Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore Excursions are available on a first-come, first served basis. Guests should note that some shore excursions are very popular with guests and often ending up being waitlisted. In order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate in excursions are subject to availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge Desk within the cancellation deadline. For our selected Shore Excursions Tickets returned after the cancellation deadline will be charged 100% cancellation fee to the guest's onboard account. Cancellation deadlines for the majority of our shore excursions is 48hrs prior to the port of call. Please note that certain shore excursions might have a different cancellation deadline; all cancellation deadlines are stated in the please note section of the shore excursion, booking form and shore excursion tickets.

SHORE EXCURSION SUITABILITY

Silversea offers a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. However, certain excursions are more appropriate for physically fit and active guests. All excursions offered are clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. We also offer a good variety of Accessible Shore Excursion worldwide (according to the ports availability and local structure) that are designed for guests unable to negotiate motor coach steps or for full time wheelchair/scooter users. The vehicle used on this type of shore excursion is adapted with an access ramp (or lift where available) to accommodate a limited number of mobility devices. In order to use the ramp and/or lift, guests are required to be seated on a wheelchair or scooter. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain to select excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the excursion description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information. Silversea also offers Destination Experience

DESTINATION EXPERIENCE BRIEFINGS

Throughout the voyage the Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant will offer port and shore excursion information prior to arrival in each port of call. Their aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and answer as many of your questions as possible. The information is presented in the theatre or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system, and will allow more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicles. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. Children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment. Such harnesses' and secure

seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately, guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

TAR-A / Tarragona Highlights

Explore the ancient Roman and medieval history of Tarragona, an UNESCO World Heritage Site, during this scenic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Tarragona, Old Quarter, Roman & Medieval Ruins

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to Tarragona, an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Home to the most important port in southern Catalonia, Tarragona constitutes a dynamic, mid-sized city that spreads from a small headland of a height of approximately 230 feet (about 70 metres). On this modest rise lies the historical Old Quarter, brimming with Roman and Medieval remains.

Cathedral of Santa Maria, Old City, Medieval Marketplace, Gothic Arches, Jewish Quarter

The origins of Tarragona date from the first presence of Rome in the Iberian Peninsula, around 218 B.C. After the centuries of decadence that followed the fall of the Roman Empire, the city was reborn during the medieval era. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour. Along the way, an exterior visit is made to the Cathedral of Santa Maria, built between the 12th century and 14th century. Continuing your walk through the Old City, discover charming corners like the old medieval marketplace with its Gothic arches, and the streets that used to be the 'call', or Jewish Quarter.

Roman Wall Ruins, Portal del Roser, Provincial Forum, Roman Pretorio, Circus, and Amphitheatre

The remains of the Roman Walls are the first impressive sight before entering the walled area through the 'Portal del Roser'. Here, your guide introduces you to the Roman history through the remains of the Roman ages; the Provincial Forum, Roman Pretorio, Roman Circus, and 2nd-century Roman Amphitheatre, which overlooks the sea. Your final stop is at the Mediterranean Balcony, which offers panoramic views overlooking the sea and coast. Your tour concludes with an approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.86 miles (about three kilometres), at times over uneven, gravel, and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to get on/off the coach and several steps and steep incline at the Amphitheatre. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with back and/or neck problems, guests with heart and/or respiratory conditions, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, bottled water, a sweater or light jacket, and local currency or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour; minors must be accompanied by parent or guardian over the age of 18. Guests must be at least 18 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Guests may purchase drinks during the tour at their own expense. This tour does not operate on Mondays. The tour sequence and timings may vary.

TAR-C / Explore Medieval Montblanc & Poblet Monastery

Discover two of the best-preserved medieval locales in northeast Spain's Catalonia region during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing tour.

Montblanc, Guided Walking Tour, Medieval Buildings, Gothic Church of Santa Maria

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to Montblanc, which, along with the Poblet Monastery, is among the best-preserved Medieval locales in northeast Spain's Catalonia region. Upon arrival in Montblanc, discover its rich architectural and cultural heritage during a guided walking tour of its lanes and old streets. Along the way, it's easy to see why Montblanc is one of the most beautiful medieval towns in Catalonia. Pass by 13th-century and 14th-century buildings, the old Gothic Church of Santa Maria with its ornate façade, and defensive wall, and learn about the legend of Saint George (patron saint of Catalonia), who killed a dragon to save the Princess.

Poblet Monastery, Guided Walking Tour, Cistercian Art

Next, re-board your coach and head for a guided tour of the Poblet Monastery, an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Located in the region of Conca de Barbera in a beautiful setting, this Cistercian abbey is among the largest monasteries in Spain and most important of its kind in Europe. The Poblet Monastery was built in the 12th century, though its era of grandeur peaked in the 14th century. It was then abandoned, but, beginning in 1940, some monks resumed living there. In addition to the magnificent church, see prominent examples of Cistercian art. Your tour concludes with an approximately 50-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 3.1 miles (about five kilometres), at times over uneven, gravel, and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to get on/off the coach and stairs at the Poblet Monastery. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with back and/or neck problems, guests with heart and/or respiratory conditions, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, bottled water, a sweater or light jacket, and local currency or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour; minors must be accompanied by parent or guardian over the age of 18. Guests must be at least 18 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Guests may purchase drinks during the tour at their own expense. The tour sequence and timings may vary.

TAR-E / Ebre's Delta: Nature and Seafood

Embrace the exquisite natural splendour and flavours of the Ebre Delta during this picturesque, full-day sightseeing tour.

Tarragona, Terres de L'ebro Region, Ebre Delta

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 1.75-hour drive to the Ebre Delta. Its natural resources, the respect that the community has for the Ebre Delta, and its connection to local customs, traditional feasts, local products, and gastronomy make it a truly unique territory. The Terres de L'ebro region has been declared an UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, as well as one of the world's Top 100 most sustainable tourist destinations by the International Association of Global Green Destination.

Ebre Delta Natural Park, Món Natura Delta Centre, Diverse Birdlife and Flora Species

Upon arrival at the Ebre Delta, head to the Món Natura Delta Centre, located in the amazing Ebre Delta Natural Park. With a surface area of approximately 123 square miles (318 square kilometres), the Món Natura Delta Centre hosts the largest aquatic habitat in Catalonia, with over 400 species of birds and 764 species of flora. This centre is designed to help you understand, and experience, the natural diversity, traditions, and magic of the Ebre Delta.

Salt Flatlands, Scenic Viewpoint, Flamingos, Lagoon, Traditional Fishing, Jetty Area

Visit the salt flatlands, recreated to scale in terms of their appearance and salt production. Salt and rice have been very important products for the local economy. Stop by a scenic viewpoint for stunning, 360-degree vistas of your surrounds, including families of flamingos and other birdlife, the old salt flatlands, and lagoon. In addition, see the jetty area, and observe the traditional art of fishing by using nets and trammels for catching fish, eel, and shrimp.

Boat-Ride, Musclarium, Mussel Farm, Aquaculturist, Mussel Cultivation, Seafood Lunch

Next, embark a boat for a unique experience, a visit to a mussel farm named the Musclarium, located in this middle of the sea. Upon arrival, an expert aquaculturist explains the cultivation of mussels. Afterward, enjoy a lunch consisting of mussels, oysters, fish, and shellfish from the local bay, along with locally-sourced specialties. After lunch, return to the docking area, disembark your vessel, and re-board your coach for the approximately 1.75-hour drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 711 yards (about 650 metres), at times over uneven and natural surfaces, with a few steps to get on/off the coach and embark/disembark the boat, three steps at the Musclarium, and 37 steps at the Mon Natural Delta; a lift is available. This tour is not suitable for pregnant guests, guests with back and/or neck problems, guests with heart and/or respiratory conditions, guests with food allergies, guests prone to seasickness, guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, bottled water, a sweater or light jacket, and Euros or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour; minors must be accompanied by parent or guardian over the age of 18. Guests must be at least 18 years old to participate in tastings of alcoholic beverages. The driving time between the pier and sites visited is approximately 1.75 hours in each direction. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. The tour sequence and timings may vary.

TAR-G / Panoramic Tarragona and its Coast

Tarragona

Tarragona is one of the most beautiful and important cities in the Gold Coast. It is also of great interest due to its port, which is the most important in the southern Catalonia and also for its Roman and Medieval remains. The city has been declared a World Heritage by UNESCO. The origins of Tarragona go back to the first presence of Romans in the Iberian Peninsula around 218 BC. The Roman city of Tarraco (currently Tarragona) became the capital of the Hispania Citerior, one of the largest provinces of the Empire in the time of Augustus (27 BC). After the centuries of decadence that followed the fall of the Roman Empire, the city was reborn during the medieval era.

Scenic Drive, Coast, Beaches, Rambla Nova

The tour will start with an enjoyable scenic drive towards the coastal line of Tarragona. You will be able to admire some of the most famous Tarragonese beaches, how they differ from other beaches along the gold coast due to their natural characteristics due to the privileged location of Tarragona. Furthermore, you will have the chance to observe some of the highlights in downtown Tarragona, learn about the tradition of Castellars and look out for the famous monument at Rambla Nova.

Roman Amphitheatre viewpoint, The Balcony of the Mediterranean

During the first stop, take advantage and photograph the Famous Roman Amphitheater, built in the 2nd century overlooking the sea, and scenario of fights between gladiators and wild beasts, as well as for public executions. Take a moment to enjoy the amazing view from The Balcony of the Mediterranean, one of the most famous highlights in the city.

El Serallo district, Free Time

For the last part of your tour, before going back to the ship, explore El Serallo, the picturesque seafaring neighborhood, with an ancient history and cultural richness at your leisure. Stroll around the beautiful streets, and take time to relax at one of the local bars or restaurants at your leisure before commencing the 30-minute drive back to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking 1 kilometre, at times over uneven, gravel, and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to get on/off the coach and stairs. This tour is suitable for guests with limited mobility since most of the walk is at guests discretion. Tour is not suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, bottled water, a sweater or light jacket, and local currency or credit cards for purchases from the ship. The tour sequence and timings may vary.

TAR-H / Modernist Winery: Visit & Tasting

Difficulty

Discover the history of the Wine Cathedral of Nulles, one of the most representative modernist buildings of the region and an extraordinary place in which excellent wines and cavas are made.

Scenic Drive, Cellar Adernats, Vinyard Visit, Wine Tasting

From the Pier, bigen the 45-minute panoramic drive towards Adernats.

Celler Adernats is located in the heart of Tarragona region. It is a wine cellar that currently forms the path of Official Catalan cava producers. Cellar starts its activity in 1917, with the purpose of making quality cavas counting with the help of winemaker Enric Vives, and now managing over 400 hectares of vineyards and producing over 90 barrels annually.

Walk around the vineyard to learn the process of making wine and will taste 3 local wines and 1 Cava with some snacks.

Wine Cathedral of Nulles

Do not miss the opportunity to admire The Cathedral, a stunning modernist building surrounded by the old vineyards. The Nulles' wine cellar, with the Wine Cathedral recognised as emblematic, represents the effort of a united people to move on with a dream. A yearning of the hope that appears to be impossible after the great desolation caused by the phylloxera plague.

It is the beginning of 1900, and after hundreds of years of family wine elaboration and plantations, the inhabitants of Nulles decide to unify their resources and knowledge to create Sant Isidre's trade union and to build the cellar of the village, Nulles's Wine Cathedral. This union is materialized in 1917, being the harvesting in 1920 the first one to fill the modernist cellar's new tanks.

Take the chance to climb the stairs to the upper part, closer to the dome in order to appreciate the modernist design of the vaults and the arches that make of the cathedral, a unique modernist jewel.

At the end of this experience, reboard your coach for the 45-minute drive to the the ship.

VAL-A / Valencia Past & Present

Spain's third-largest city is a magnificent place, content for Madrid and Barcelona to grab the headlines while it gets on with being a wonderfully live-able city with a thriving cultural. Never afraid to innovate, Valencia diverted its flood-prone river to the outskirts of town and converted the former riverbed into a wonderful green ribbon of park winding right through the city. Depart the pier and enjoy a panoramic drive along the Avenida del Puerto to the Gran Via and Calle Jativa, past the Bullring and Central Station. See the Central Market, an enormous metal, ceramic tile and glass Art Nouveau building built in 1928, with its 1300 stalls of fresh fish, meat and fruits and other products from all over Spain.

La Lonja

Your walking tour begins at La Lonja, or The Silk Exchange, the main monument of the city and considered to be one of Europe's most beautiful examples of Gothic civil architecture. Built between 1482 and 1533, during Valencia's golden age, the building illustrates the power and wealth of one of the great Mediterranean mercantile cities. The building was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1996.

City of Arts & Sciences

Designed by Santiago Calatrava and Félix Candela, this unique complex is devoted to science, technology, nature and house in five buildings: El Palau de les Arts Reina Sofia - opera house and performing arts centre; L'Hemisfèric - Imax Cinema, Planetarium and Laserium; L'Umbracle - a walkway and garden; El Museu de les Ciències Príncipe Felipe - a science museum; L'Oceanogràfic - an open-air oceanographic park; Ágora - a versatile space that can stage conventions, concerts and performances.

Enjoy a guided interior visit of the Palau de les Arts Reina Sofia, considered the highlight of the City of Arts & Sciences.

Palau de les Arts Reina Sofia

With its impressive architecture, this spectacular building is dedicated to promoting the performing arts. It is an impressive theatre and opera house, with four venues for opera, music, ballet & theatre.

Your walking tour concludes at the coach that will return you to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 4 km in the city centre and at the Oceanographic Park where, in case elevators are not in service approximately 150 steps are to be negotiated. Depart the pier via coach for a short panoramic drive through Valencia, Spain's third most important city. Valencia is known as the Flower City because of its vast number of parks and landscaped areas. Be introduced to your guide and then fitted with your bike and briefed with safety instructions. City of Arts and Science

This architectural complex comprises the very Museum of Arts and Science, the Hemisphere, Palau Reina Sofía, "el ágora", the Oceanographic and the cosy "Umbracle Gardens".

Serrano Towers

The Serrano Towers mark the entrance to the old walls of Valencia City. They are considered one of the best-preserved monuments in Valencia.

Tapas

We will have a temporary rest at Alameda's promenade for little tapas and a drink.

Central Market

Make your way to the market which is considered one of the oldest European markets in operation and located directly in the La Lonja area.

Miguelete Tower and Cathedral

Continue your ride and view one of the city's most emblematic monuments located beside the main door of the Cathedral and next to the Provincial Palace and the Torres de Serrano. The Miguelete Tower, from the top, offers outstanding views over Valencia and its fertile agricultural area.

Plaza de la Virgen

Ride by what was once the main square of Valencia, the Plaza de la Virgen, one of the prettiest of the many plazas in Valencia.

Rejoin your awaiting coach and drive back to the port and terminal building.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of bicycling for approximately 2.5 hours and approximately 10km (6.2 miles). Valencia, College of High Silk Art, Museum

Depart the pier for the short drive to the College of High Silk Art, which is located in the old seat of the Higher Art of Silk-Making Authority, an institution established in 1477 to set rules and standards of quality for Valencian silk-makers. During your guided visit to this 15th-century building, renovated in the 18th century, stop by the Museum to learn out about the history of silk in Valencia, hand-made process of weaving and rich artistic heritage of the building itself. In addition, your guide describes the arduous preparation of the Espolin characteristics of Valencian clothing.

After the museum visit, the guests will have possibility to visit traditional silk shop located in the museum. The Valencia Silk Museum store offer exclusive artisanal items made from natural Valencian silk.

Barri de Velluters, Central Market, Tasting of Horchata & Farton

Next, take a short stroll through the Barri de Velluters, a neighbourhood established by velvet-makers in 1465. Your walking tour continues with a stop to the bustling Central Market where you can enjoy a short free time to stroll around it. This early-20th-century building spans over 26,000 square feet (about 2,415 square metres), and hosts 400 stalls specialising in fresh products. During your walking tour, stop for a tasting of 'horchata', a typically sweet and refreshing drink made from tiger nuts, and 'fartons'.

Silk Exchange Building

Your last stop is at the cornerstone of UNESCO's Silk Road Project, the Silk Exchange building. A masterpiece of Mediterranean civil Gothic architecture, this building is the only UNESCO World Heritage Site in Valencia. The Silk Exchange was built between 1483-1548 to facilitate trade between the producers of the rich silk fabrics made in Valencia, and the merchants their silk products attracted from all over Europe. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves moderate amount of walking for approximately 2.5 km, at times over uneven, cobblestone and natural surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the approximate 65 steps at the sites visited; lifts are available, except at the Silk Market. Start your day by meeting your tour guide and accessible van at the Valencia cruise port. From here, you will head out into the city center for a memorable time exploring popular highlights of the city. Escorted by your tour guide, you will see several spectacular, notable cathedrals, including the Virgin Mary Basilica, Church of the two Saint Johns, and enjoy an interior visit to the glorious Valencia Cathedral. You will also get to revel in the beauty of the different architectural styles that line the picturesque city streets. In Valencia, you will experience the fascinating old gates that lead into the city, including the Torres de Serranos. This is one of a total of twelve gates that formed part of the ancient city wall, the Christian Wall. The area around the gate is filled with a beautiful display of Roman, Gothic and Baroque style architecture.

La Lonja de la Seda de Valencia & Central Market

Next, your tour continues to the famous UNESCO World Heritage Site, La Lonja de la Seda de Valencia. Built between 1482 and 1533, the series of buildings in La Lonja was originally used for trading silk (hence its name, the Silk Exchange), and it has always been used as a center for commerce. Today, it stands as a true masterpiece of late Gothic architecture. Have your camera ready for some beautiful photo opportunities here.

Your final part of the tour will be spent on a leisurely stroll at the Central Market of Valencia for some samples of local specialties and souvenir shopping.

Afterwards, return to the ship.

First, visit the monumental front house, which was built in 1870 and is surrounded by mountains and exquisite views of the area's natural beauty. ALI-F / Alicante Tapas Trail

Experience a delightful introduction to the gastronomy and history of Alicante during this scenic and flavourful, half-day sightseeing excursion with tapas tastings.

Alicante, Puerta del Mar Square, Old City, Walking Tour

Depart the pier for the short shuttle transfer to Puerta del Mar Square. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour through the Old City en route to the Central Market. The gastronomy of Alicante is largely based upon the Mediterranean Sea due to its close proximity. Therefore, fish is an important part of their diet. Rice is also prevalent in many of Alicante's dishes; this can be linked to the Muslim roots in the culture of Alicante. Along with the sea, Alicante is renowned for its fertile land, which enables a variety of fruits and vegetables to be farmed and consumed locally. Add in the use of olive oil to round out this truly Mediterranean diet, which is common in Alicante.

Central Market, Produce, Meat, Fish, Vegetables, Fruit, Bread, Pastries, Flowers, Tapas Tasting

Designed and built in 1921, the Mercado Central (Central Market) is an eclectic style building with Modernist ornaments. As the main source of top quality, fresh, and locally grown produce, meat, fish, vegetables, fruits, bread, pastries, and flowers, the Central Market remains the best place to experience the local gastronomy. After your guided stroll through the Old Quarter and Central Market, proceed for a tapas tasting at three different venues to experience some of the many different types of mouth-watering tapas. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your shuttle for the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.55 miles (about 2.5 kilometres), at times over uneven, natural, and cobblestone surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and five steps at the Central Market. Discover the medieval beauty and landmarks of Alicante during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Alicante, Moorish Quarter, Old Town, Cathedral Church of Saint Nicholas, Nave, Cloister, Town Hall

Depart the pier for the short drive to the city centre of Alicante. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour through the charming old Moorish Quarter, nestled at the foot of the imposing Santa Barbara Castle. Along the way, stop by the Cathedral Church of Saint Nicholas, which has an austere Renaissance façade. Inside, discover a magnificent, 17th-century nave and 15th-century cloister. Leaving the Saint Nicholas Church, head for an exterior visit to the impressive, 18th-century Baroque Town Hall, where your guide provides you with details of its imposing exterior.

City Centre, Free Time, Shopping, Esplanade of Spain, Horchata Tasting, Monastery of Santa Faz

Next, some free time is made available for independent shopping and exploration in the city centre. Afterward, proceed to the beautiful, palm-lined Esplanade of Spain to sample a delicious local speciality, horchata, a sweetened milk of crushed tiger nuts first introduced to Alicante by the Moors. From here, re-board your coach for a short, panoramic drive to the baroque-style Monastery of Santa Faz, with its pyramid-shaped dome. Inside, view a relic brought from the Vatican in the 15th century which, according to tradition, is actually a cloth used by Christ to dry his bloodied face during the Stations of the Cross.

Benacantil Hill, Santa Barbara Castle, Battlements, City & Coastal Views

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the return drive to Alicante and an external visit of the Santa Barbara Castle, Perched high up on Benacantil Hill, the Santa Barbara Castle is one of the largest medieval fortresses in Europe. During your visit, gaze down from the Castle's battlements for spectacular panoramic views overlooking the city and surrounding coastline. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Alicante, Busot, Canelobre Caves, Vaulted Ceilings, Works of Natural Art, Medusa, Candelabros

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to Busot, then head for the Canelobre Caves, one of the largest and most popular caves in Valenciana, and a heritage site of the Valencian Autonomous Region. Upon arrival, enter this renowned karst cave for a guided tour. Within the Canelobre Caves is one of the highest vaulted ceilings of Spain, approximately 230 feet (about 70 metres) in height, and similar in shape to that of a cathedral. During your visit, marvel at the strange and beautiful works of natural art, including Medusa, the Candelabros (from which the name of the caves is derived), stalactites, stalagmites, columns, flowers, draperies, and many other spectacular geological formations.

Masmar Casual Bar, Beer Tasting, Local Specialities

Next, re-board your coach for the return drive to Alicante, then proceed to the Masmar Casual Bar, one of the most famous gastronomical venues in the city. Upon arrival, enjoy a wonderful beer experience consisting of tastings of five different classes of beer served with local specialities. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

It is believed that San Juan, located in the heart of the fertile Huerta de Alicante, was likely selected as an early settlement by the ancient civilisations that came to these lands. Here, see the defensive towers, which are catalogued as an Asset of Cultural Interest.

Cabo de la Huerta, Monastery Santa Faz, Santa Barbara Castle

Next, your panoramic drive passes by the beautiful Cabo de la Huerta, Monastery Santa Faz, and the Santa Barbara Castle before heading towards the city centre of Alicante. Cabo de la Huerta owes its name to its proximity to the Huerta de Alicante, which, together with the port, was one of the two economic engines of the region.

Central Market, Free Time, Shopping, Canalejas Park, Saint Nicholas Church, Old City Centre

Once back in Alicante, some free time is made available at the Central Market for independent shopping and exploration. Afterward, your panoramic drive resumes past the Train Station and Canalejas Park, the oldest park in the city. A final stop is made for a brief walking tour past the exterior of the Church of Saint Nicholas and through the centre of the Old City. At the conclusion of your tour, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 437 yards (about 400 metres), at times over uneven, natural, and cobblestone surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at the sites visited. Alicante, Guadalest, Mountaintop Location, Panoramic Views, Fairy-Tale Village & Upper-Village

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 70-minute drive to the Old World village of Guadalest, which enjoys a spectacular location nestled high upon a pinnacle and carved into the mountain. Declared a 'Monument of Historical and Artistic Value', it's easy to see why so many tourists flock to this stunning village every year. Upon arrival, enjoy spectacular panoramic views during a short, guided tour through the cobbled streets of this fairy-tale village, then continue on to the upper-village.

Rock Tunnel, Castle Ruins, Belfry, Casa Orduña, Village Square, Free Time, Shopping

En route, walk through a tunnel hewn out of the rock on which the castle ruins and church's distinctive belfry are precariously perched. Upon arrival in the upper-village, visit the tastefully-restored Casa Orduña, which features a small onsite museum, before climbing the steps to the ruined castle and strolling into the cobbled village square. Upon arrival, some free time is made available to browse the charming handicraft and souvenir shoppes for items such as ceramics, lace, olive-wood carvings, Lladro porcelain, and more. Leaving the village square, re-board your coach and head to the Bodega Mendoza.

Bodegas Cerdá, Winery Tour, Cellar, Wine & Tapas Tastings

Upon arrival, discover Bodegas Cerdá, a family winery dedicated to the wine industry since 1885 in Hondón de las Nieves, recognized for offering a careful service and an excellent taste for quality wine.

You are invited to visit the tasting room, restoration, production, and bottling, as well as the wine store and traditional products.

Visit the museum, where you will see a wide selection of century old machinery to admire and appreciate. Later visit the exposition, the bottling room, storage and the cellar with the oak barrels. You will learn about the different processes and properties of the wines. Enjoy a wine tasting accompanied with some Spanish tapas.

Your tour concludes with an approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

CAR-A / Cartagena!

Difficulty

Discover why Cartagena was such a crossroads of culture and one of the most important cities in the ancient world during this half-day tour. Cartagena is a charming, compact, coastal city that became great during the Roman times when Hannibal set off from it with his elephants on his journey to Rome.

Civil War Shelter

From the pier, a short coach ride will bring you to the boarding point for the panoramic lift that will bring you up to the highest point in Cartagena. Then you will proceed to the Civil War Air Raid Shelter Museum, a place to remember and learn about the recent history of Cartagena. As you pass along some of the galleries and hear the testimonies of those who lived during the conflict you can appreciate how the struggle changed their lives as well as how the passive and active defence of the city was organized. The audio-visual with the actual images and sounds of the war brings home the scale and severity of the war as you experience it inside an actual shelter.

Roman Theatre

Board the coach and proceed to the Roman Theatre. The site was discovered in 1988 and following a large excavation project, the site is now open to visitors. The Museum allows you to see how the Theatre looked in Roman times. Many of the remains that were discovered during the excavation are on display. However, the highlight is when you enter the theatre itself and experience to enormity of the site.

Old Quarter

From the theatre walk to the Old Quarter and see the several Modernist (also known as Art Nouveau) town houses built in the city's last period of splendour between the late 19th and early 20th centuries, all of which have interesting stories to tell. Enjoy some free time for either a refreshment (at your own expense), or browse the fashion shops along Calle Mayor, the main street in town.

Re-board your coach and return to the pier area and your ship.

Please Note: This tour requires a considerable amount of walking, approximately 3500m (2.2 miles) with several steps and uneven surfaces to negotiate in the Roman Theatre. Comfortable clothing, sturdy walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. CAR-B / Best of Murcia

Located in the foothills of the Sierra Carascoy is Murcia, which dates from the 9th century and offers an array of architectural delights. Murcia is one of Spain's least known regions, even among Spaniards themselves, and first-time visitors are often surprised by the diversity of this small region and the friendliness of its people. Despite its growing popularity, the region

remains relatively unspoilt compared to the more crowded Costa del Sol and Costa Blanca. Fruits and market-garden products are important to the Murcian economy, and are exported all over Europe.

Depart Cartagena by coach for the approximate 1-hour journey through the foothills of the Sierra Carrascoy.

Murcia

Your destination is the Capital of the province Murcia. Settled by the Moors in the 9th century and conquered by the Christians in the 13th century, this bustling city offers an array of architectural delights.

Monastery of the Virgin of Fuensanta

Your first stop is the Monastery of the Virgin of Fuensanta (the Patroness of Murcia). Enjoy a panoramic view of the Murcian orchards, the most productive in both fruits and vegetables in all of the Mediterranean.

You'll also visit the Cathedral in Cardenal Belluga Square, where you will see three different architectural styles, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque. Next to the Cathedral you'll see the Episcopal Palace.

Royal Casino

The Royal Casino of Murcia is one of the most historic buildings, situated in the heart of the city centre not far from the cathedral, has a mixture of different artistic styles. In 1983 it was declared a National historic building. The Royal Casino of Murcia Society, founded on 11th June 1847, first started in the mansion of Marqués and later various other properties were acquired to form the present layout.

Although, this is still an acting private club, the ground floor is being kept open to public and cultural events. After a period of decline in the second half of the 20th century, the Royal Casino of Murcia Society has recently been revived considerably. Between 2006 and 2009 the building was completely refurbished and King Don Juan Carlos I granted the Casino the title 'Real' (Royal). Very complete refurbishments was done including structures, foundations, floors, walls, roofs and all of the decorative features including historic furniture, lamps and artwork. Many of the rooms were restored to their original decor and added latest technology throughout the building.

You'll also have some free time for a stroll on your own near the cathedral before boarding the coach to return to Cartagena.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 3500m (2.25 miles) over paved and cobblestone surfaces with some steps. It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. The order of visits may vary, which could depend on group sizes. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, walking shoes and sun protection. On Sunday, Monday and Holidays the Cathedral will be visited externally only.

CAR-C / Jumilla Wines Tasting

Jumilla is a small town and name of the province's most important wine-producing region. Located to the northwest of the capital city of Murcia, it is an area made up of wide valleys separated by a chain of rocky mountains. Jumilla has had an important wine making tradition for centuries and today is recognized as one of Spain's most promising wine regions. It has begun to receive international acclaim for its Monastrell based wines, which are conquering markets the world over.

Depart the pier in your coach for the approximate 1.5-hour drive towards Jumilla.

BSI Winery

Your first visit will be at BSI winery which is the first producer of wines in the Jumilla wine growing area, that export more than half their production. Enjoy a visit to see the vats and barrels, learning the history and characteristics of the different Jumilla wines, along with a taste of two of their productions.

Viña Elena

Continue your tour to the Viña Elena, one of the oldest family-run bodegas in the region. Originally known as Bodegas Pacheco, the bodega will give you a chance to take a step back in time to witness the impressive evolution that has made the business what it is today. Have the opportunity to taste three of their wines.

After visiting the wineries re-board your coach for the drive back to the pier and your ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1500m (1 mile) and some standing at times during the winery tours. This tour is not suitable for guests utilising a wheelchair or those with limited mobility. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, flat, walking shoes and sun protection. Segway Tour

After receiving your safety and operating instructions, board your Segway and depart the pier for a guided tour of Cartagena. Along the way, discover why Cartagena was a crossroad of cultures and one of the most important cities in ancient times.

Roman Theatre

Your route features historical, monumental and commercial pathways through Cartagena. Highlights include vestiges of a period of Roman colonisation dating from the 3rd century B.C., including the magnificent remains of the Roman Theatre (external visit), discovered by sheer chance only 20 years ago.

After spending time with your coordinator during this ride through history you will be accompanied back to the pier area.

Your Segway tour concludes at the pier and your ship.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of activity and is recommended for those guests in good physical shape. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Paella Demonstration

Next, proceed to a local restaurant for a memorable and informative paella demonstration. Discover the secrets to prepare a paella and then dine on the dishes you have learned to prepare.

During your cooking demonstration and meal, taste local wines from nearby regions such as Jumilla and Yecla, which has been renowned for its wine production for over 2,000 years. Jumilla has had an important wine making tradition for centuries and today is recognized as one of Spain's most promising wine regions. It has begun to receive international acclaim for some of its wines, which are conquering markets the world over. Yecla is a Spanish Denominación de Origen (D.O.) for wines located

around the town of Yecla, in the northernmost corner of the region of Murcia. Findings from excavations have confirmed that grape growing and wine production has been practiced in this area for over two thousand years.

Afterward, you may opt to return to the pier on-foot, or remain in the city for additional sightseeing and shopping, and return to the ship at your leisure.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.25 miles (2 kilometres), at times over uneven surfaces. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. See the different rooms of the thermal baths, learn about the exclusive banquets in the Roman Empire, visit the Atrium Building with its high walls and decorations, and immerse yourself in the mystery cults to the Egyptian gods Isis and Serapis inside their sanctuaries.

Cartagena City Tour, Historic Bar, Refreshment Stop, Drink and Tapas, Free Time

Following your visit to this archaeological jewel, your walking tour continues through bustling Cartagena. A refreshment stop is made at one of the oldest bars in the city to taste the famous local drink (vermú), and a traditional tapa. Afterward, some free time is made available for sightseeing, photo opportunities and shopping for souvenirs. At the conclusion of your tour, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

GIB-A / The Rock

Explore Gibraltar Rock and its unique surroundings during this picturesque orientation tour. Throughout the ages, the Rock of Gibraltar has cast a powerful first impression on those that have seen it. Whether approaching by land, sea or air, the Rock looms stark and isolated as it towers above the region. At the neck of the Strait of Gibraltar, it is the final signpost before the Mediterranean joins the Atlantic and thus has been an important site throughout European history.

Europa Point

Depart the pier with your driver/guide for the scenic drive along Winston Churchill Avenue, to the Spanish border and then to the Eastside of the Rock, through the Dudley Ward Tunnel to Europa Point. A stop is made here to take in splendid vistas of the famous Straits of Gibraltar and North African coast, and the point where the Mediterranean Sea meets the Atlantic Ocean. On a clear day the Northern coast of Africa is visible.

St. Michael's Cave and Ape Den

The tour then proceeds to the upper part of 'The Rock' for a visit to St. Michael's Cave. This enormous, Gothic-style cavern features a mass of oddly shaped stalagmites and stalactites, and classical music playing in the background. There has been an investment of 2 million pounds and therefore the cave has undergone a transformation in summer 2021. "The Awakening" light show highlights the history of the famous caves explaining how the geological formation came to be through 360 degree light projection combined with immersive spatial audio.

From here, proceed for a look at the 'Rock Apes', a breed of tail-less monkeys that roam free on the rocky slopes.

Old Town/Main Street

Next, your tour continues past the Moorish Castle and Tower of Homage, then along the winding roads of the Upper Town. Upon reaching Main Street, you may opt to be transferred directly back to the pier or dropped off in town to browse the duty-free shops and return to the ship at your own expense.

Please note: This tour requires a moderate amount of walking, and is suitable for guests with limited mobility, able to embark/disembark the coach via steps. Some walking will be on uneven surfaces and some inclines as well as possibly wet inside of cave. Wheelchairs are unable to be stored in the vehicles. The driver will act as guide. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, sturdy walking shoes and sun protection. Do not attempt to pet or feed the monkeys. The tour sequence may vary. Coaches are the best-available in the area, but may not be up to the standards of those found in other ports of call.

GIB-B / A Stroll Through Gibraltar

Discover Gibraltar and its history and charm on this leisurely and easy walking tour. Evidence of Neanderthal habitation in Gibraltar between 28,000 and 24,000 BC has been discovered at Gorham's Cave, making Gibraltar the last known holdout of

the Neanderthals. Within recorded history, the first inhabitants were the Phoenicians, around 950 BC. Subsequently, Gibraltar became known as one of the Pillars of Hercules, after the Greek legend of the creation of the Strait of Gibraltar by Heracles.

Walking Tour

Transfer by bus from the pier to the Casements to begin your walk. This walking tour of the city centre offers the opportunity of traveling back in time, to discover Gibraltar's history during the Moorish, Spanish and British periods, learning the development of its people and culture. The guide will explain at different stops how Gibraltar evolved to present day.

Please note: This tour involves moderate to extensive walking and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. We recommend wearing comfortable walking shoes. Total walking distance on this tour is approximately one kilometre (.62 miles) and you will walk for approximately 1.5 hours. If encountered, do not attempt to pet or feed the monkeys that inhabit the island. Coaches are the best-available in the area, but may not be up to the standards of those found in other ports of call.

GIB-C / WW II Landmarks

Difficulty

This tour is based on the WW II history of Gibraltar and discovering the importance of its strategically unique situation. In 1940, Britain was at war with Germany and Italy and the future looked bleak for Gibraltar as the enemy surrounded it. Winston Churchill and the British military leaders believed that an attack on Gibraltar was imminent. The answer was to construct a massive network of tunnels, to build a fortress inside a fortress, a city within a city.

100 Ton Gun

Departing from the pier, drive past the Second World War Evacuation Monument and then follow the British Defense Wall, built during the 18th and 19th Century, in white Portland Limestone. King's Bastion will be seen, where General Elliott defended Gibraltar during the last Great Siege. The first stop is the 100 Ton Gun, a 17.72 inch 100 ton Rifled Muzzle Loader, the Supergun of the Victorian era. Only 4 guns of this type were built in Newcastle-upon-Tyne, England. This stop includes an exhibition at Napier of Magdala Battery.

Pillars of Hercules

The tour then leads up the winding roads to the Gibraltar Nature Reserve, and past the Pillars of Hercules landmark. According to Greek mythology Gibraltar is one of the Pillars Hercules.

Barbary Apes

The next stop are the famous Barbary Apes, these Apes have had strong ties with the military and the well-known statement by Sir Winston Churchill that Gibraltar will remain British as long as the Apes are here.

WW II Tunnels

The final stop is Hays Level, the Second World War tunnels where thousands of military personnel lived and worked inside the Rock. Photographs documenting the work of the troops are on display here. Finally, the tour continues past the Tower of Homage, part of the Moorish Castle built in 1333 (2nd Moorish Conquest), the oldest free standing building in Gibraltar.

The tour will end at Casemates Square, where you may shop and relaxation on your own, or if you prefer to return to the port.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking and is suitable for guests with limited mobility; however it is not wheelchair accessible. Total distance walked is approximately 1000m (.62 miles) at times over uneven surfaces and possibly wet in tunnels. We suggest guests wear seasonal clothing and flat, comfortable, walking shoes. GIB-D / Gibraltar Panorama and Tea

Discover the many landmarks that make up Gibraltar on a leisurely drive past historic markers. End your tour at the renowned Sunborn Gibraltar, a Luxury 5 star yacht hotel for an English Tea break. Poised strategically at the jaws of Europe and Africa,

Gibraltar, with its Palladian architecture and camera-hogging Barbary macaques, makes for an interesting break from Cádiz province's white towns and tapas.

Europa Point

Departing from the port, your tour makes its way via Queensway Road, alongside the British fortress walls, Ragged Staff Gates, Rosia Road to Rosia Bay. At this point in 1805 the HMS Victory anchored after the Battle of Trafalgar with the body of Nelson on board. Nelson's body was encased in a barrel of rum to preserve him for the journey back to the United Kingdom. The story says that on the journey to England sailors drilled a hole in the barrel and drank the rum. This is why in the British Navy you toast to Nelson's Blood.

The tour continues via Keightley Way Tunnel to Europa Point. It then continues along the Eastern coastline of Gibraltar through Dudley Ward Tunnel and Sandy Bay.

The Lounge, Tea

Relax and enjoy refreshments and classic British Delights at The Lounge. The Lounge Bar is a family owned business and was formed in 2010 by sisters Sonia and Michelle.

They fell in love with the relaxing and tranquil vibe of Queensway Quay Marina and wanted to create a social gathering place for residents and visitors where they could relax and unwind away from the hustle and bustle.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking and it is suitable for guests with limited mobility, however there is no storage for wheelchairs on buses. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing. The tour sequence may vary. The driver will act as guide. Coaches are the best-available in the area, but may not be up to the standards of those found in other ports of call.

GIB-G / Gibraltar by E-Bike

Gibraltar, Guided Electric-Assisted Bicycle (e-Bike) Tour, Ocean Village

Meet your guide at the pier for the approximately 437-yard (about 400-metre) walk to Ocean Village. Upon arrival, receive your safety and riding instructions, then don your helmet and practice using your easy-to-operate, state-of-the-art, and environmentally-friendly electric-assisted bike (e-bike). Afterward, begin your guided e-bike tour.

Rock of Gibraltar, Europa Point, Dudley Ward Tunnel, Casemates Square, Rosia and Catalan Bays

Take in amazing views of your surrounds as you effortlessly coast the length of the Rock of Gibraltar on the west coast to the southerly tip, Europa Point. From here, ride back along the eastern shoreline, through the Dudley Ward Tunnel, and return to Ocean Village in the centre of town. Sites to be seen along the way include Commonwealth Park, King's Bastion, Nelson's Anchorage, Rosia and Catalan bays, the Shrine of Our Lady of Europe, Gorham's Cave Viewing Platform, Ocean Village, and the Landport Entrance to Casemates Square. At the conclusion of your tour, return your e-bike and helmet, and commence the approximately 437-yard (about 400-metre) walk back to the pier.

From the pier you will board your motorcoach and drive through the bustling town towards the 'Upper Rock Nature Reserve'.

Upper Rock Nature Reserve, Viewpoints

Here you can stand on top of the Rock, and you feel as if you were on top of the world. Europe is at your feet. Africa fills one horizon, while the gates to the Mediterranean and the Atlantic are on either side. The journey to the top of the Rock rewards you with a truly breath-taking view. From a height of 1400 feet (426m) you will see the African coastline, where the waters of the Atlantic meet the Mediterranean, Spain's Costa del Sol and a panoramic view of the city far below, the quays, marinas and bays.

St Michaels Cave

The tour then proceeds to St. Michael's Cave where one can appreciate a mass of strangely shaped stalagmites and stalactites. The strains of classical music drift through this enormous Gothic style cavern.

Moorish Castle

Upon exiting the cave, you will then board your motorcoach and drive towards Moorish Castle. The fortifications on and around the site of the Moorish Castle were first built in 1160, or earlier. These were, however, destroyed when the Spanish re-conquered Gibraltar from 1309-1333. The Tower of Homage, its main feature, dominates the hillside and the landward approach to Gibraltar. A rebuilt tower dates primarily from about 1333 AD.

Gorham's Cave Viewing Platform

You will then board your motorcoach and travel to Gorham's Cave viewing platform. The platform has a series of interpretation panels which tell not just the story of the UNESCO World Heritage Site but of the area as a whole. At this wonderfully scenic lookout one sees the unique views of the entire World Heritage Site which extends to the highest point of the Rock at O'Hara's Battery, 426m, 1400 feet above sea level, including Mediterranean Steps.

Wine Pairing

By this point, one must feel the need for a refreshment and maybe even a nibble or two. The motorcoach will now take you directly to our featured Venue. Here our guests will have the opportunity to try local wines and food that will, for the second time on this tour take you on a journey through the different cultures that have occupied the 'Rock'.

Gibraltar, American War Memorial, Trafalgar Cemetery, North African Coast, Straits of Gibraltar

Depart the pier for the short drive along the outskirts of town, past the American War Memorial and Trafalgar Cemetery, en route to Europa Point. Upon arrival, take in spectacular panoramic views of the coast of North Africa, approximately 12 miles (about 19.3 kilometres) across the famous Straits of Gibraltar. After a photo stop here, re-board your coach and head to Rooke's Battery, a now-derelict artillery battery on the west side of the Rock of Gibraltar. Rooke's Battery has a plaque labelled

'1906' and is named after Sir George Rooke, who commanded the British Fleet when Gibraltar came under British rule. From here, continue on-foot to the nearby Windsor Suspension Bridge.

Windsor Bridge, Gibraltar Bay & City Views, King Charles V Wall, Macaques

One of Gibraltar's newest tourist attractions, the Windsor Bridge is not for the faint-hearted. This spectacular feat of engineering is approximately 233 feet (about 71 metres) in length across an approximately 164-foot-deep (about 50-metre-deep) gorge, affording visitors magnificent views across the bay and city of Gibraltar. After crossing the Windsor Bridge, walk down for a photo stop at the King Charles V Wall, better-known as the 'Ape's Den'. Here, macaques, a breed of tail-less monkeys, roam free on the rocky slopes. These endearing creatures have a penchant for handbags, cameras, and hats. Please note they are wild animals, and not to be fed, touched, nor handled, however friendly they may seem.

Princess Caroline's Battery, City Hall, Mayor's Parlour, Canapes, National Art Gallery, Mayor

Next, re-board your coach and drive to the nearby Princess Caroline's Battery, a former artillery battery located at the northern end of the Gibraltar Nature Reserve. Constructed in 1732, it was named after the third daughter of King George II. Your last stop is at City Hall. Here, visit the Mayor's Parlour, and enjoy some cold canapes and beverages. Some free time is then made available to explore the building, including the National Art Gallery, where you can view and take photos of the works on display. You may even run into His Worship, the Mayor of Gibraltar, and enjoy a chance to chat and even be photographed with him. Leaving City Hall, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

EVL-A / Ancient City of Córdoba

Difficulty

One building alone is enough to put Córdoba high on any traveler's itinerary: the mesmerising multi-arched Mezquita. One of the world's greatest Islamic buildings, it's a symbol of the worldly and sophisticated Islamic culture that flourished here more than a millennium ago when Córdoba was the capital of Islamic Spain, and Western Europe's biggest and most cultured city. Your full-day tour starts with an approximate 1.30-hour scenic drive through the Andalusian countryside to Córdoba, once considered one of the greatest cities in the world. Located on the River Guadalquivir, and surrounded by rolling hills, Cordoba was the Capital of Muslim Spain, and the centre of the Caliph's power.

Córdoba

The ancient Romans founded Córdoba due to its strategic importance as the Moorish Kingdom of Al-Andalus in 711 AD. At this time, work began on the Mosque of Córdoba, or 'La Mezquita'. After several centuries of actions and extensions, the mosque became one of the largest in all of Islam.

When the Christians conquered the city in 1236 the new rulers of the city were owed by the mosque's beauty that they left it standing, building their cathedral within, and creating the extraordinary structure seen today. Covering over 248,000 square feet, la Mezquita is considered one of the most beautiful and original buildings in all of Spain.

Patios

The city of Córdoba not only offers visitors important monuments and museums but also boasts the most extensive and popular network of traditional courtyards. Each of its patios also has its unique attractiveness and architectural design. The Cordoba Courtyards really come into their own in the first fortnight of May each year, with the Festival of the Courtyards ("Patios") of Cordoba (declared World Heritage). However, it is possible to visit the courtyards in Córdoba all the year round, and visiting outside the Festival dates is arguably a better time.

The patios of the old Alcazar also known as the San Basilio neighborhood. Despite being a Christian neighborhood, it also preserves Mudejar and Jewish style houses, but all of them based on the structure and distribution of the typical Roman house, which our ancestors have bequeathed to us.

Let your senses intoxicated by an amalgam of colours, smells, and unique sensations. A tour that will take you through the most popular patios of this neighborhood that was also a Jewish quarter in its time. The duration of the Patios route is 2 hours.

Return to the pier in Seville after an approximate 1-hour and 30-minute drive on your coach.

Spain produces some 45 percent of the world's supply of olive oil, which makes it the largest olive oil producer in the world. Basilippo makes extra virgin olive oil from the *arbequina* olive, one of the four most important varieties in Spain.

Enjoy a panoramic transfer from the port towards the olive oil estate "Basilippo" located in the surroundings of Sevilla, near the historic village of Carmona.

Olive Oil Estate

Upon arrival, specialized staff of the estate will welcome you and introduce you to the interesting world of olive oil, one of the main products of Andalucia, known worldwide for its healthy properties and full flavour. This estate has won several international prizes thanks to its high quality.

You will visit the olive grove, the family museum and the facilities ending with an olive oil tasting where you will learn the characteristics that make this oil unique.

Carmona

Continue to the nearby village of Carmona which is built on a hill that dominates the green Guadalquivir plain. Featuring a fantastic mixture of the cultures concentrated in the village: baroque churches, Arab architecture and the well-known roman necropolis. Well worth seeing are the Greco-Roman Puerta de Sevilla (city gate); the remains of the Moorish-style fortress, as well as the picturesque streets in the centre lined with white-washed houses, walls and balconies of wrought iron.

Return to the pier on your coach after an approximate 45-minute drive.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking of approximately 2.5 km over mostly paved surfaces and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests confined to wheelchairs. We recommend wearing comfortable clothing, walking shoes and sun protection.

According to legend, Sevilla was founded by Hercules and its origins are linked with the Tartessian civilisation. The high point in its history was following the discovery of America in 1492 and for all its important monuments and fascinating history; Sevilla is universally famous for being a joyous town.

Seville

Your day starts with a panoramic bus tour of the city, passing by the beautiful Colón Avenue with its typical Sevillian houses, the Golden Tower, a remnant of Seville's Moorish fortifications, and the beautiful Avenida de Las Palmeras, where most of the impressive buildings left from the Ibero-American Exhibition 1929 are located. You will also see María Luisa Park with its unique impressive 'Plaza España.'

Plaza de La Maestranza

Afterwards you will visit the famous bull-ring "Plaza De La Maestranza" and it's Museum. The Plaza de La Maestranza is, without doubt, one of the most outstanding bullrings in the world. It was built in the 18th century and restored in the mid-20th century. Inside the museum you can see paraphernalia belonging to the greatest bullfighters, such as pictures, paintings, costumes, swords, etc.

Museum of Flamenco Dance

Later, you will visit the 'Museum of Flamenco Dance' where you will find all aspects of this particular art, including dance workshops, temporary painting exhibitions, interactive lessons of flamenco history, guitars, castanets and flamenco costumes. During the tour you will learn everything about the culture that still forms part of the Andalusian lifestyle.

After the visit you will even have the opportunity to participate in flamenco classes, exclusively for you.

Return to the pier area on your coach with a short transfer.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking over mostly paved surfaces and is suitable for guests with limited mobility able to board a coach. EVL-D / Classical Seville

Sevilla lies on the banks of the Guadalquivir and is one of the largest historical centres in Europe. It has the minaret of La Giralda, the cathedral (one of the largest in Christendom), and the Alcazar (Royal Palace).

Depart the pier area with a panoramic ride along the city, passing by the beautiful Colón Avenue with its typical Sevillian style houses, the neoclassical Maestranza Bullring (the largest in Spain), the Golden Tower, a remnant of Seville's Moorish fortifications and the palm tree avenue, where most of the beautiful buildings left from the Ibero-American Exhibition of 1929 are located.

Santa Cruz Quarter

Once in the old part of the city, commences the walking tour through the mysterious Santa Cruz Quarter, a gleaming maze of white houses and flower-filled patios. Seville's noble families resided here in the former century.

Cathedral

Guests will visit the late 15th century Gothic Cathedral built on the site of a Mosque, the third largest in the world (after St. Peter's in Rome and St. Paul's in London). The immense nave with the beautiful carved choir and numerous side-chapels are filled with art treasures, including works by Murillo and Goya.

Alcazar

Continue to the impressive Alcazar, the ancient Palace of the King Almotamid, a combination of Moorish and Spanish architecture, continually added to over the centuries and home to the royal rulers of Andalucía.

Walk back to the coach for the short return to the pier and your ship.

Next, visit the cellars or bodegas as they are called in Puerto de Santa Maria. During this guided tour through the wine cellar Bodegas Osborne. Taste the finest wines, find out about the traditional production of our Iberian pork products and enjoy the visit in Osborne's most emblematic cellars.

LIS-E2 / Snapshots of Lisbon (Tour & Airport Transfer)

Discover the highlights of Portugal's charming capital city during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion through Lisbon.

The Alfama Quarter and Alto do Parque Belvedere

Depart the pier for the scenic drive to the Alfama Quarter, the oldest part of Lisbon. En route, your guide points out notable landmarks from your coach. Upon arrival, experience the ambience and intrigue of this ancient quarter's Kasbah-like layout, which features alleyways and narrow, cobbled streets lined by closely-packed rows of Moorish-styled houses. From here, continue to the city centre, where a brief photo stop is made at the Alto do Parque Belvedere for magnificent views overlooking the city.

25 April Bridge and Christ the King Statue

Next, re-board your coach and drive across the beautiful 25 de Abril Bridge. The twin of San Francisco's Golden Gate Bridge, it was built by the same company. Once across the span, another photo stop is made at the base of the Monumento Cristo Rei. This 361-foot (108-metre) statue portrays the Sacred Heart, and was inspired by the statue of Christ the Redeemer overlooking Rio de Janeiro.

Jeronimos Monastery and Belém Tower

After crossing back over the bridge again, a brief exterior photo stop is made at the splendid Jeronimos Monastery, a 16th-Century architectural masterpiece designed in the Gothic Manueline style. Leaving the monastery, continue on to the Belém Tower, a prominent city landmark that dominates the bank of the Tagus River. From the motor coach, admire the lavishly decorated tower from which Portuguese explorers were once given a rousing send-off.

Monument to the Discoveries

Your last stop is at the nearby Monument to the Discoveries. This monumental sculpture was erected to commemorate the 500th Anniversary of the death of Prince Henry, the mastermind navigator behind Portugal's voyages of exploration and subsequent fantastic wealth.

Leaving the Belém area, your tour coach will return to the port to disembark any participants who may be in transit to the next cruise before continuing on to the Silversea Hotel and finally to the Lisbon-Humberto delgado Airport.

Please note: This tour is available for guests with flights after 3.30 PM or those participating in a Silversea post-cruise hotel program. Tour requires a minimal amount of walking and is suitable for guests with limited mobility and who utilize a wheelchair. There are a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. The sites on this tour are mostly viewed by coach; walking at the sites is at the discretion of each guest. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and sun protection are recommended. Guests with international flights departing after 7.30 p.m. can experience the stunning beauty, history and architecture of Lisbon during this panoramic, full-day sightseeing excursion.

Lisbon, Sintra, Serra de Sintra Mountain, National Palace, Pena Palace

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive to Sintra, one of the most romantic locales in the world and an UNESCO World Heritage Site. Sintra is nestled in a stunning setting amidst wooden ravines and freshwater springs on the north slopes of the granite Serra de Sintra Mountains. For six centuries, it was the favourite summer residence of the kings of Portugal, who were attracted by the cool climate and lush beauty of the town's setting. The tall conical chimneys of the National Palace and fabulous Pena Palace, eerily impressive on its peak, are two unmistakable landmarks of this area.

Free Time and Lunch in Sintra, Scenic Drive, Estoril Coast, Cascais Village, Photo Stop

Upon arrival, some free time is made available to explore Sintra and browse the local shops at your leisure. Following your free time, proceed for lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, re-board your coach and drive along the road bordering the Tagus River en route to the Estoril Coast, also known as the 'Portuguese Riviera', and a photo stop at the colourful village of Cascais.

Lisbon, Belem Quarter, Belem Tower, Monument to the Discoveries

Next, re-board your coach and head to Lisbon for a visit to the Belem Quarter, one of the most important places to visit in Lisbon. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour and visit the Belem Tower. This fortress by the Tagus was the starting point of the Portuguese navigators who, in the 16th century, set out to discover the trade routes. In addition, visit the Monument to the Discoveries, built in 1960 to mark the 500th anniversary of the death of Henry the Navigator. The monument commemorates the mariners and royal patrons of those who participated in the rapid development of the Portuguese Age.

Jerónimos Monastery, Lisbon City Centre, Rossio Square, Free Time, Shopping

Continue on to the Jerónimos Monastery. Founded by King Manuel and designed by the architect Boytac, this monastery is considered to be a jewel of Manueline art. Upon arrival, a visit is made to the church of this monastery. Leaving the Belem area, take a sightseeing drive through the city centre of Lisbon. Along the way, pass through the main streets of Lisbon, including Rossio, Avenida da Liberdade and Marques de Pombal Square. Following your sightseeing drive, some free time is made available for independent shopping and exploration at Rossio Square.

At the conclusion of this tour, in-transit guests are transferred back to the pier to disembark any participants who may be in transit to the next cruise before continuing on to the Silversea Hotel and finally to the Lisbon-Humberto delgado Airport.

Please note: This tour is available for guests with flights after 7.30 pm. This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 1.24 miles (about two kilometres), at times over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and 10-20 steps at the restaurant. Proper attire is required to enter the Monastery; shorts, miniskirts and bare shoulders are not permitted. Guests must be at least two years old to participate on this tour. On Sundays, some stores in Sintra and at Rossio Square may be closed. The tour sequence may vary. On Monday, Jeronimos Monastery is closed and only an external visit will be done. National monuments may close without prior notice.
