castle and Museum nan Eilean Tour

Finally, reach the impressive mock Tudor Castle, the lavishly-appointed Lews Castle. This Victorian-Era home was utilised as a naval hospital during World War II, a period during which the groomed woodlands fell into a wild state and the fantastic glasshouses dilapidated. We will have free time here to explore the Museum nan Eilean. At the conclusion of your visit, commence the approximately 30-minute walk back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1.86 miles (about 3 kilometres), at times over uneven, slippery, and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with many steps to negotiate at the castle. Depart through Lerwick, the capital of Shetland, as you begin your trip to the Island of Mousa. En route, you pass through the rural township of Fladdabister before catching your first glimpse of the magnificent Mousa Broch, the tallest and best-preserved broch in the world. At the small ferry port and transfer to the Solan IV boat for a short crossing to the Island of Mousa.

Mousa is an uninhabited island 1.5 miles long and 1 mile wide. Here we will enjoy a guided walk of this island to admire beautiful scenery and wildlife includes seal and bird colonies en-route. Spot Common and Grey Seals as well as Arctic Terns and Great Skuas.

In addition to the abundant wildlife, Mousa is also home to Mousa Broch - an impressive Iron Age fortress tower which stands 13m in height and is the best preserved of its type.

After a bracing walk we return to the boat and return to the coach and then back to your ship in Lerwick.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of walking, approximately 2 miles (3.2 km) over some rocks and grassy terrain. Operation is based on favorable weather and sea conditions. Binoculars are suggested for the best viewing of wildlife, although their sightings cannot be guaranteed. Guests are advised to wear warm, comfortable sportswear in layers with sturdy, flat, and closed-toe hiking shoes and a weatherproof jacket from the ship. 

Orkney

Being so fertile, and so near to Norway, Orkney made an obvious base for Viking expansion, particularly in a time when the latest technology was sea transport in Viking long-ships. After a short transfer by coach (if docked at Hatston Pier) this excursion commences with a stroll through the historical Old Town. Starting at Harbour Street, you turn into Bridge Street and Albert Street. These ancient thoroughfares now house Kirkwall's bustling main shopping streets.

We then arrive at St. Magnus Cathedral, founded in 1137, and dominating the skyline for many miles. It is one of the finest and best preserved medieval cathedrals in Scotland. During a guided tour your guide will explain how the construction of the Cathedral was not completed for more than three centuries, with the present building representing the styles of the different building stages - Romanesque, Transitional and Gothic.

You then walk the short distance to The Earl's Palace, built in 1600 by Earl Patrick Stewart. When it was built, the Palace was probably the finest example of French Renaissance architecture in Scotland though it now stands as an impressive ruin. The most interesting features are the carved decoration, the oriel windows and the great hall in which is one of the noblest state rooms of any castle in Scotland.

Continue to the adjacent remains of the Bishop's Palace, which was built in the mid-12th century to provide accommodation close to the splendid new Cathedral. The Palace probably consisted of a hall, used for festive occasions and a tower house which formed the Bishop's private residence and conformed to the plan of a Royal Norwegian Palace.

Your guide will then conclude the tour and you are free to shop and explore and make your own way back to the ship. Alternatively you can make your way back to the ship with the guide at this stage.

Please note: Thistour is entirely on foot with an extensive amount of walking for approx 700 meters (0.43 mile), and is recommended for guests in good physical condition. During your self-guided tour, enter the low doorways, climb the winding stairs, look out from windows set deep in massive walls and marvel at the beautiful woven tapestries. See the centuries-old stonework, snug sitting-room in the core of the Tower, forbidding dungeon, freshwater well, and the original kitchens. Following your tour of the castle and gardens, re-board your coach and drive to nearby Culloden Battlefield.

Culloden Battlefield

No place in British history stirs the emotions more than Culloden. On 16 April 1746, a battle was fought here to decide a civil war between the ruling House of Hanover and the Jacobites. The brutal Duke of Cumberland, son of King George II, and his 8,000 well trained and equipped army defeated 5,500 exhausted, starving and ill-equipped Highlanders led by Bonnie Prince Charlie. It was the last battle on British soil and ended the House of Stuart's hopes of regaining the throne. During a stop here, see

wooden plaques detailing the battle, clan graves and the Well of the Dead, where wounded Highlanders were slain as they drank water to revive themselves. Following your visit, commence the approximately 1-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking stair-climbing & uneven surfaces at Cawdor Castle, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. 

Dornoch

On December 21, 2000, the pop star Madonna had her son Rocco christened here, the day before her wedding

to Guy Ritchie in nearby Skibo Castle. Your guide will be pleased to escorts guests to the cathedral during your time here.

Finally, enjoy the relaxed drive back to Invergordon

Explore the mystery of Scotland's most beloved legend during this memorable excursion to Loch Ness and the ruins of Urquhart Castle. Loch Ness

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 60-minute drive south to the banks of Loch Ness. Upon arrival at Dochgarroch harbour, embark the charming boat for a short cruise to Urquhart Castle. This tour represents a unique opportunity to look for the evasive Loch Ness Monster, which has baffled some of the world's most notable researchers for decades. The deep lake, ('loch' in Gaelic), has drawn visitors from all over the world in search of the monster. The loch is 23 miles (about 37 kilometres) long, one mile (1.6 kilometres) wide and 755 feet (230 metres) deep. Enroute to Urquhart Castle, you can learn more about the Loch and the Monster.

Urquhart Castle

Upon arrival, disembark the boat and walk to the jagged and atmospheric ruins of Urquhart Castle, situated on a rocky promontory jutting into Loch Ness. During its turbulent history, the castle was plundered by the MacDonald clan of the Western Isles and eventually blown up in 1692 to prevent its occupation by Jacobites. Today, all that remains is a lone keep and crumbling walls. However, legends persist that a cave beneath the castle is the home of 'Nessie', the Loch Ness Monster. The path leading

up from Urquhart Castle offers superb views of the ruins and the loch. You can also browse the interesting Visitor Centre and gift shop.

Beauly

Following your visit to the castle, depart Loch Ness for the gentle return journey to Invergordon via the small town of Beauly. Well known for its lovely flower displays and home to the now ruined 13th Century priory which lies in the heart of the village, Beauly is a charming traditional Scottish town. It also boasts a lovely, spacious central square, laid out by Baron Lovat in the 1840s. Beauly is the ideal place to purchase tweeds, knitwear and local crafts.

After some free time to explore and perhaps buy some mementos of your visit, depart for the final leg of your journey back to your ship in Invergordon.

Royal Observatory

The world's time has been measured from Greenwich since 1844 and a visit to the Royal Observatory will give you the opportunity to straddle the hemispheres! Standing as a monument to navigational research, the Royal Observatory is the original home of Greenwich Mean Time and is famous for being the source of the Prime Meridian line that divides the East from the West (longitude 0° 0' 0"). The Observatory galleries unravel time, space and astronomy, while the Planetarium explores the heavens and at Flamsteed House, Sir Christopher Wren's original building, is where London's only public camera obscura is housed.

National Maritime Museum

The National Maritime Museum is formed from the Queen's House and has 2 separate wings, joined by colonnades. The museum was first opened in 1937. The west and east wings, plus the linking colonnades, were built in 1807-16 by Daniel Alexander; the west wing holds the main body of the museum whilst the east wing is mostly used for special exhibitions. There is a wonderful collection of boats and naval memorabilia, relics, maps, charts and uniforms, all of which tell the long story of Britain's history as a seafaring nation. Nelson's blood stained uniform from the Battle of Trafalgar is one of the star attractions. The number of exhibits in the Museum is enormous and main intention of the Museum is to show off the history of mankind's association with the sea.

Visits to the Royal Observatory and Maritime Museum are free-flow but the guide will be on hand to lead the way and to add facts and history and insights.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or guests who utilise a wheelchair. A visit to the Planetarium at the Observatory is not included in this tour. 

Afterwards travel along the broad triumphal approach to Buckingham Palace - The Mall which is lined on one side by the delightful St. James's Park, a quiet and relaxed oasis with its flowerbeds and its ducks and pelicans on the lake. James's Palace; still the Court's official headquarters and adjacent Clarence House Clarence House - London home of Prince Charles and Camila, Duchess of Cornwall.Pass the Admiralty Arch which separates courtly London from the hurly burly of Trafalgar Square that stands imposing Nelson's Column.

Afterwards leave the hustle and bustle of central London and head to Heathrow airport to connect with your outbound flight.
